Welcome to General Music! This class is a nine (9) weeks course that will cover the music of the decades from the 1950s until present day music. The class will consist of daily activities, weekly presentations, and a comprehensive final exam at the end of the term. I am really looking forward to teaching this class!
1.) Schoology

I will use Schoology as a resource mainly for day-to-day activities and for students to keep up with work they missed. On occasion, the students will have to complete assignments in Schoology. For the most part, I will post the assignments we do each day and the students will receive a hard copy of the assignments in class. It is the student's responsibility to make up any missed work

## 2.) Remind

Any quick announcements that I will need to communicate with the class I will send through Remind. I will give the students the codes in class.
3.) School Status

If there are any issues or if I need to send notifications out, in addition to Remind, I will use School Status to reach out to parents should the need arise.

## There is no reason for lack of communication!

## How the Class Works

This class, as mentioned above, is about popular music from the 1950s until the present day. Once we begin the course, each week will be a different decade of music. For instance, we will spend five (5) days on the 1950s decade of music, and once we have completed the 1950s we will move on to the 1960s and so on.

Students will do a brief presentation each week of the course. Each presentation will represent an artist from the decades we have covered. There will be specific instructions for these presentations as well as a rubric to grade them with.

We will do this for each decade until we reach the 2010s decade of music DO NOT PLAGIARIZE! If you are caught plagiarizing any assignment, presentation, or essay you will receive a zero (0) for the assignment for the first offense. Any subsequent offenses will result in disciplinary action and parents will be notified. You have been warned!

## Grade Percentages:

Below are the types of grades students will receive in this class and the percentages:

## Daily Grades - 30\% of Final Grade

Listening Exercises - These are where you try and name the song title, the artist who sang the song, and the genre that the song belongs to
Lyric Comparison Exercise - These assignments are based on song lyrics from each decade. You will answer questions based on these lyrics.
TED Talks - This assignment is where we watch a music-based TED Talk and answer a short questionnaire about the video. Every answer is in the video!
Songs and Stories - These are where we will listen to instrumental music and then you will write a mini story based on the music that you hear.
Song Analysis - We will cover some songs that have meaning to them, and I want to see your interpretation of the songs
Political Cartoons - You will draw a political cartoon based on the music that you hear and the lyrics as well.
Compare and Contrast - We will be listening to various songs that have different versions/covers. You will compare and contrast the two songs.
Setting the Stage - These will be for each decade when we start them. You will do research on the decade itself (big events, pop culture, social trends, etc.)

## Presentations/Research - 50\% of Final Grade

Presentations - These will be the weekly presentations you will give on your chosen band/artist.
Research - This is the work to be done in preparation for the presentations. The grade for the research will be based on the presentation rubric (out of 40)

## IF YOU ARE ABSENT ON PRESENTATION DAY, You must make up your presentation after you return. They are a major part of your grade! <br> If you are working in a group, the group will continue with the presentation. I will give you credit for the research portion of the presentation. To receive credit for the presentation portion, you will need to write an essay which will have its own rubric

## Final Exam - 20\% of Final Grade

The final exam will be based on the note-takers and/or articles that we cover during our lecture time. There will be a study guide for this.

Exemption from Final: Per DeSoto County Schools, to be exempt from a nine weeks class, the student must have no more that two (2) unexcused absences in a nine weeks and must have a nine weeks average of an eighty-five (85) or higher in the class
