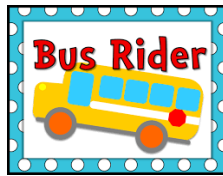

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TTK and Kindergarten

Kindergarteners started to learn our letter sounds! For each letter, students will learn how to write the letter, the ASL hand gesture for each letter, and the letter chant to help us remember the sound. This week, students are learning the letters 'm', 'a', and 'd'.

Kindergarten also started learning to count and write numbers 6-9. They also find number pairs that make up each number.

TK is working on finding objects that go together. Their lessons have gradually increased in criteria. First, they started with finding things exactly alike, then similar, and now they are working on finding pairs that go together- like a crayon and paper. TK is also learning about numbers 1-5.

During circle time all students learn about the months of the year, the days of the week, and counting the days on the calendar. This month we started to learn about patterns.

Thank you Booster Club for a fantastic week of swimming! Students learned so many skills and had a great time!



Students have made great progress memorizing The Preamble. We have also been studying the seven continents and five oceans. They will then identify our country and state on a map.

Second grade students have made wonderful headway on their mathematical thinking and problem solving. They are reading story problems carefully and following clear procedures for attacking the solution. They are using labeled models and numerical number sentences to explain thinking.

First graders are comparing and making sense of numbers. They should be able to put a number set in order from least to greatest and greatest to least. They should also be able to use symbols to compare numbers.

All students are reading critically and writing answers in text supported, complete sentences. They should be able to identify a main idea and supporting details. They are developing their ideas when writing.
