We have gotten our School Wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (SWPBIS) program up and running. School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is a framework designed to enhance students' understanding of behavior expectations at school. Staff members and students are taught strategies aligned to the expected behaviors to ensure consistency across different contexts (in classrooms, the cafeteria, and restrooms, for example). The goals of consistent SWPBIS implementation include a decrease in problem behaviors, a decrease in office disciplinary referrals and suspensions, increased student engagement and attendance, and increased student perception of school safety.


