

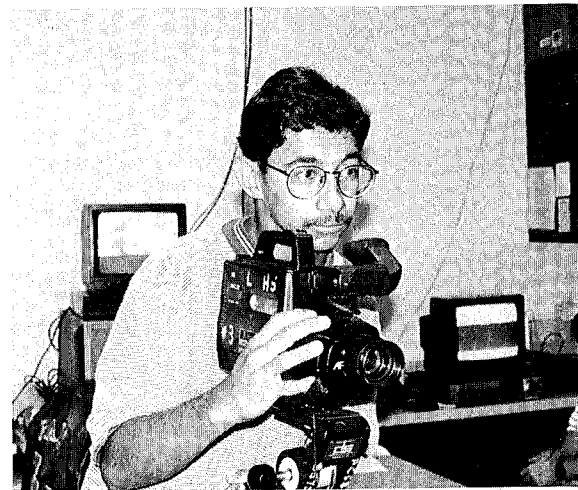
Hearing about the Headlines

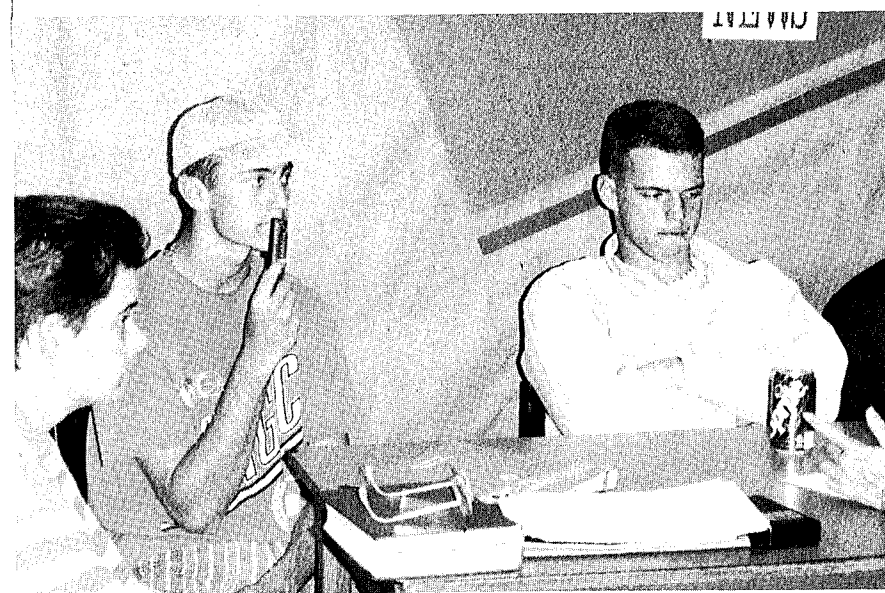

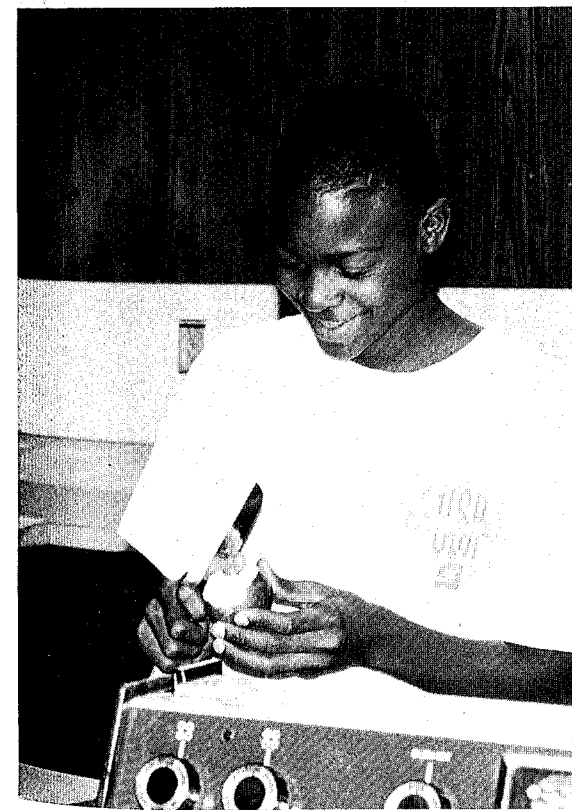

Measuring Life's Guidelines

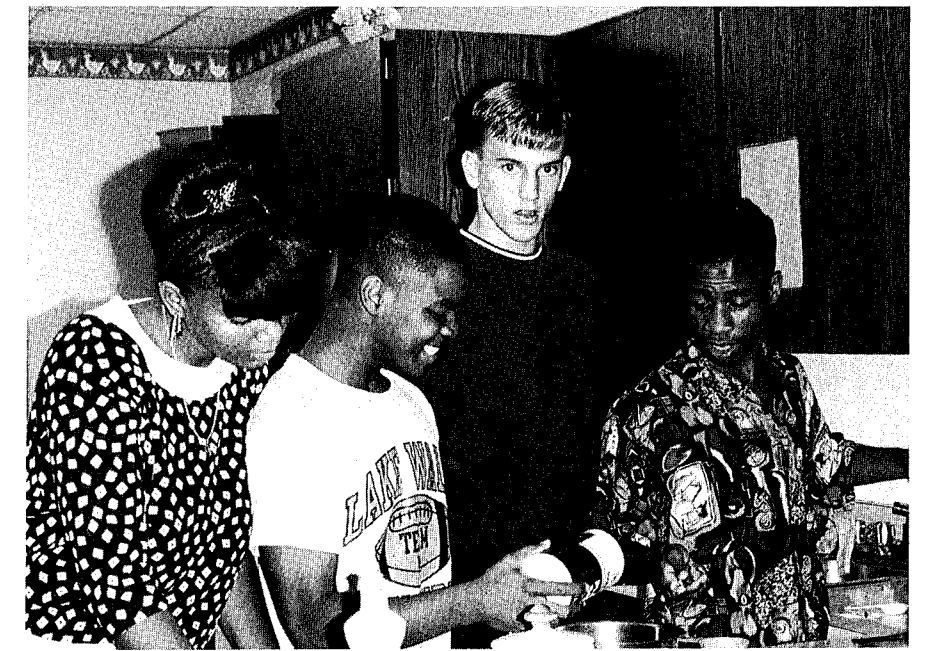

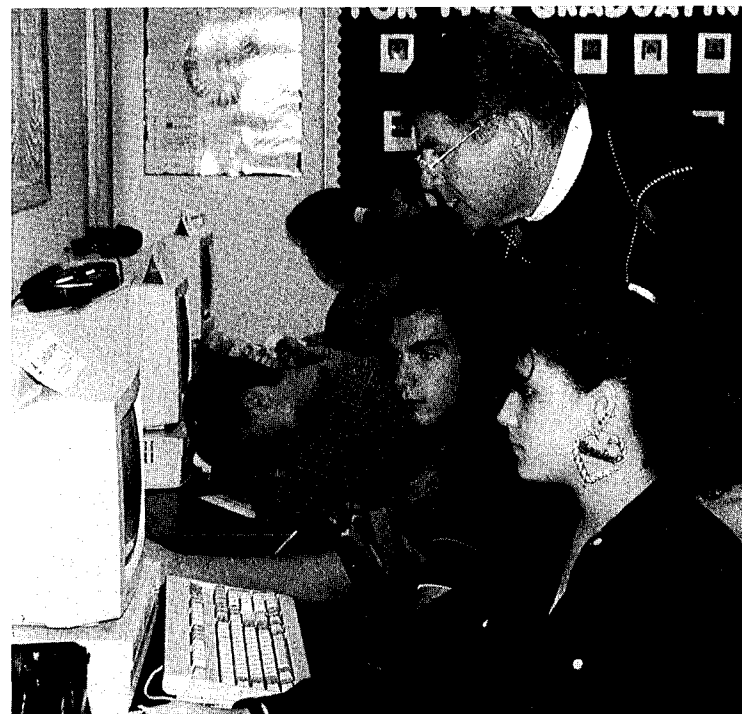

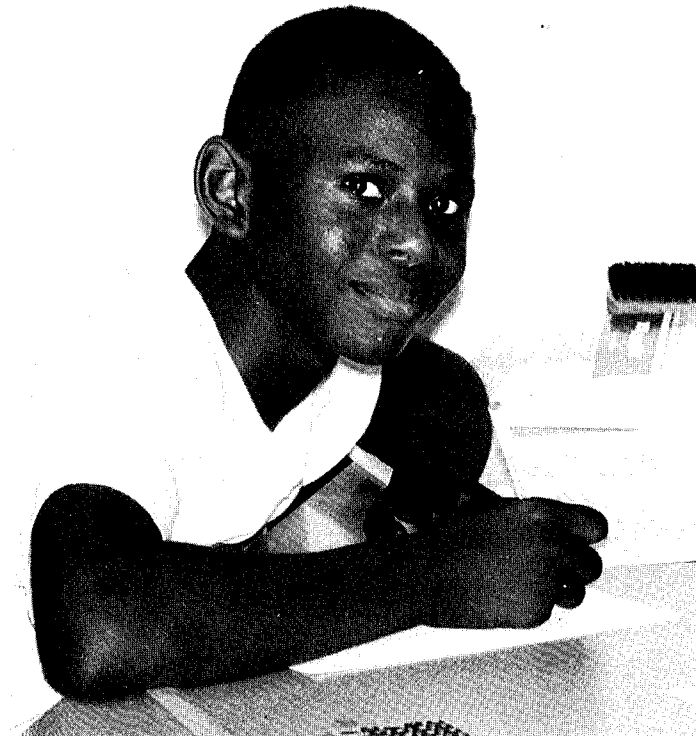

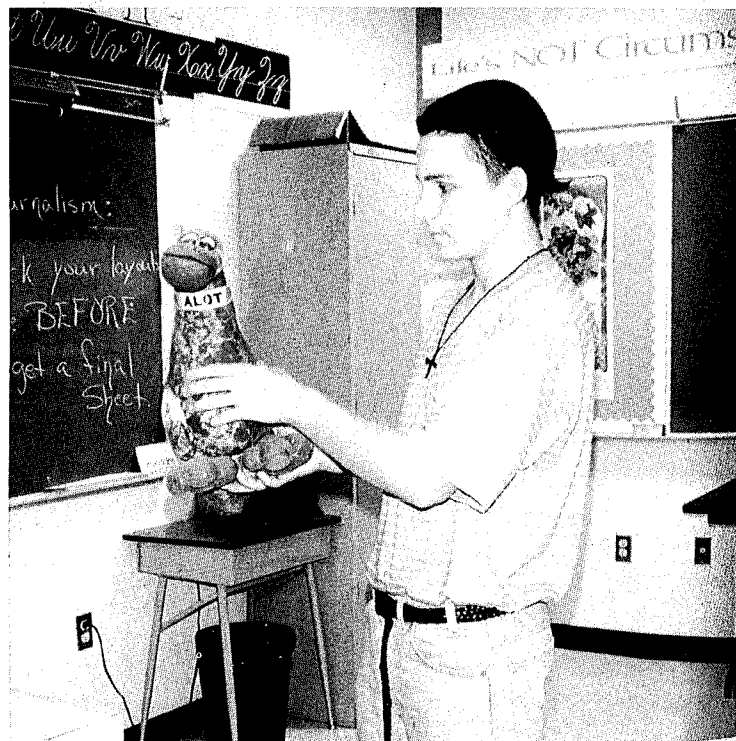

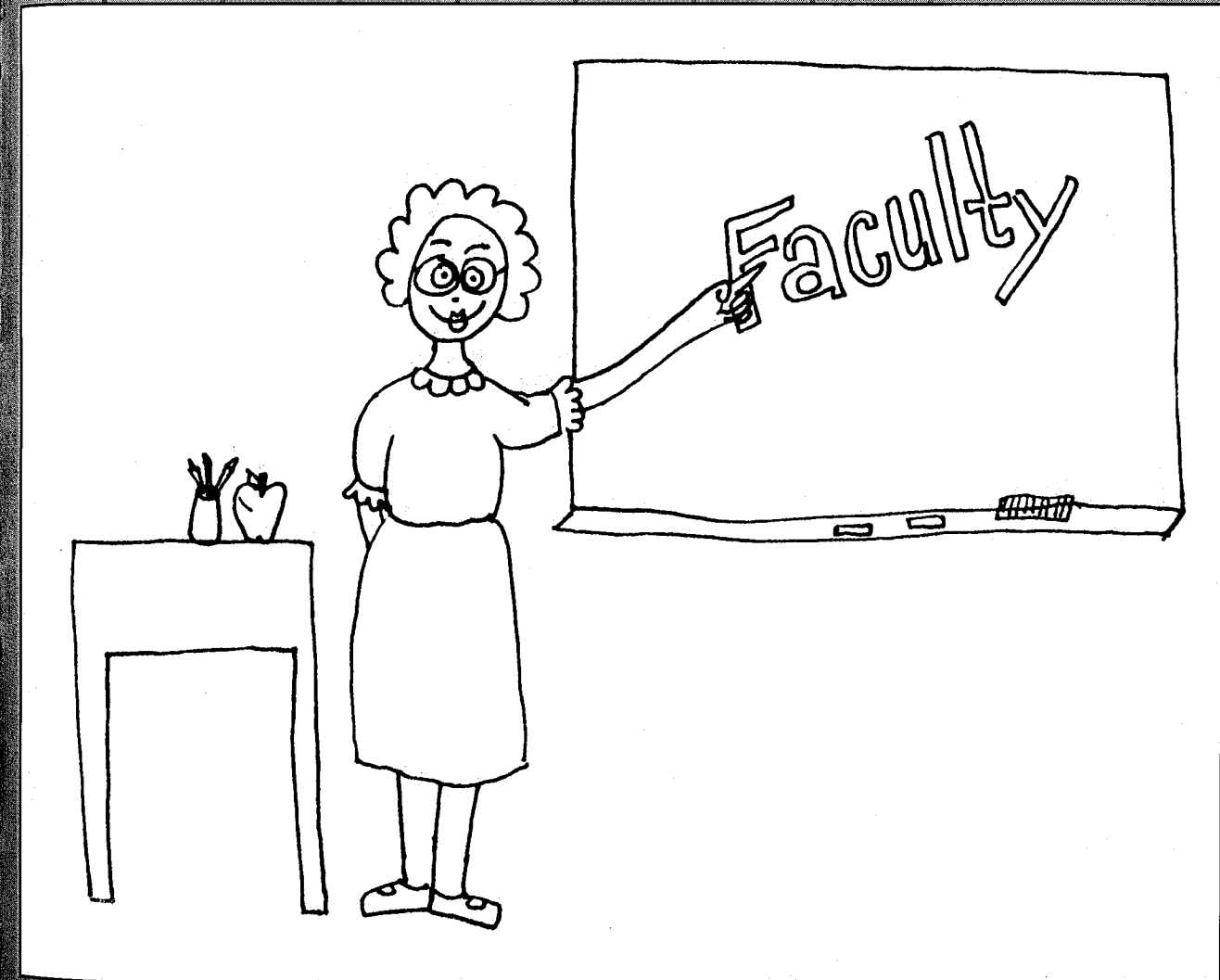

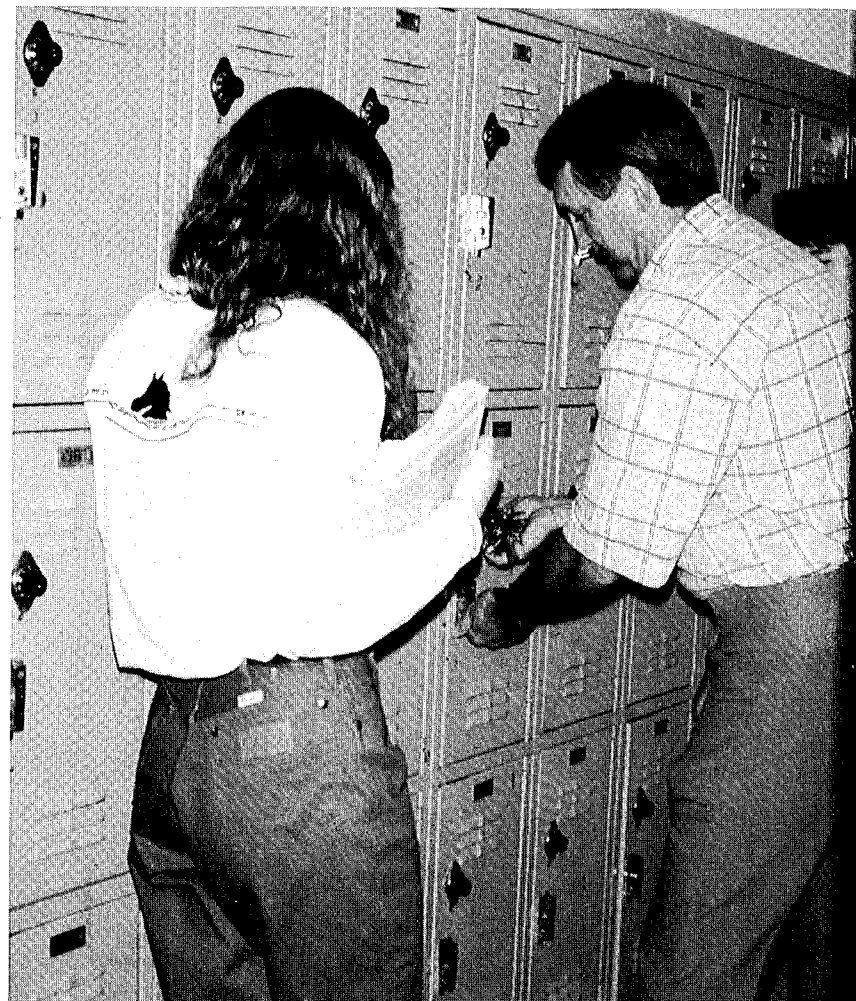
take care of our transcripts. Mostly they are there for us when we have problems. We appreciate them.

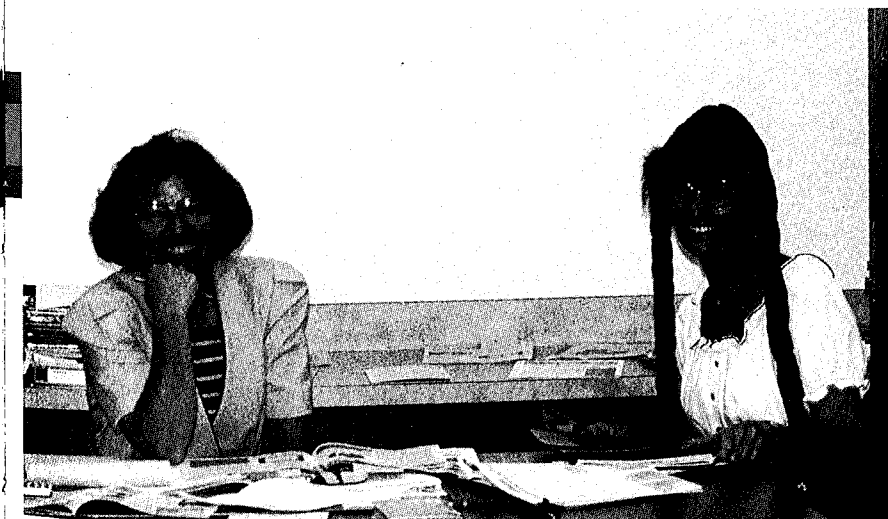

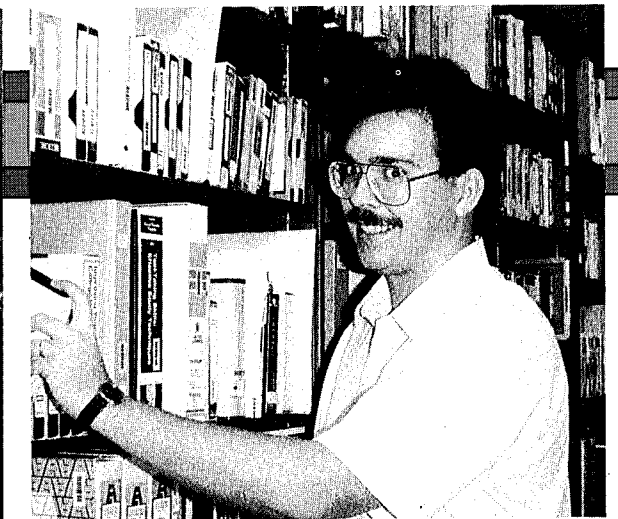

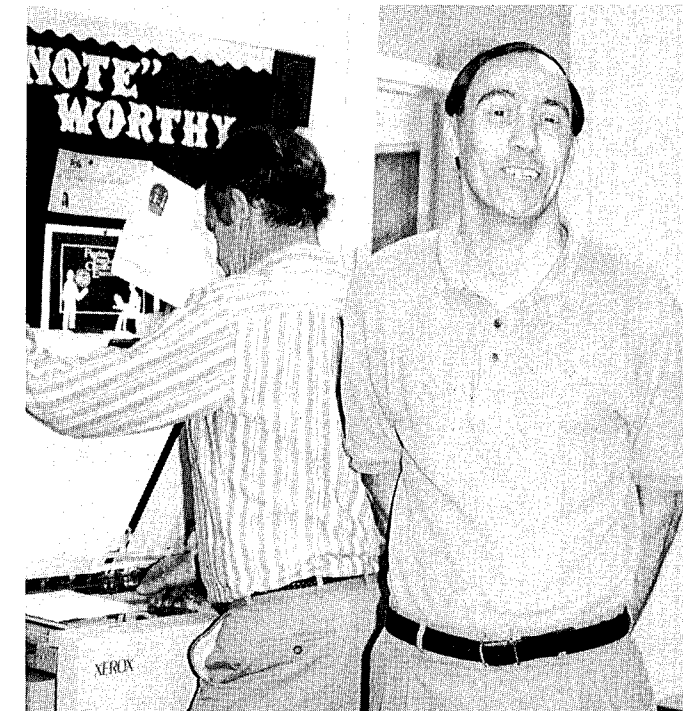

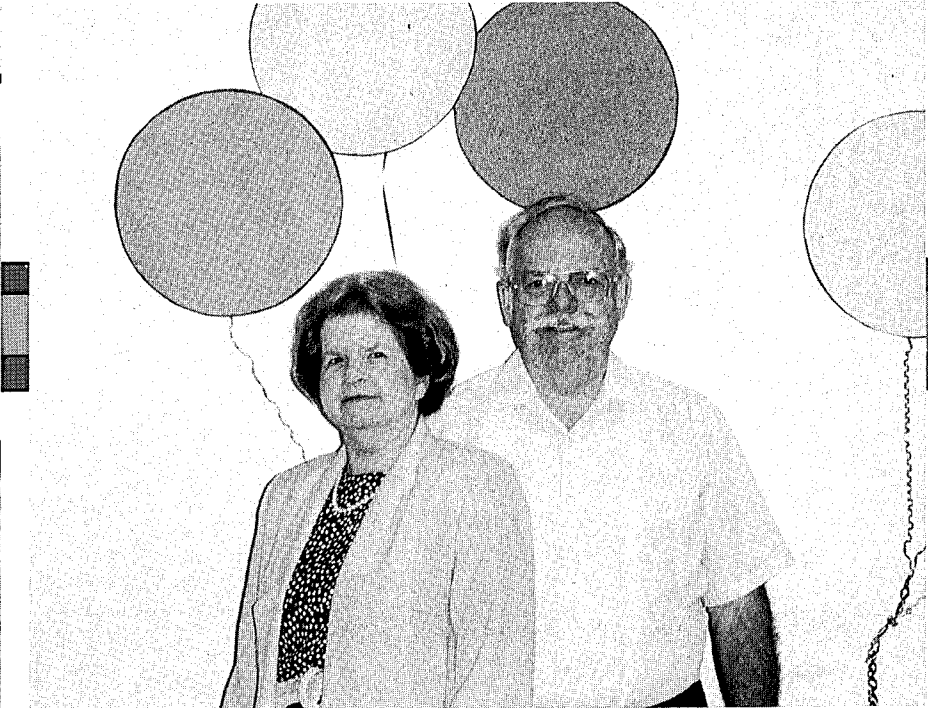
yes, keep on teaching in their own special ways. For us school will go on with new teachers and new friends, but the memories of our favorite teachers will be cherished.

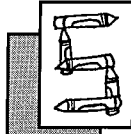

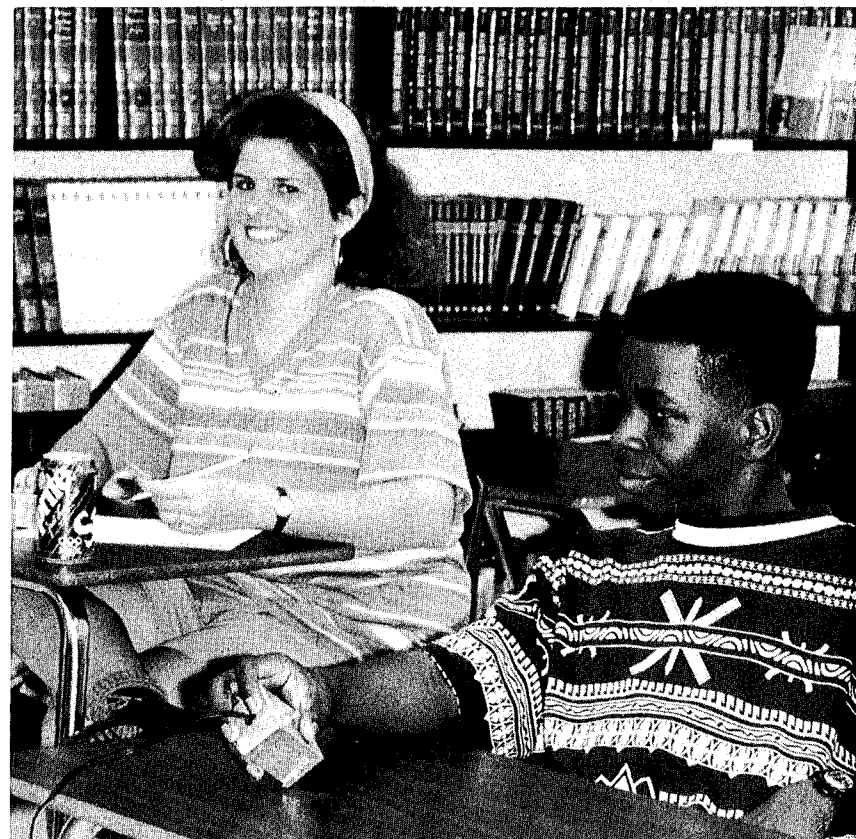

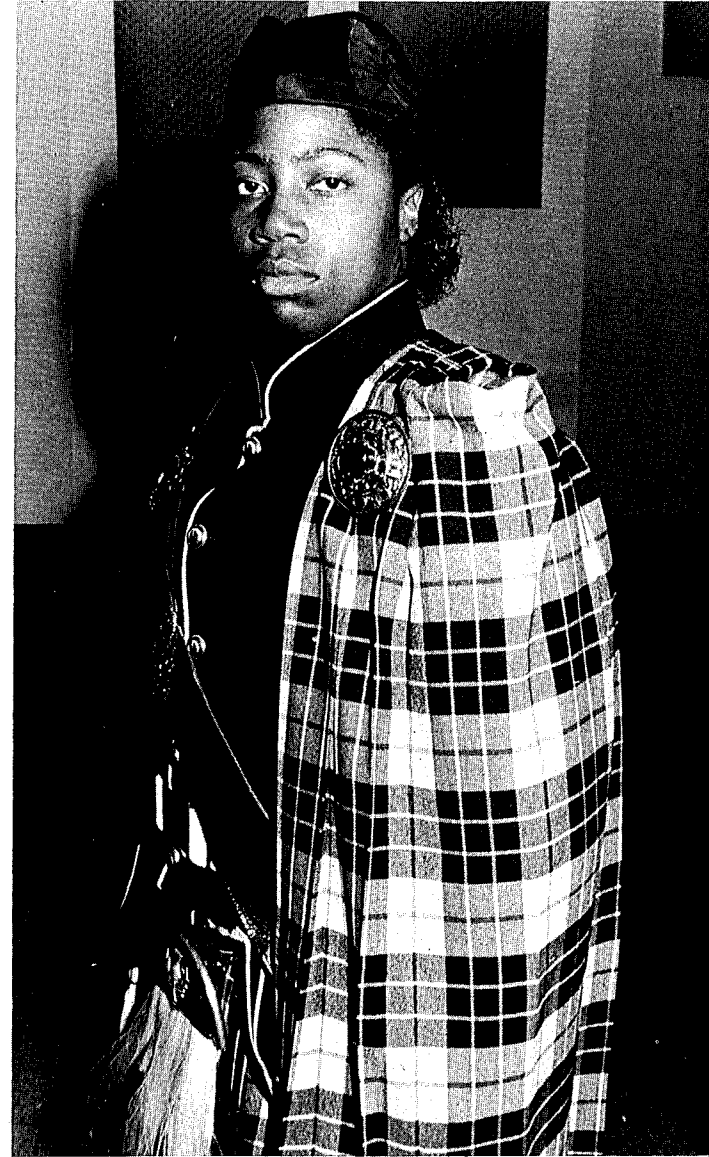

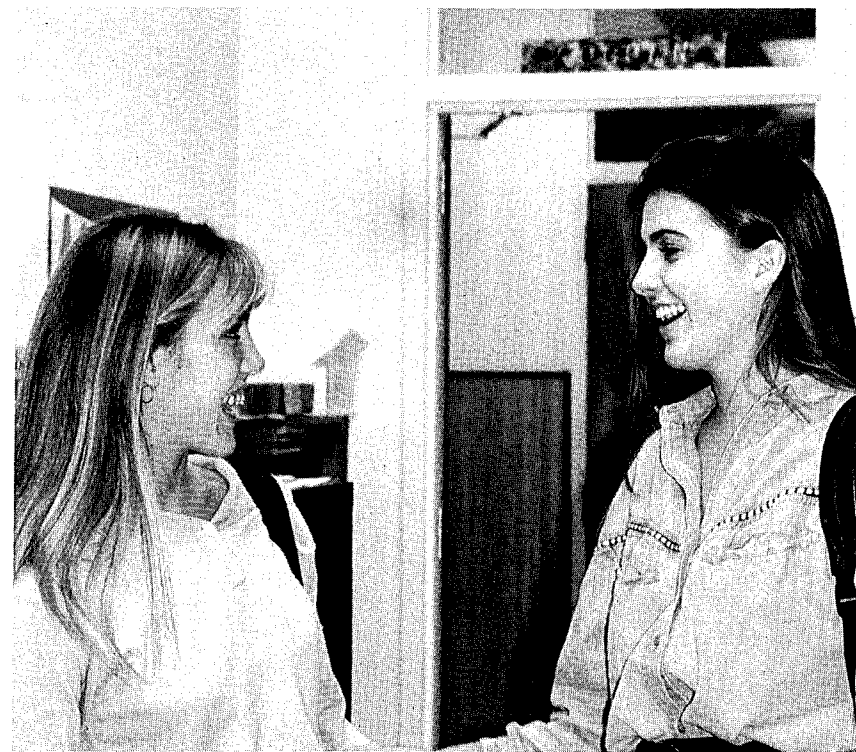

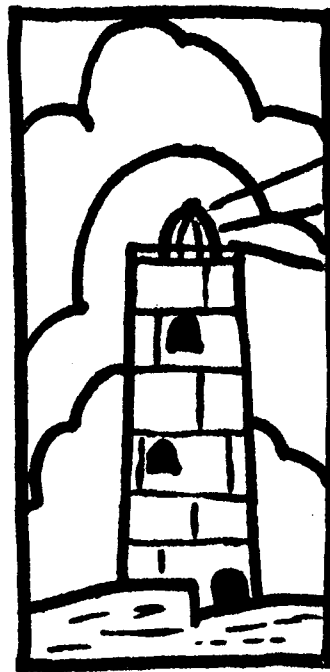

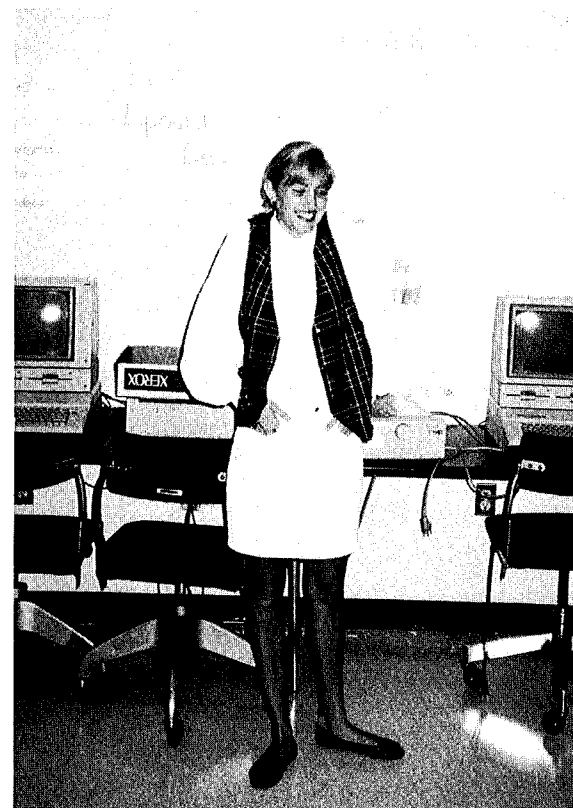

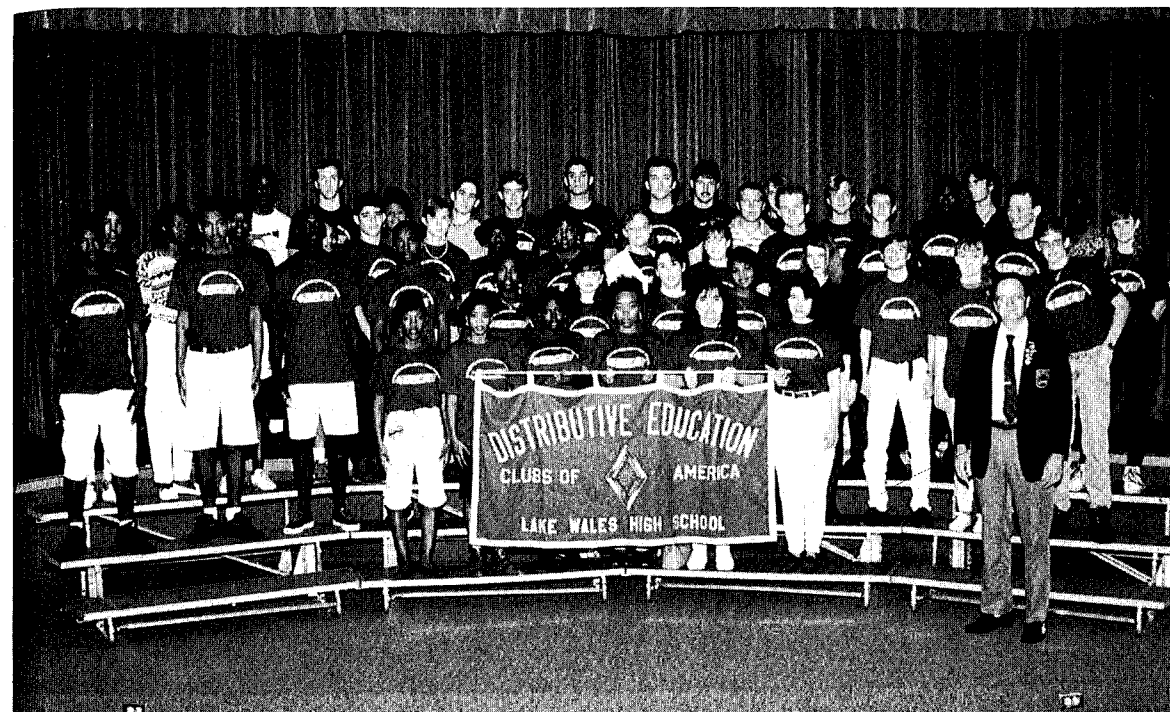

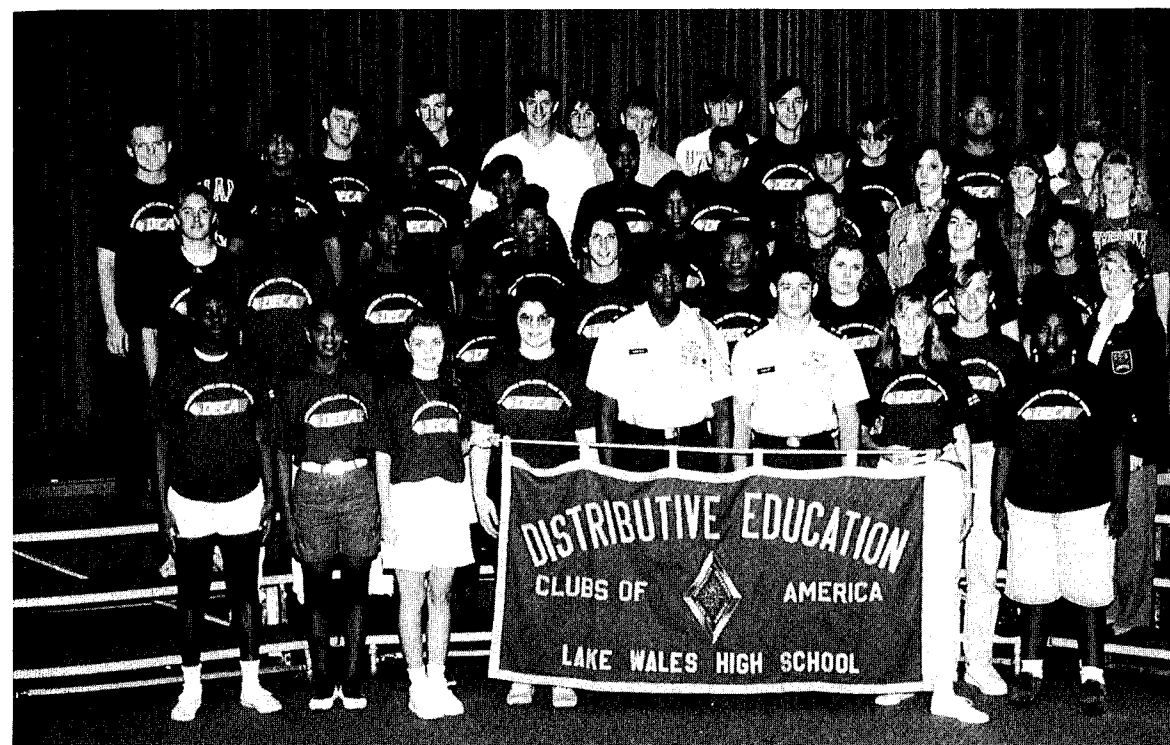

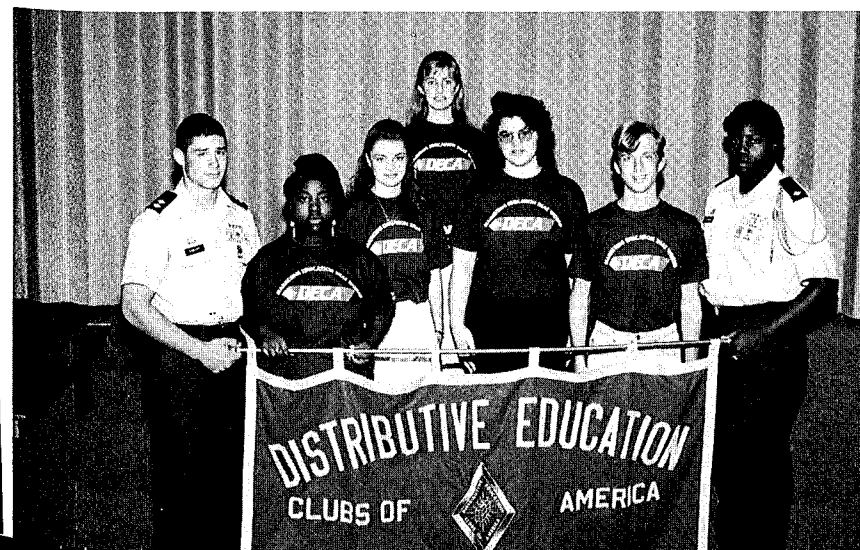

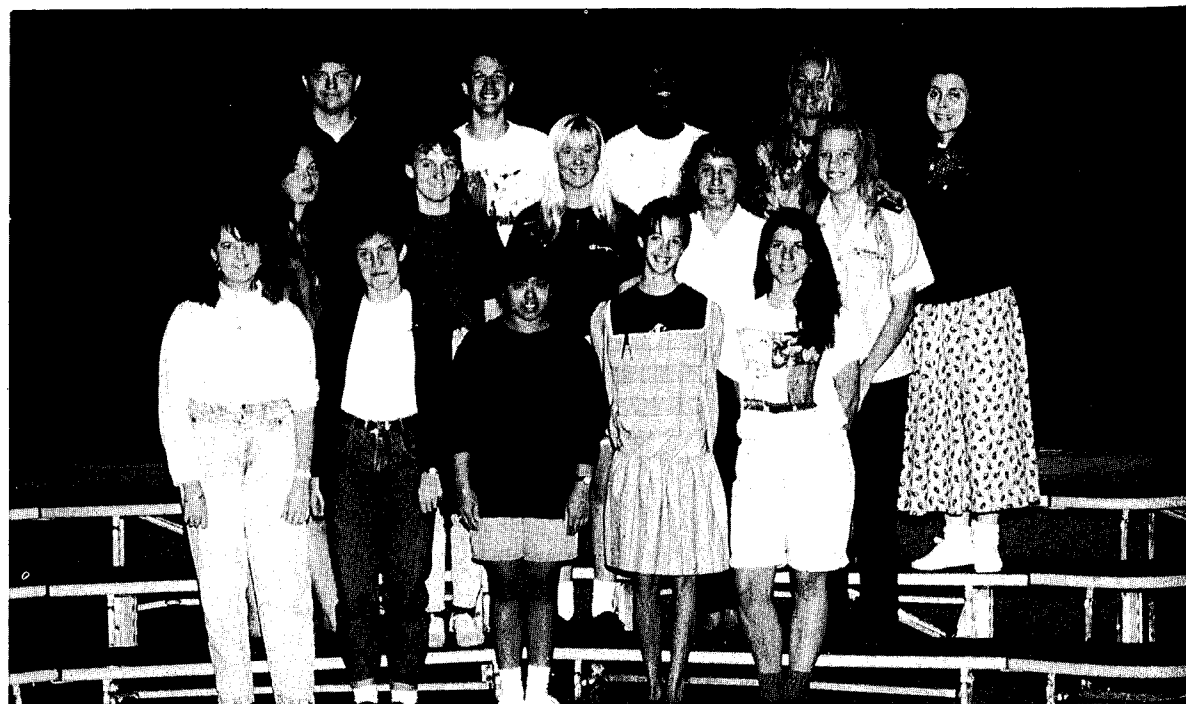

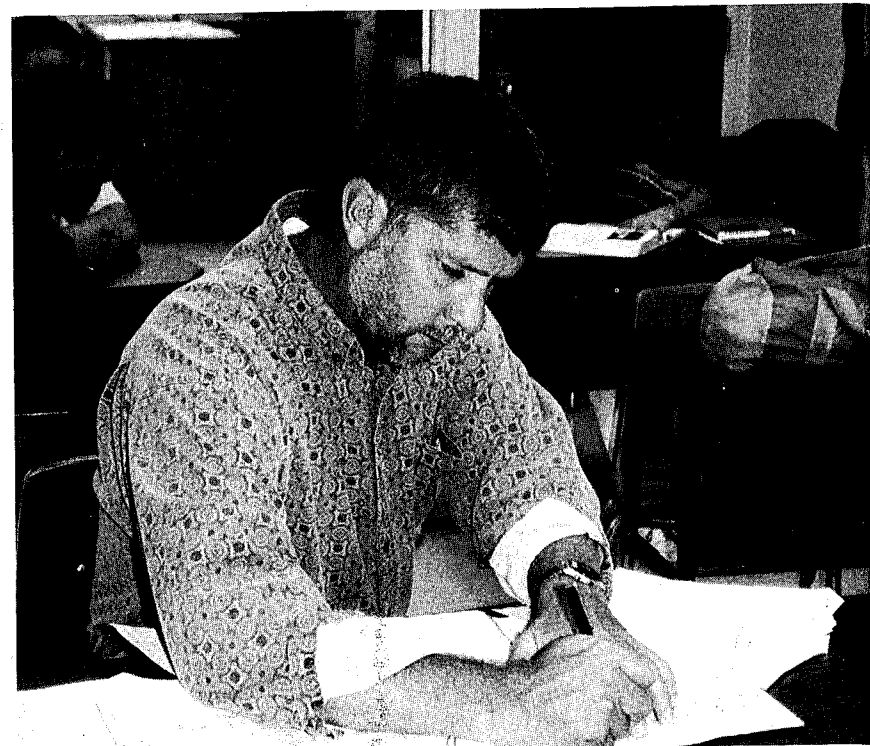
Don't Fence Me In!

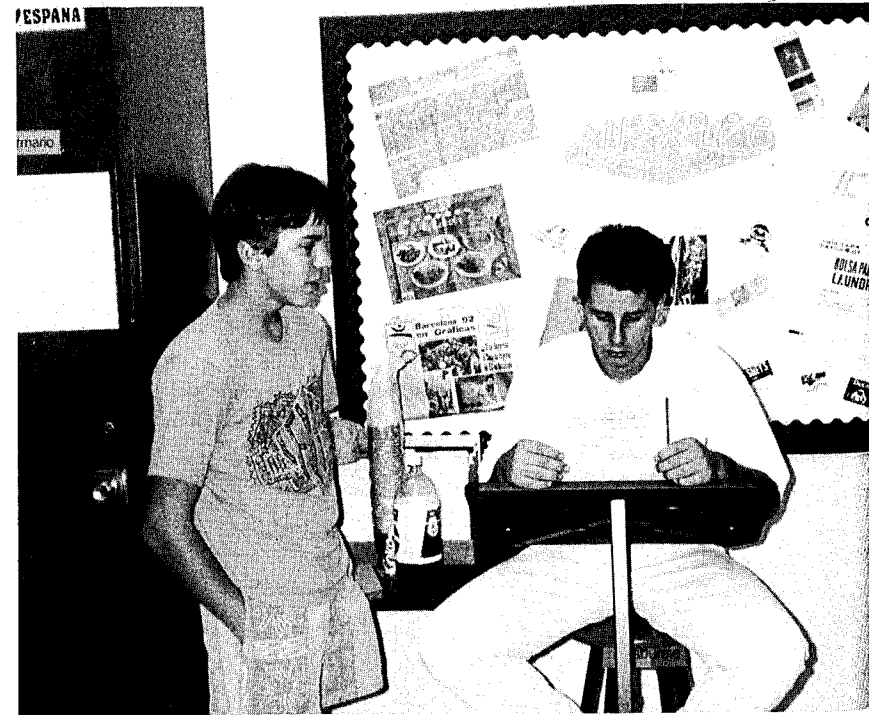

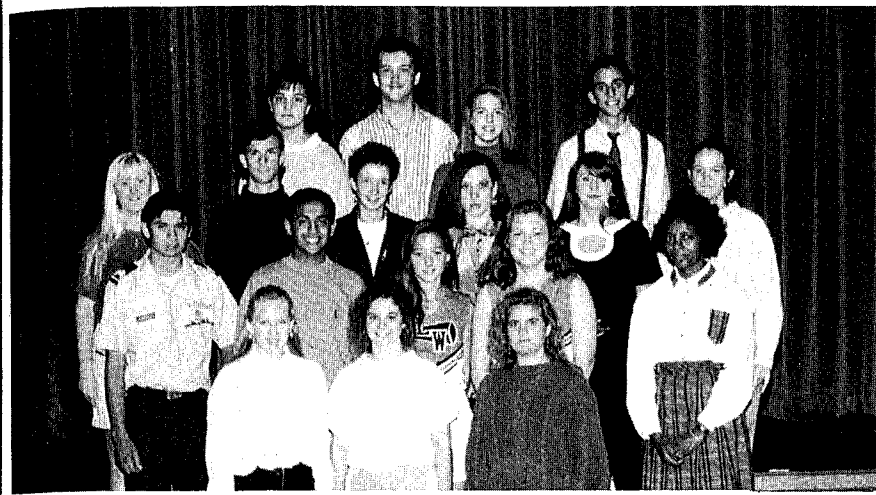

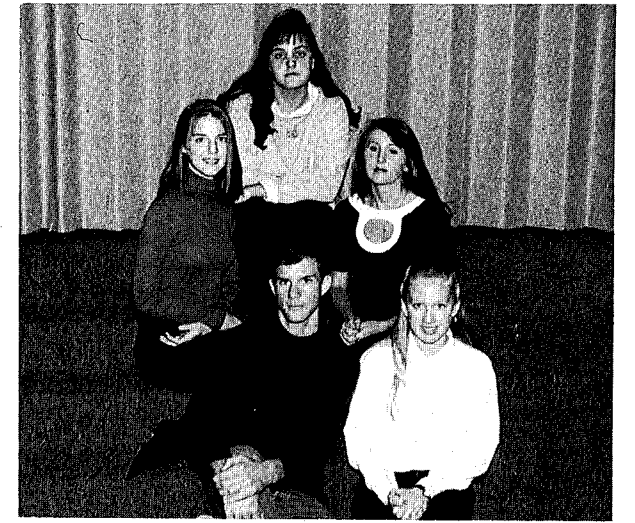

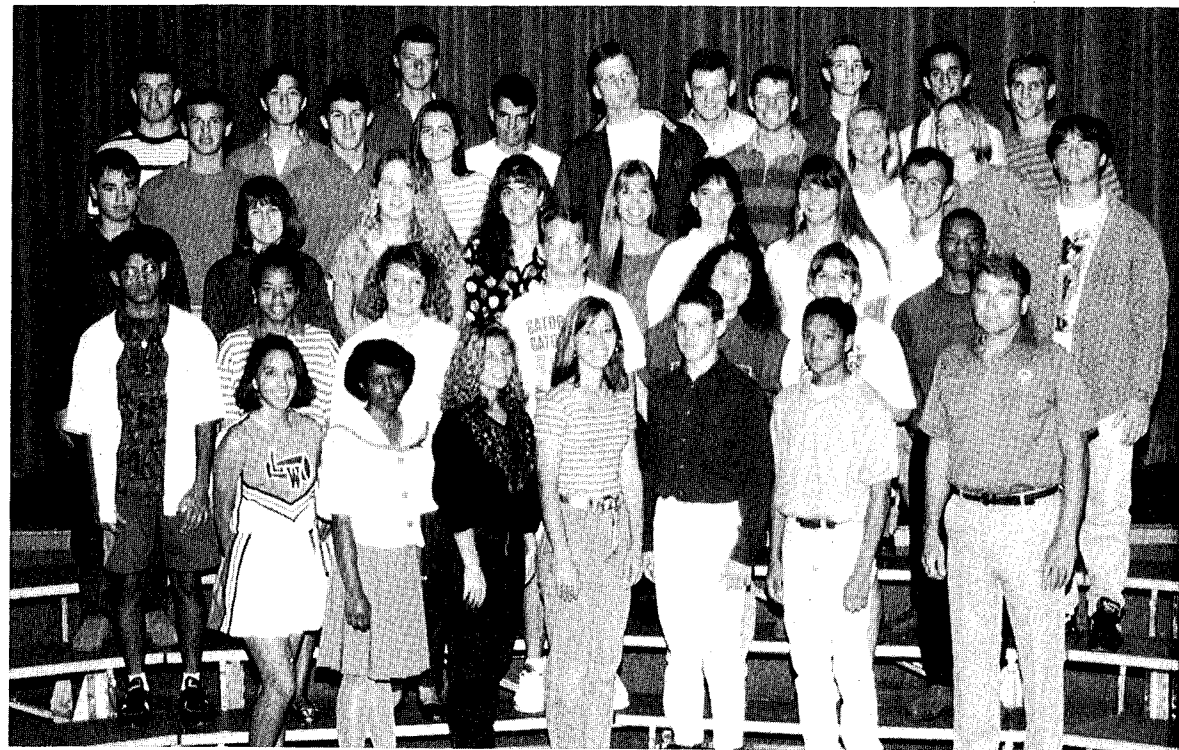


Always Lending a Helping Hand
