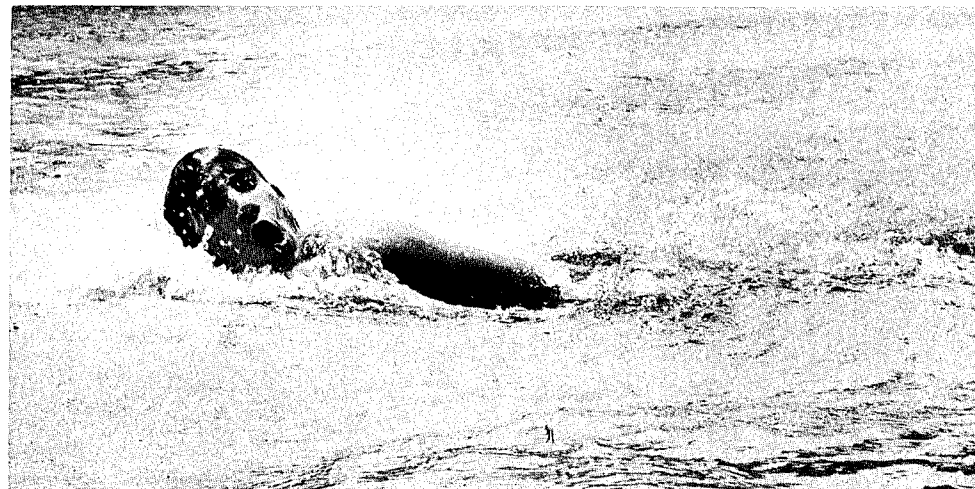


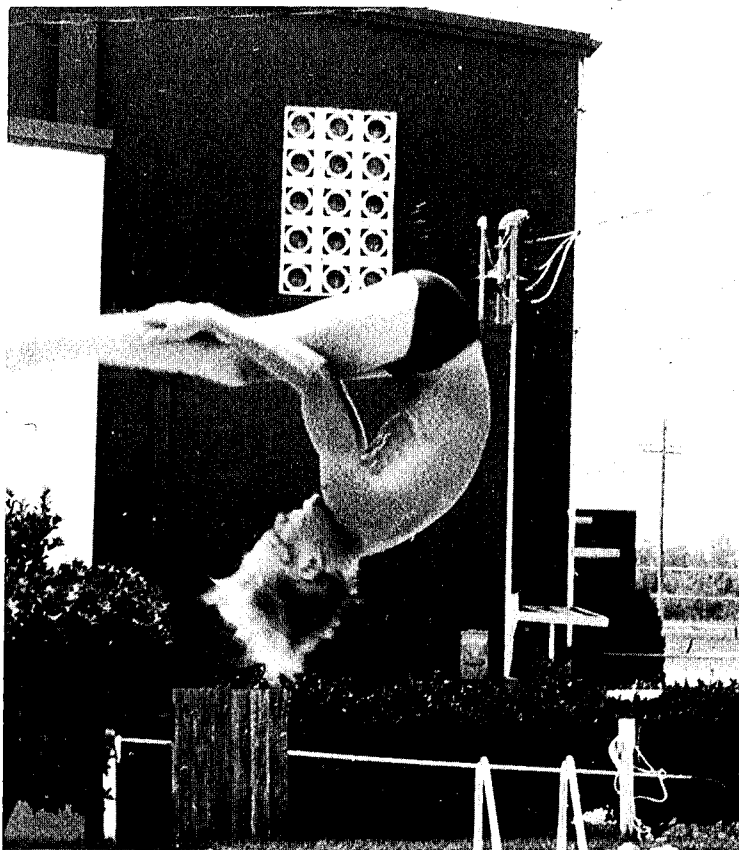

1. B. VanGilder swims freestyle. 2. S. Clack dives. 3. T. Williams dives into a race.

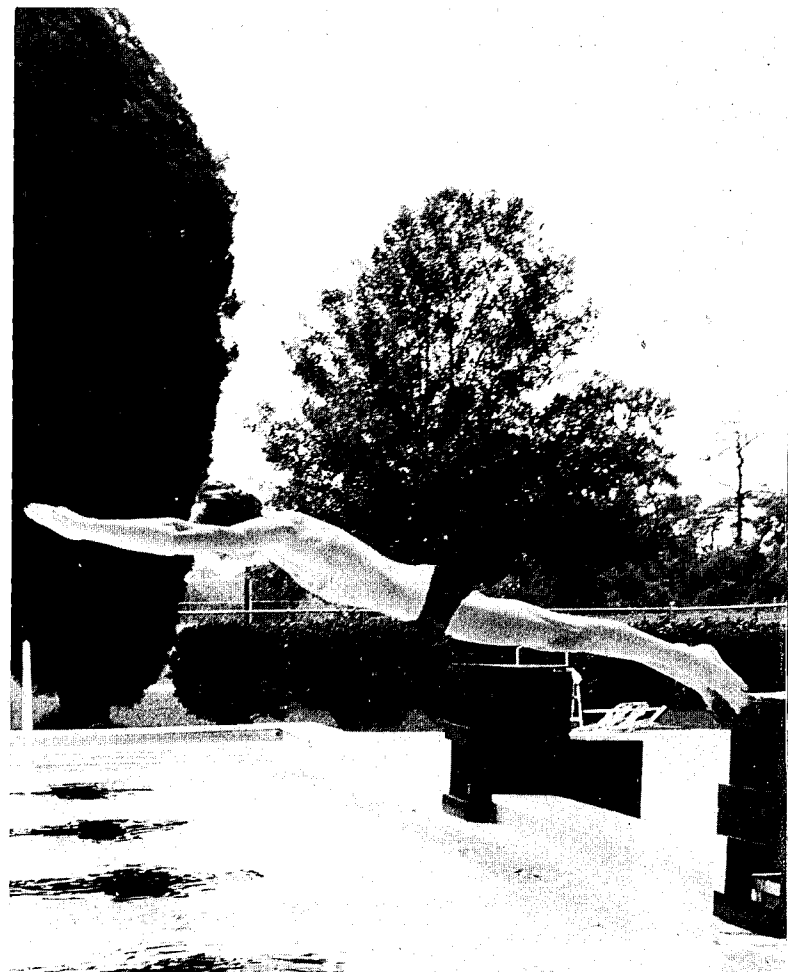

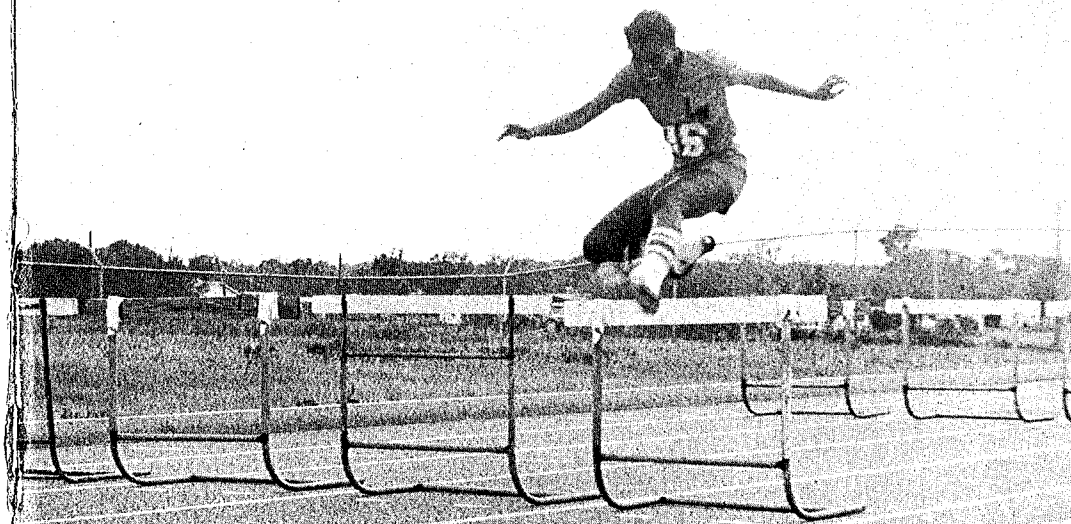
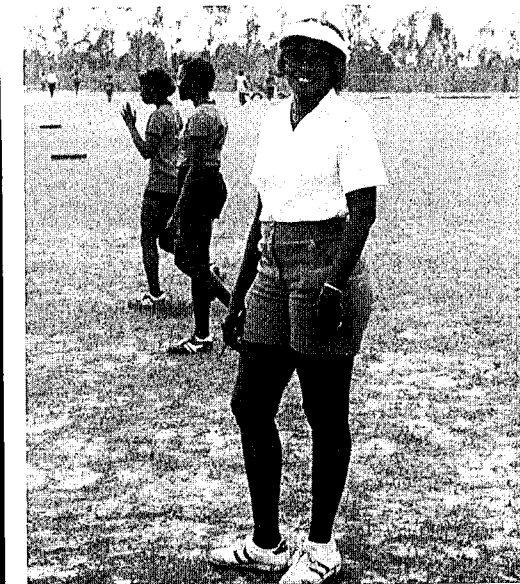
Girls Strive To Improve

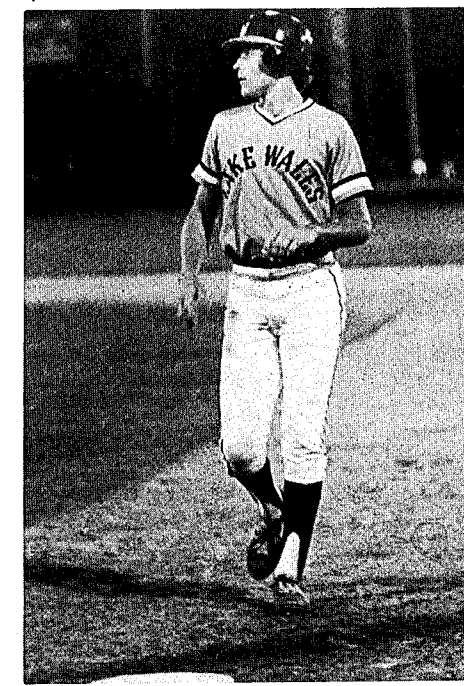
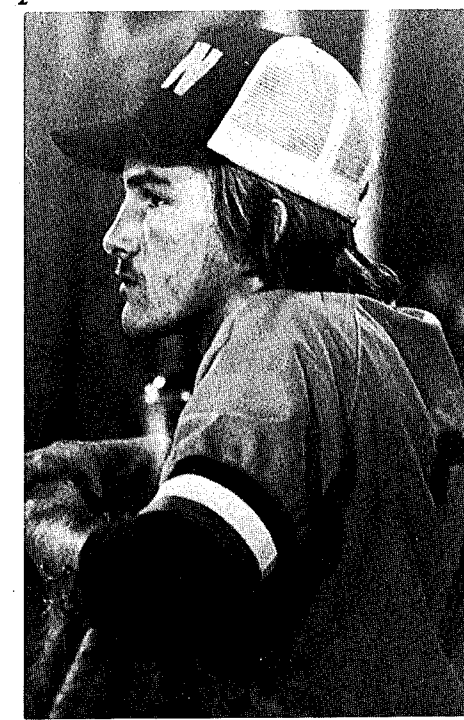
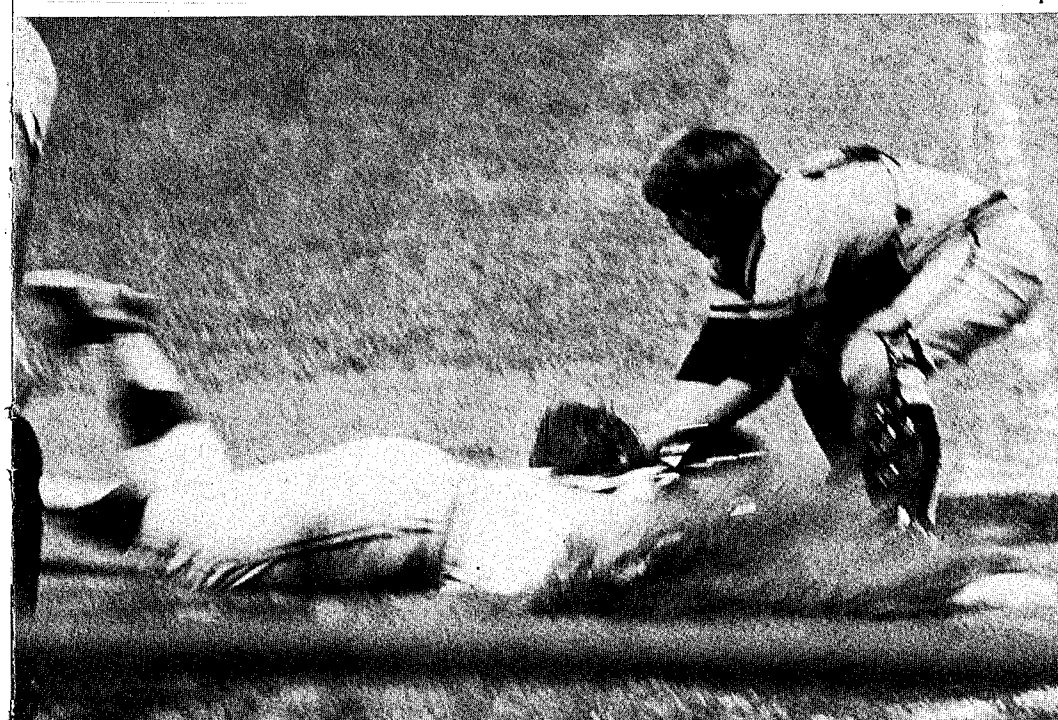
Highlanders Do It Again

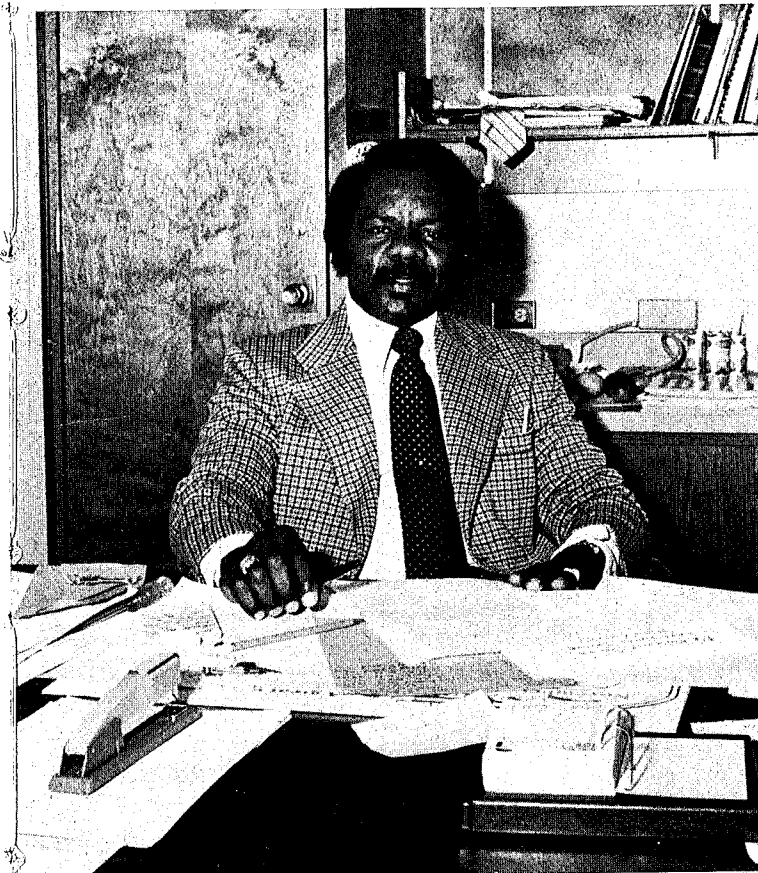

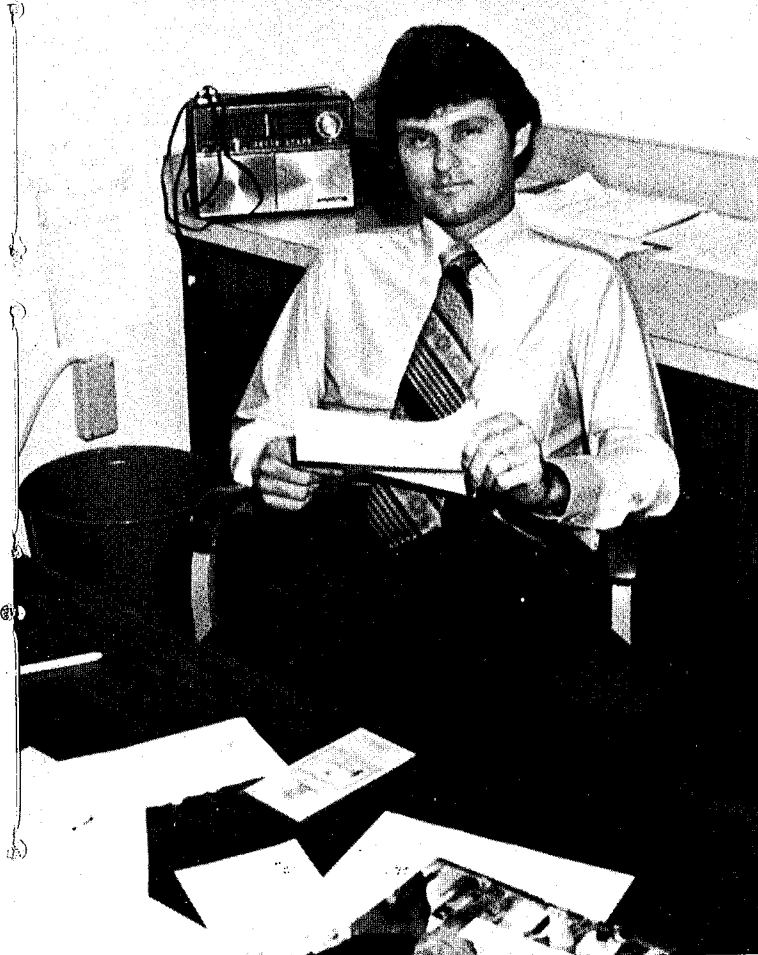

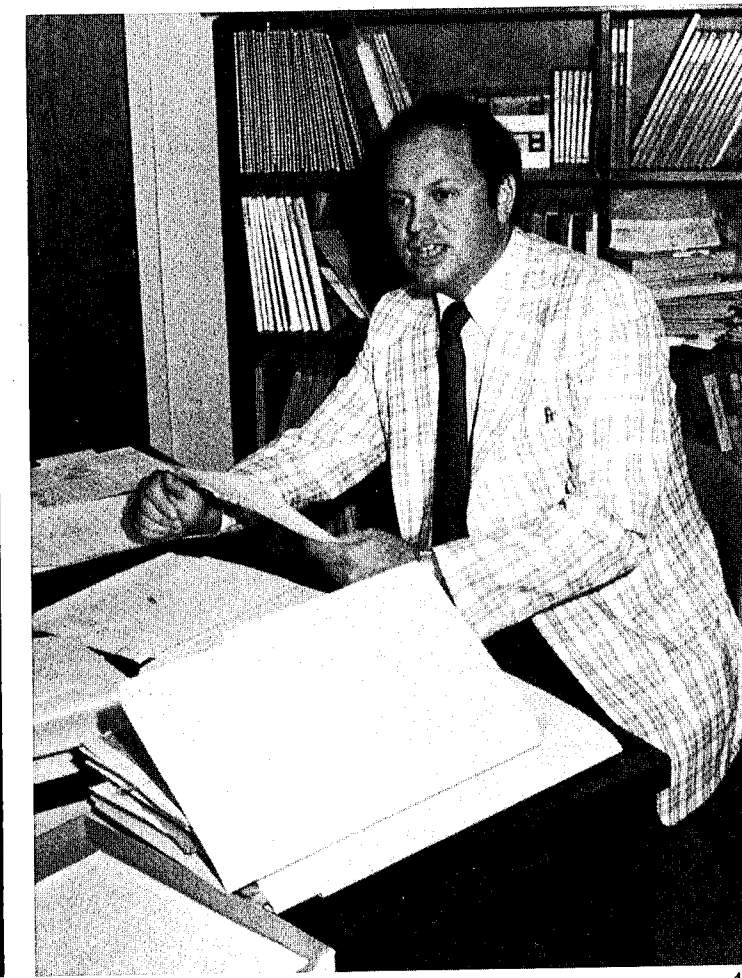

Guidance Schedules Remediation Classes

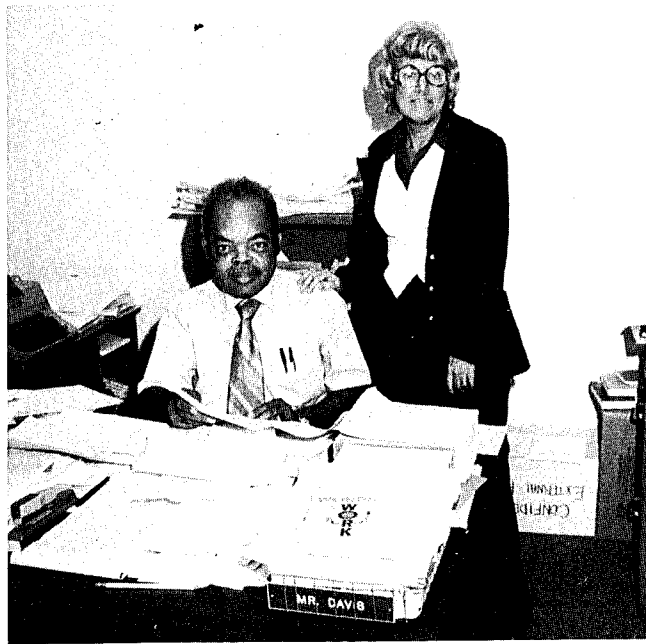
The Basic Skills and Functional Literacy testing programs for juniors were added to the guidance department's usual duties of record keeping, counseling, and scheduling.

Miss Tillman and the other librarians have been a big help to us, helping us to find material

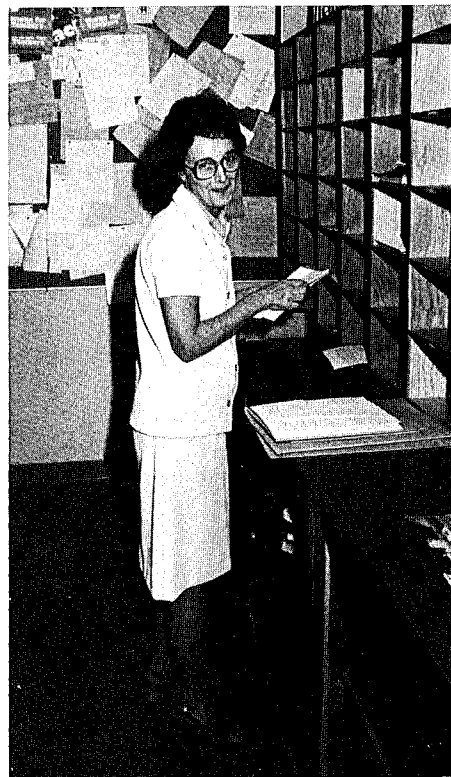
for that English theme or just a book to read for pleasure. Our new visual librarian, Mr. Scuderi, kept all those machines working and flowing out to our classrooms.

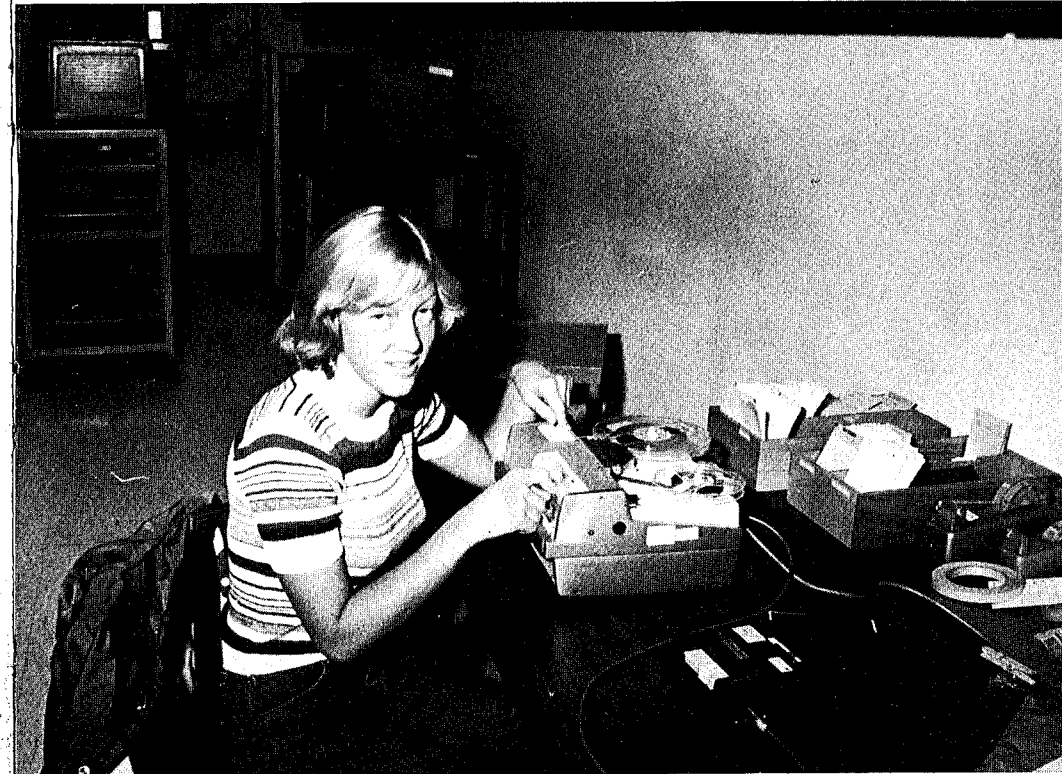

Learn Basic Skills

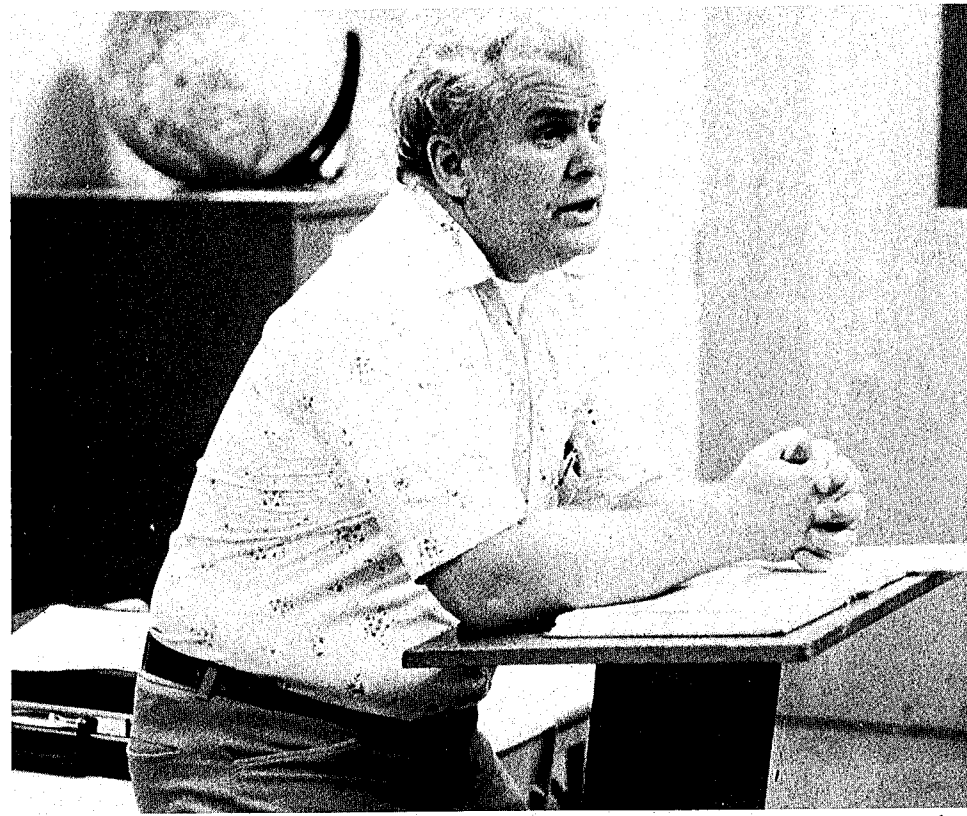
First in English class we learned basic skills, or at least tried to learn them!

ant, witnesses and the jury. The mock trial proved to be a lot of fun, and it also helped us to understand how our judiciary system operates.

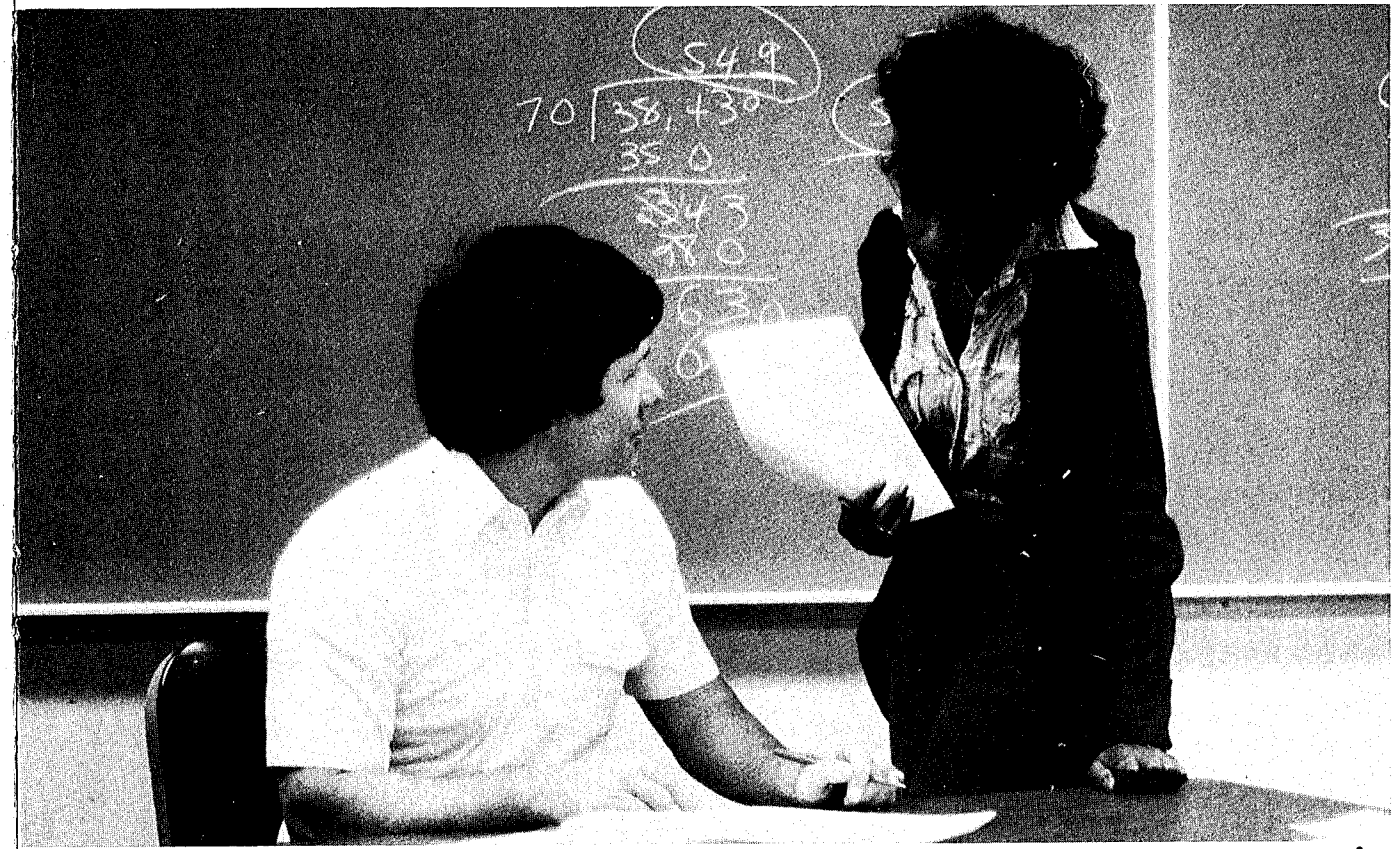

In Special Education we learned skills to help us succeed in life. Learning and practicing new skills were some of the many challenges we met.

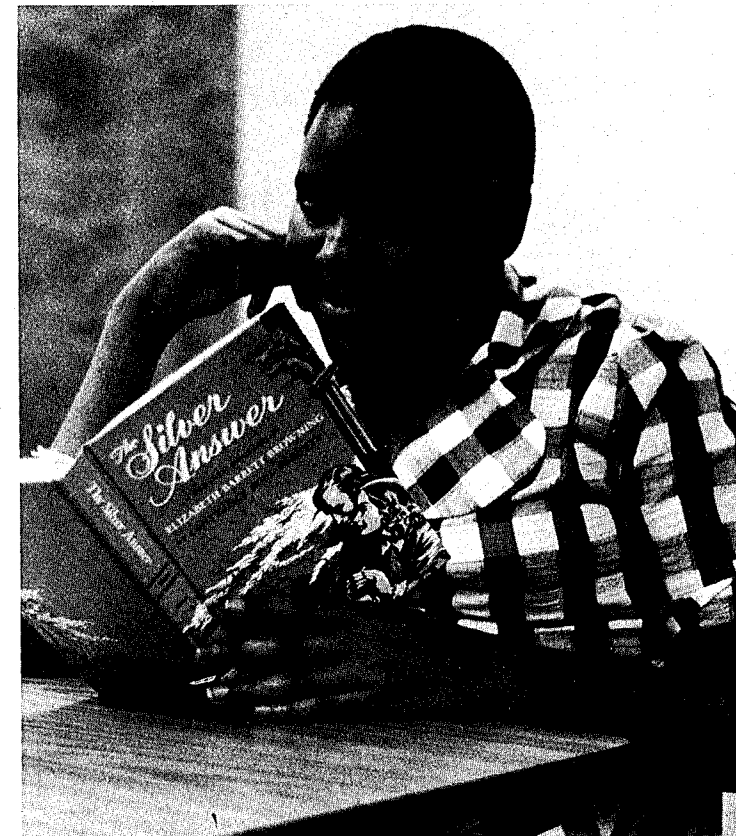

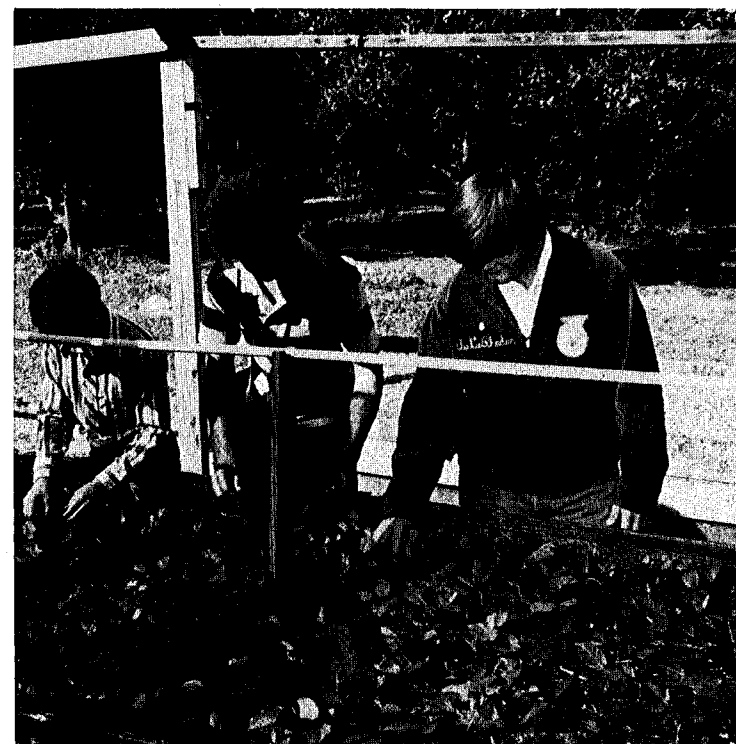

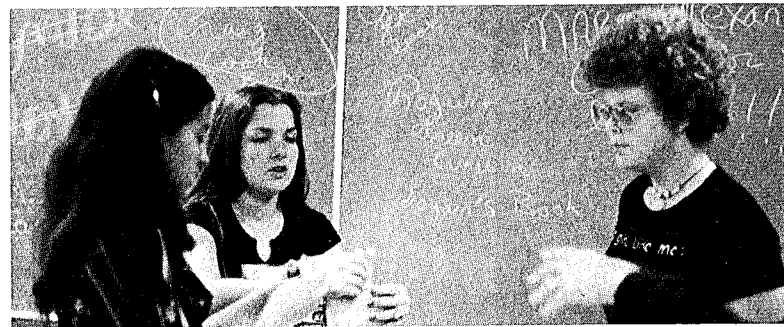

Business Leaders Form New Club

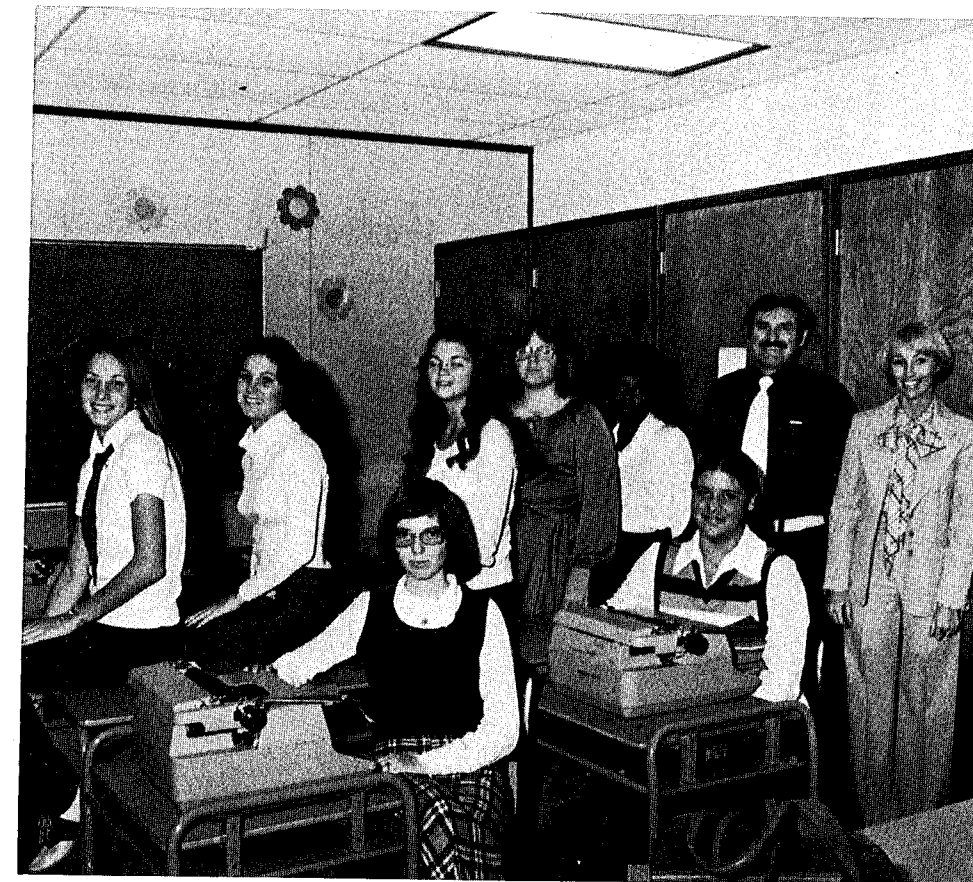
A new generation of business leaders were active at our school as we formed a club known as the Future Business Leaders of America. We are a group of students interested in the business world.

We loved the French breakfast of petit pain du chocolat croissants, cafe au lait, hot chocolate and a special Waller concoction.

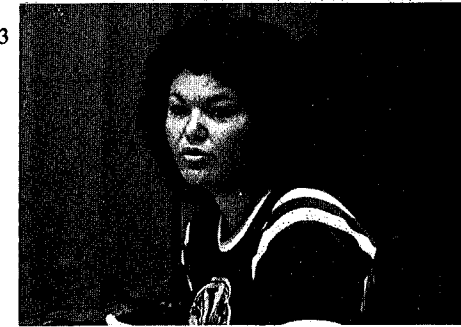
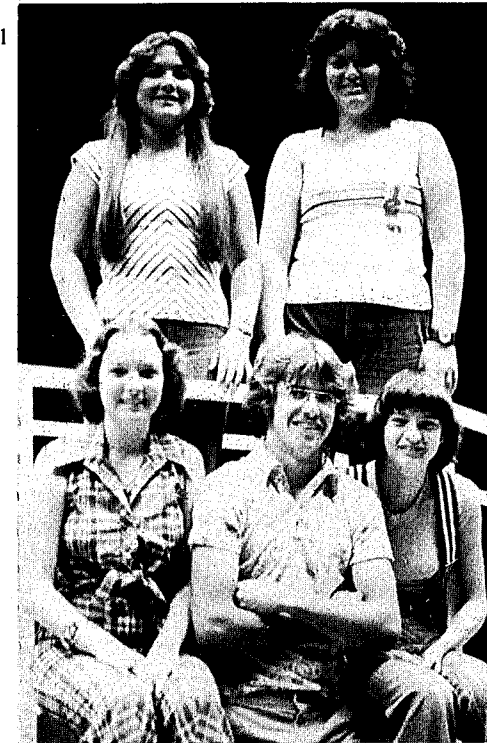

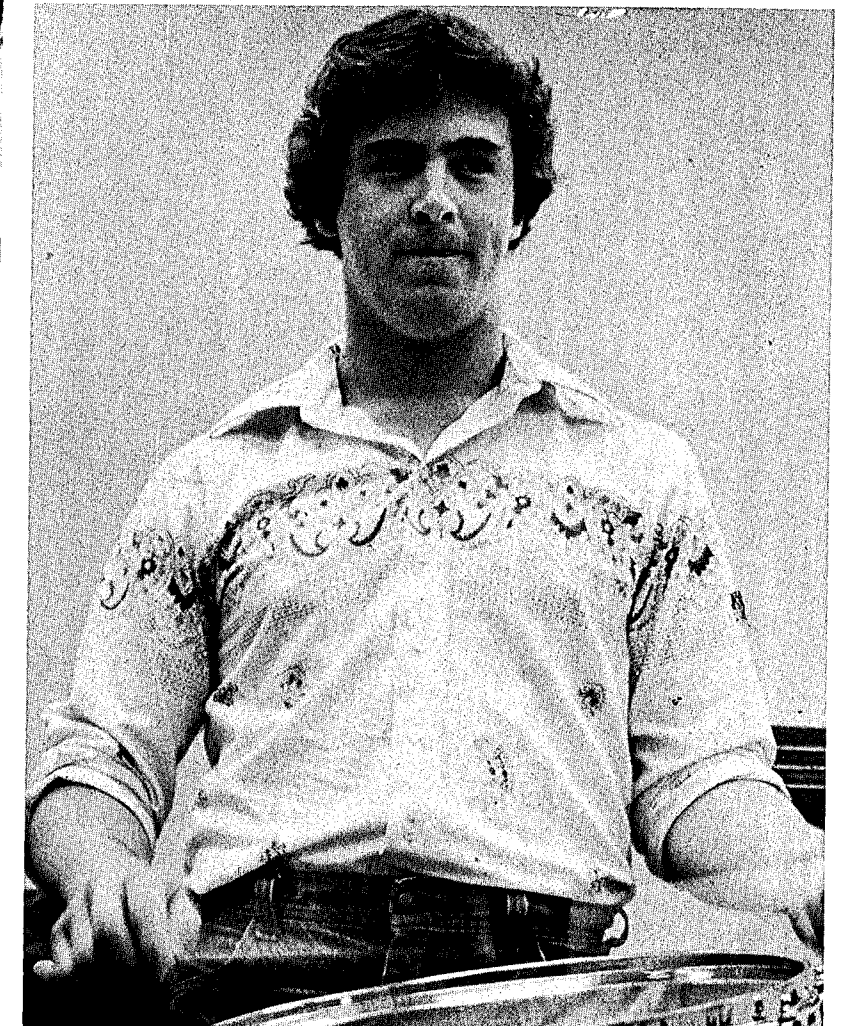
Beacon Helps Community

A bake sale and car wash helped to fund the productions, along with the money raised from ticket sales. This money was used for such things as lights, paint and other items essential to a well-designed set.

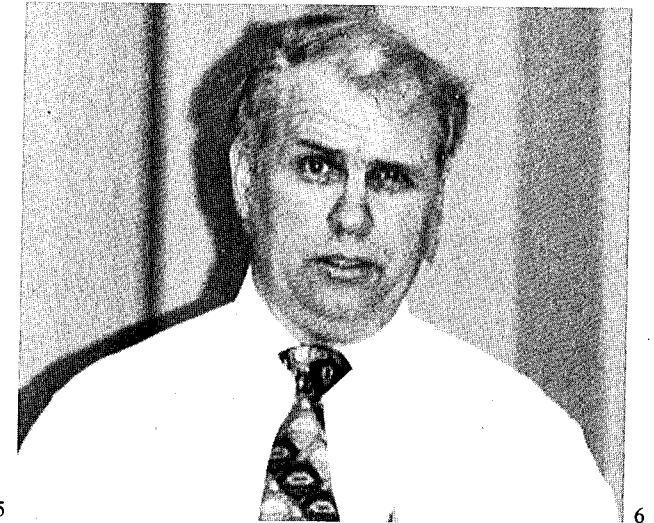

May the wisdom of Gandalf and the innocence of Prudence be with you always.

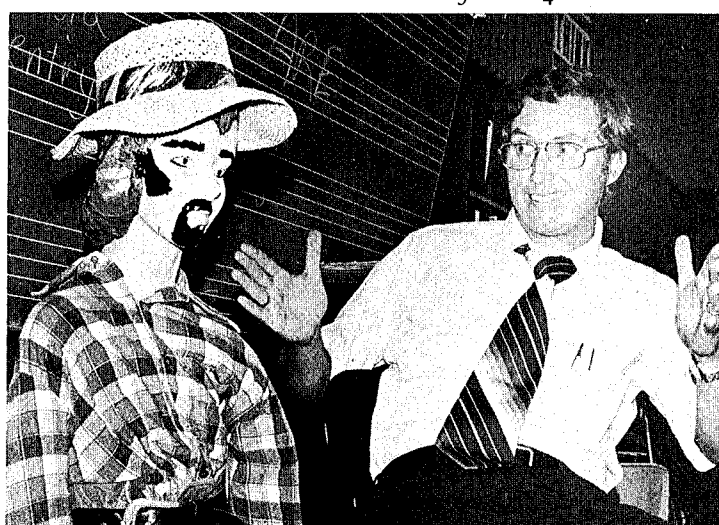

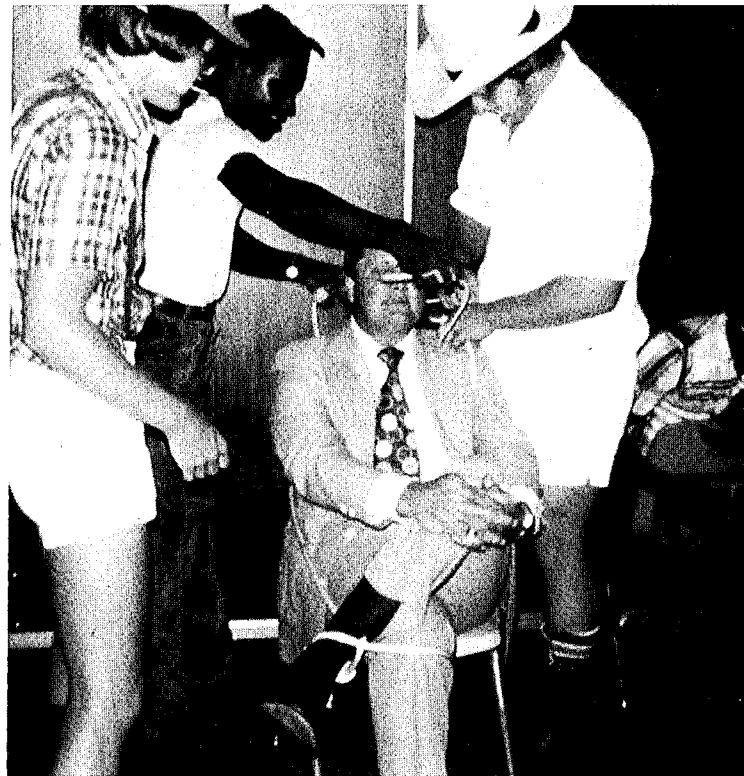

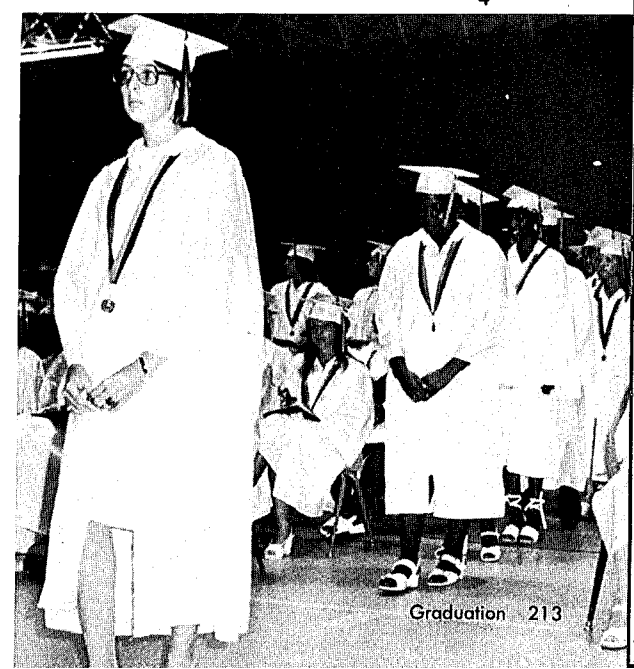
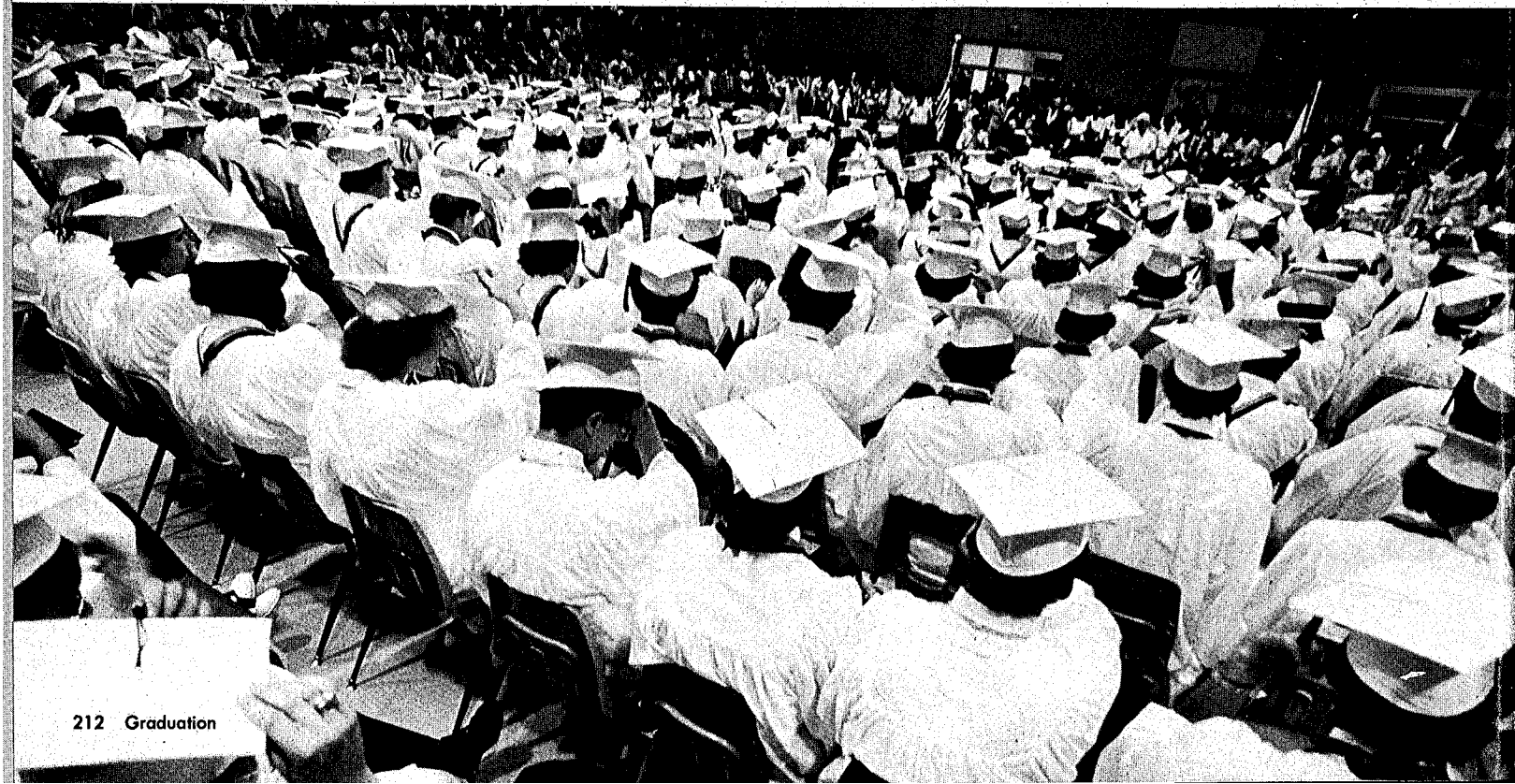
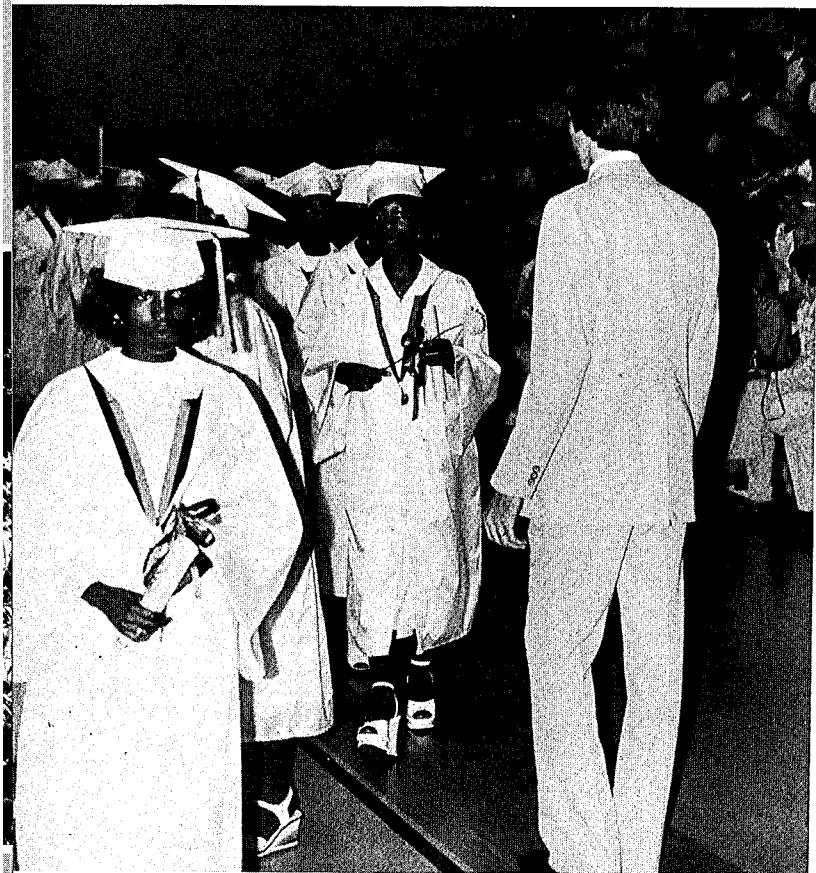
Due to thunderstorm warnings, the gymnasium was the site for graduation. However, the thunderstorms had other plans and didn't show.
