The Dorothy Dean Shelton Mathematics Scholarship



The Dorothy Dean Shelton Mathematics Scholarship is intended for an incoming freshman attending the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga who majors in mathematics. This scholarship will ensure that all tuition, fees, books, room and board for an in-state student are fully paid.

This scholarship is funded by Dorothy Dean Shelton to encourage and assist deserving students, especially women, to major in mathematics at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. After graduating from the University of Chattanooga (now UTC), Ms. Shelton was hired as a mathematician at the Tennessee Valley Authority. While at TVA, she enjoyed the challenge and reward of being a part of the Transmission Planning and Engineering group for forecasting transmission related needs twenty years into the future. She retired from TVA in 1984 after 38 years of service. In addition, she was an active member of the American Association of University Women, serving as Chattanooga Branch President, Tennessee Division President, and serving on Association Committees in Washington. In appreciation for the help she received, and to give other students encouragement, she established this scholarship.

Application materials should include:

1. The UTC Department of Mathematics Scholarship Application form, found and submitted online by visiting utc.edu/mathematics-scholarship-application or by scanning the code.
2. A brief essay, no longer than two pages in length, discussing the applicant's interest in a mathematics degree and including any other relevant information the applicant would like the scholarship committee to consider.
3. Two letters of recommendation affirming the applicant's mathematics ability, at least one of which must be from a recent mathematics teacher.
4. Supporting materials, which should include ACT/SAT scores and high school transcripts.
5. Four years of college preparatory mathematics with at least a B average.



With the exception of the scholarship application form, which is submitted online, all additional application materials should be mailed to the address provided below. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Selection of the Dorothy Dean Shelton Mathematics Scholarship is based on academic performance, interest in mathematics and potential for continued outstanding achievement. Renewal of the scholarship for the sophomore, junior and senior years is subject to the recipient remaining a mathematics major, maintaining a 3.0 overall GPA and a 3.5 mathematics GPA (both computed at the end of the academic year) and normal progress towards a mathematics degree.

The Department of Mathematics offers both Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees. Of the 25 full time faculty, 18 hold doctoral degrees from universities around the world. There are currently over 40 mathematics majors and 30 minors, in addition to over 30 mathematics education majors and eight post-baccalaureate students. A number of awards are available for mathematics majors, and internships have been established with Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Tennessee and Unum Provident Insurance Company. In addition, opportunities are available to work directly with faculty on research and honors projects.

The Marjorie Watson Mathematics Scholarship



The Marjorie Watson Mathematics Scholarship is intended for an incoming freshman attending the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga who majors in mathematics. This is a \$10,000 scholarship with \$4000 awarded in the freshman year and \$2000 awarded for each of the sophomore, junior and senior years.

This scholarship is funded from an endowment established by the estate of Marjorie Watson, who was a 1930's alumna of the University of Chattanooga (now UTC). She was a mathematics major, and her career spanned both industry and education. She was a military statistician, an analyst during World War II, a member of the team that developed the Univac computer and a mathematics instructor at her alma mater in 1936. Marjorie Watson also served as the head of the mathematics department at Huntington College in Montgomery, Alabama.

To apply, students should submit the following application materials:

1. The UTC Department of Mathematics Scholarship Application form, found and submitted online by visiting utc.edu/mathematics-scholarship-application or by scanning the code.
2. Two letters of recommendation affirming the applicant's mathematics ability, at least one of which must be from a recent mathematics teacher.
3. Supporting materials, which should include ACT/SAT scores and high school transcripts.
4. A brief essay, no longer than two pages in length, discussing the applicant's interest in a mathematics degree and including any other relevant information the applicant would like the scholarship committee to consider.



With the exception of the scholarship application form, which is submitted online, all additional application materials should be mailed to the address provided below. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Renewal of the scholarship for the sophomore, junior and senior years is subject to the recipient maintaining his or her math major status, a 3.0 overall GPA, a 3.5 mathematics GPA computed at the end of the academic year and normal progress towards a mathematics degree.
