## 9. NEW BUSINESS

### A. Indian Valley Logo

A review of district records has not produced documentation establishing the historical origin of the Indian Valley Elementary School mascot and logo. Superintendent Pendell recommends that, when the Board moves forward with reopening the school, a new mascot and logo selection process be conducted at that time. This process would intentionally include input from students, families, and community members.

### B. CSEA Memorandum of Understanding (Position Combinations and Stipends)

The Board is asked to review and approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Stony Creek Joint Unified School District and the California School Employees Association (CSEA), Chapter #215, for the 2025–2026 school year. This MOU provides for the combination of certain classified positions involving instructional aide and transportation duties, as well as stipends for designated positions that regularly or occasionally perform van driving duties. The agreement outlines classification ranges, hours, job description updates, stipends, and seniority protections, with changes effective January 1, 2026.

**C. CSEA Side Letter Agreement**

The Board is asked to review and approve a Side Letter of Agreement between the Stony Creek Joint Unified School District and the California School Employees Association (CSEA), Chapter #215. This agreement provides for a modified work schedule for a classified employee on an individual basis as an exception to the standard workday. The Side Letter does not set a precedent for other positions or employees and maintains all other terms and conditions of the current Collective Bargaining Agreement.

**D. School Accountability Report Cards (SARCs) – Elk Creek Elementary School, Elk Creek High School, and Bidwell Point Continuation School**

The School Accountability Report Card (SARC) is an annual public report required by the California Department of Education that provides information about each school's performance and conditions. This includes student achievement data, school climate, teacher qualifications, instructional materials, and school facilities. The SARCs for Elk Creek Elementary School, Elk Creek High School, and Bidwell Point Continuation School have been prepared in accordance with state requirements and are presented for Board review and approval. Upon approval, the SARCs will be published and made available to the public.

## **G. Professional Development Request**

Approve a request for Kassidy Millen to attend FrogStreet professional development training focused on early childhood curriculum implementation. The training supports district instructional priorities and effective implementation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) by strengthening Tier 1 instruction, data-informed practices, and developmentally appropriate instructional strategies. Attendance will support continued fidelity of implementation and improved outcomes for early learners.

This year's conference will be conducted in Grapevine, Texas. Estimated round-trip airfare from Sacramento to Dallas–Fort Worth is approximately \$350–\$450. “Early Bird” registration is \$599, with standard rates increasing to \$659. All travel expenses will be incurred in accordance with district travel policies, and final costs may vary based on booking availability.

Willows USD has hosted the program for approximately 15 years and is no longer able to continue; GCOE is seeking a new host site.

Program supports include: teacher, instructional aides, mental-health clinician, school psychologist, program specialist, behavior support specialist, and other services as needed. The intent is to provide intensive emotional/behavioral support and, when appropriate, transition students back to mainstream settings.

**Timeline and next steps:**

GCOE requested a Board decision in December to allow planning for implementation beginning next school year. The Board discussed holding a Town Hall/community discussion before taking formal action.

Consensus was to place the item on the December 9, 2025 regular Board agenda as an action item for further consideration and possible approval.

Aaston Burrows shared a report on Native American History Day activities. Encouraged more interaction between the Board and the Tribal Community. College and Career Day is scheduled for December 11. Cultural sensitivity class scheduled for December 22.

President Martin reported that she attended GCOE Leadership Training by Mark Perna with Superintendent Pendell and Mrs. Farrell.

### **CBO, Dusty Thompson**

Tax return finished: Return estimated at \$270,688 (\$46,000 to go to the accounting firm that assisted with filing). SRS funds approved by the Senate.

### **Superintendent/Principal, Emily Pendell**

Enrollment totals were reported as 35 students at ECE and 24 students at ECHS, for a district total of 59. Attendance rates are 93% at ECE, 94.1% at ECHS, with a district average of 93.5%. Daily calls continue to be made to parents of absent students, and appreciation was expressed for families who bring students to school late.

Upcoming events include GPAC College & Career Day, the Elk Creek Christmas Parade, a high school movie field trip, and the Christmas Program, *Winter Wonderland*, scheduled for December 18 at 6:00 p.m., featuring a special guest, Santa. Christmas break will be December 22 through January 2, with school resuming on January 5.

The California Healthy Kids Survey will be administered on January 6. Parents were encouraged to review survey information on ParentSquare or the district website. Grades 5–6 require active consent, while grades 7–12 are passive consent with

opt-out available through the school office. Parent surveys are currently live on the district website, and families were encouraged to participate.

## **10. Old Business**

### **a. Indian Valley Facilities Update**

1. The District Administration is writing a 5-year facilities master plan; currently in the data-gathering stage.
2. Timeline aims for February, but flexibility is acknowledged
3. Superintendent to consult tribal representatives for inclusion

### **b. District Website Upgrade**

1. The current site has been improved, but the recommendation is to move forward with a ParentSquare-integrated "SmartSites" website for better integration, mobile compatibility, and parent engagement.
  2. Cost: ~\$6,250 initial (setup, migration, training), then \$3,000/year.
  3. The Board discussed the desire for digitized forms for community access and submission. Importance of mobile/device accessibility. Community request for easier access to the complaint/feedback policy. Training for parents/families on using the new site/app (potential partnership with the tribal center).

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**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN THE  
CALIFORNIA SCHOOL EMPLOYEES ASSOCIATION  
AND ITS STONY CREEK CHAPTER NO. 215  
AND THE  
STONY CREEK JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT  
2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR**

The Stony Creek Joint Unified School District ("District") and the California School Employees Association and its Stony Creek Chapter No. 215 ("CSEA"), collectively the "Parties," have agreed to the following:

**1. Combination of Instructional Aide and Passenger Van Driver Positions**

Effective January 1, 2026, the Instructional Aide position (currently Range 3) and the Passenger Van Driver position (currently Range 5) will be combined into a single position classified at Range 5. This combined position will be an eight (8)-hour position consisting of six (6) hours of Instructional Aide duties and two (2) hours of Passenger Van Driver duties. The job description will be updated to include: "Regularly drives the District van for student transportation to and from school, and for school-day field trips and other school-related events." All incumbents in these combined positions shall retain seniority in their prior classifications.

**2. Combination of Instructional Aide and Bus Driver Positions**

Effective January 1, 2026, the Instructional Aide position (currently Range 3) and the Bus Driver position (currently Range 5) will be combined into a single position classified at Range 5. This combined position will consist of five (5) hours of Instructional Aide duties and three (3) hours of Bus Driver duties. The job description will be updated to include: "Regularly drives the District school bus for student transportation to and from school, and for school-day field trips and other school-related events." All incumbents in these combined positions shall retain seniority in their prior classifications.

**3. Lead Custodian/Grounds/Maintenance Position**

Effective January 1, 2026, employees in the Lead Custodian/Grounds/Maintenance position who regularly perform van driving duties will receive an annual stipend of \$1,000 (prorated for the 2025-2026 school year). The job description will be updated to include: "Regularly drives the District van for student transportation to and from school, and for field trips and other school-related events." Incumbents shall retain seniority in the Lead Custodian/Grounds/Maintenance classification.

**4. Maintenance/Mechanic Lead Position**

Effective January 1, 2026, the job description for the Maintenance/Mechanic Lead position who perform van driving duties on an as-needed basis will receive an annual stipend of \$1,000 (prorated for the 2025-2026 school year). The job description will be updated to include: "On an



as-needed basis, drives the District van for student transportation to and from school, and for field trips and other school-related events, as directed.” Incumbents shall retain seniority in the Maintenance/Mechanic Lead classification.

**5. Cook Lead Position**

Effective January 1, 2026, employees in the Cook Lead position who perform van driving duties on an as-needed basis will receive an annual stipend of \$1,000 (prorated for the 2025-2026 school year). The job description will be updated to include: “On an as-needed basis, drives the District van for student transportation to and from school, and for field trips and other school-related events, as directed.” Incumbents shall retain seniority in the Cook Lead classification.

All job descriptions affected by this MOU will be updated to reflect these changes no later than May 15, 2026.

This Memorandum of Understanding is agreed to by the Parties and shall remain in effect until modified or superseded by a subsequent agreement.

## **SIDE LETTER OF AGREEMENT**

This Side Letter of Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Stony Creek Joint Unified School District ("District") and the California School Employees Association and its Stony Creek Chapter #215 ("CSEA") (collectively referred to as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, Kayleen Swearinger is employed by the District as an Instructional Aide/Van Driver, a classified position within the CSEA bargaining unit;

WHEREAS, the standard work day for this position is eight (8) hours;

WHEREAS, the District and CSEA have mutually agreed to modify the work schedule for Ms. Swearinger on an individual basis as an exception to the standard terms, without setting precedent for other employees or positions;

WHEREAS, this modification is in the best interest of the District, the employee, and the bargaining unit;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Modified Work Schedule:** Effective January 5, 2026, Ms. Kayleen Swearinger's daily work schedule shall be seven (7) hours per day, from 7:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. (including any applicable unpaid lunch break as required by law and District policy).
2. **Compensation and Benefits:** Ms. Swearinger's compensation, benefits, and other terms of employment shall be prorated or adjusted accordingly based on the reduced hours, in compliance with the current Collective Bargaining Agreement, District policies, and applicable law.
3. **Duration:** This modified schedule shall remain in effect until the end of Ms. Swearinger's employment with the District or until modified or terminated by mutual written agreement



of the District, CSEA, and Ms. Swearinger. Any party may request renegotiation of this Agreement with reasonable notice.

4. No Precedent: This Agreement is specific to Ms. Kayleen Swearinger and shall not establish a precedent or past practice for any other employee, position, or situation.
5. Integration with Collective Bargaining Agreement: All other terms and conditions of the current Collective Bargaining Agreement between the District and CSEA, as well as applicable District policies and state/federal laws, shall remain in full force and effect and apply to Ms. Swearinger except as expressly modified herein.
6. Entire Agreement: This Side Letter constitutes the entire understanding between the parties regarding the subject matter and supersedes any prior discussions or agreements.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN STONY CREEK JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE  
COUNTY OF GLENN  
FOR FLEET MAINTENANCE SERVICES**

*EL* This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered on November 7, 2025 (the "Effective Date") by and between Stony Creek Joint Unified School District (the "DISTRICT"), and the County of Glenn (the "COUNTY"). The DISTRICT and the COUNTY, individually each a "PARTY", and jointly referred to herein as the "PARTIES."

**RECITALS**

**WHEREAS**, the COUNTY has available, on a limited basis, certain employees, equipment and materials through Glenn County Public Works Agency Heavy Fleet Services, which may be of significant benefit on various vehicle maintenance services of the DISTRICT; and

**WHEREAS**, both the COUNTY and the DISTRICT are in favor of maximizing the public benefit that can be derived from the cooperative use of public resources; and

**WHEREAS**, DISTRICT is desirous of contracting with COUNTY to provide fleet maintenance services; and

**WHEREAS**, the COUNTY is willing and able to provide said services to DISTRICT, and DISTRICT agrees to pay COUNTY for said services,

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, the parties hereto agree, covenant and promise as follows:

**AGREEMENT**

**1. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR OF DISTRICT VEHICLES**

- a. The DISTRICT may deliver its vehicles to Glenn County Public Works Agency Heavy Fleet Services for maintenance and repairs. Each DISTRICT vehicle will be maintained on an interval established by the DISTRICT and scheduled through the COUNTY by appointment only.

The following list of services will be provided:

- i. Vehicle lube, oil and oil filter service.
- ii. Tire repair and replacement.
- iii. Alignments.
- iv. Brake maintenance and repairs.
- v. Engine and body electrical.
- vi. Suspension maintenance and repair.
- vii. Preventative maintenance services.



- viii. Tune up service.
  - ix. A/C maintenance and repair.
  - x. Fuel system service and repair.
  - xi. Cooling system maintenance and repair.
  - xii. Transmission maintenance and light repair.
  - xiii. The vehicle will be checked over generally and the DISTRICT will be advised of any problems that are identified.
  - xiv. Any problems found that are safety related to the operation of the vehicle will be repaired without consultation.
  - xv. All problems reported by the DISTRICT will be repaired, as parts and resources permit, subject to the terms of this agreement.
  - xvi. All preventive maintenance will be done according to current Glenn COUNTY Public Works COUNTY Heavy Fleet Management guidelines.
- b. The DISTRICT vehicles may be brought in by appointment only. Each vehicle should include a list of needed repairs or maintenance or problems noted with the vehicle.
  - c. The COUNTY will not repair or maintain any fire-fighting equipment vehicles.
  - d. The COUNTY will only work on the DISTRICT vehicles as resources permit. COUNTY vehicles shall be the first priority for COUNTY staff. If resources permit, and higher priorities do not interfere, the COUNTY Public Works Maintenance Supervisor will generally attempt to service the vehicles as follows:
    - i. If the DISTRICT vehicle is in for normal maintenance and there are no other reported problems with the vehicle, the vehicle will generally be completed that same day.
    - ii. If repairs or replacement parts are required on the DISTRICT vehicles, this work will depend on part availability and magnitude of the repairs. These will be coordinated with the DISTRICT's authorized contact person and the COUNTY Public Works Maintenance Supervisor.
  - e. If the total repair cost is estimated to exceed \$750.00 (parts and Labor), the Public Works Maintenance Supervisor will get written approval of the DISTRICT's designated contact person to proceed before any repairs are made.
  - f. The AGENCY will charge the DISTRICT for all parts and supplies at cost, plus an administrative overhead fee of ten percent (10%). All labor will be charged at the Public Works Heavy Fleet Shop Rate as approved by the Glenn County Board of Supervisors. All overtime must be requested in writing by the DISTRICT and will be billed at one and one-half times the regular hourly rate. The AGENCY Public Works Maintenance Supervisor will make the final decision if overtime is available and forthcoming. The AGENCY agrees to perform its work in the manner that such work is customarily provided, according to the professional standards that are applicable to the completion of this type of work.



## **2. ADDITIONAL TERMS OF AGREEMENT**

- a. Services will be billed monthly, directly to the DISTRICT by statement, which will include copies of COUNTY repair orders. The DISTRICT agrees to pay these invoices within thirty (30) days of receipt.
- b. This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by the Parties. It shall remain in effect, unless either Party provides the other with written notice of its intent not to renew this Agreement, as provided below.
- c. Either Party, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other Party, may terminate this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, termination of this Agreement by either Party shall not relieve the DISTRICT of its obligation to pay the COUNTY for work performed as provided herein.

## **3. INDEMNIFICATION**

To the fullest extent permitted by law, each Party shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other Party and its elected and appointed officers, employees, agents, representatives and volunteers from and against any and all liabilities, damages of any kind (including without limitation personal injuries, property damages, special and consequential damages), losses, demands, claims, actions, fees, costs and expenses, including without limitation attorneys' fees, expert fees and expenses of any nature whatsoever arising out of or related to this MOU, except for any such loss or damage arising from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Party.

## **4. INSURANCE**


For the purpose of general liability insurance, workers compensation insurance, cyber liability and professional liability insurance, the DISTRICT and COUNTY are both members of Golden State Risk Management Association (GSRMA). As such, the two entities cannot obtain certificates from the pool listing another member as additional insured on their policies. In this case, both parties shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Contractor, its agents, representatives, or employees from GSRMA. If either party gives notice that they are leaving the GSRMA pool, then insurance requirements in Exhibit A shall be required and if not satisfied will result in immediate termination of this agreement.

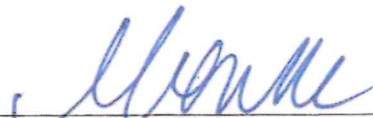

Elk Creek Elementary School student support is provided by Glenn County Office of Education who the district contracts out for RSP teacher support, RSP Aide, part time school psychologist and speech therapist, nurse, occupational therapist, academic counseling, mental health counseling and any additional needs students may need. The students are also served by two clinicians who address social/emotional issues and are funded through Northern Valley Indian Health. Professional development for teachers and staff is paid by the school district. The school utilizes also utilizes a full time Title 1 para professional. A reading intervention specialist is also utilized.

Students have access to vocational field trips, paid for with educational funds and/or fundraising efforts. Our district offers an afterschool program called SPARK which provide cultural activities and homework help.
