**Spelling: Vowel-R Patterns (ar, or, ore, ir, ur, er)**

AR: has a unique sound that you can hear to spell, like in 'farm'

OR & ORE: have a unique sound that you can hear to spell, like in 'corn'. ORE is used to spell /or/ at the end of many (but not all) words, like in 'store'.

ER: is the most common way to spell /er/, like in 'fern'. It is also used at the end of words to compare, like in 'faster'

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There is not a rule to help someone decide whether to use 'er', 'ir', or 'ur'

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
