October 11, 2022

Call to order.

A regular meeting of the Onaway Area Community School District Board of Education was held in the Media Center. Called to Order by President, Mike Hart at 7:00 p.m. on October 11, 2022.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call.

Present: Hart, Lyon, VanHuysen, Veal, Burtch, Benson, and Porrter.

Approval of minutes.

Lyon moved to approve the August 2, 2022 special meeting minutes and September 13, 2022 regular meeting minutes, supported by Veal. All in favor. Motion carried.

Approval of agenda.

Veal moved to approve the agenda as presented, supported by VanHuysen. All in favor. Motion carried.

Information items.

Superintendent – Mindy Horn

- A facilities team was here last week and will start an assessment next week. We are looking at pipes and boilers, converting from steam to hot water, and focusing on drainage and poor slope. Also, looking at the best traffic flow for pick-up and drop-off, talking about opening back for buses or adding a driveway behind the football field. Making a list of recommendations with top priorities and costs. It will be about a six-to-seven-month process.
- Last year we looked at covid funds for security upgrades. Funds were released last Friday, and three of the four are strictly for security purposes. A team assessed our facility and security measures. Looking at several security upgrades. Some will be advertised, and some will not. Some upgrades include a new PA system, visual strobe lights, and security boots.
- A Behavior Threat Assessment team will be training here starting next month through the rest of the year.
- Robotics is having an exhibition on Oct. 28-29 in Midland.

- COPESD playgroup for little kids. They will have another month-long group after Halloween.
- Head start is full.
- ECE is full with a waiting list.
- Daycare is at capacity.
