Dear Parents/Guardians,

A couple of weeks ago, I emailed details about the upcoming Keystone Assessments scheduled for January. This email included information about the testing schedule and student start times.

To clarify, students participating in testing are expected to arrive at school by 7:27 AM on January 9 and 10, 2025. Students who are not testing or do not have other school-related commitments during that time may arrive at school by 9:27 AM to begin their first block.

Here's a quick breakdown to help you prepare your child's schedule for these dates:

Students Who Must Arrive by 7:27 AM

- Students enrolled in a Keystone-tested course.
- Semester 1 Career Tech students.
- Students dependent on district-provided transportation (bus or van).

Students Who May Arrive by 9:27 AM

• Students not enrolled in a Keystone-tested course. Students with alternate transportation who can arrive at school by 9:27 AM. Please take time to plan for your child's schedule on January 9 and 10. Ensuring your student is on time and prepared will help make these testing days run smoothly.
