Being an employee of the board myself, I cannot determine what action I will choose for my children until I am informed of what my responsibilities as an educator will be for next year.
I will be teaching from home using an online format, then I will most likely keep my children at home to complete from that format as well. However, if I will be required to be at the school each day I will not have a choice but to send my children to complete the traditional school format. Also, I, as well as many other parents, are truly interested in knowing what each format will "look like" in order to make a more educated choice. I personally feel that the policies and procedures that will be put in place with each format will make a VAST difference for parents when making their final decision.
Will there be live class sessions that my child can participate in and will the teacher be available to assist home when needed?
I'm worried about Karsyn starting a new school year at home and not being able to keep up with workload or understanding but I also can not see how the schools can keep social distance between kids elementary school age and not entirely sure I'm ready for them to open schools back up. Kids spread sickness easily and I'm worried we will see an increase in numbers.

My child does not do good with at home learning. He does better with others than at home the focus just isn't there.
Will the teachers be teaching online like a classroom setting?
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I think there is not enough information to choose right now. I do believe school needs to maybe let out at lunch.
Both parents has to work limiting our time to help him at home!! Traditional classroom learning concerns his safety due to COVID 19!!!!
I plan to send her to school next year unless the guidelines and requirements are too much.
I would like to know what the guidelines will be for my child when they go back. I plan to send my children unless there are ridiculous requirements or guidelines.

What are the guidelines that the school will be following in regards to any CDC or State superintendent recommendations, such as students required to wear masks, eating lunch/snacks in classroom, no P.E., partitions in classrooms, etc?

Parents need more information to make an informed decision on such a major matter. To make to know what changes, if any, will be made to the classroom setting (such as will there be smaller classes with students spaced out appropriately, will the cafeteria be closed, will there be alternating class days with supplemental online learning, how will recesses work, etc...). Simply put there is not enough information to weigh benefit/risk of kids in a classroom setting vs. distance learning. Other variables such as high-speed internet access and after school care also play a major role in decision-making. In the event there is still no effective vaccine or treatment for Covid-19 in August/September I would prefer my child be in the classroom setting WITH modifications made for their safety and well-being. However, if modifications are not implemented then I might choose distance learning, but I do not have access to high-speed internet and am also in Grad School and working. As you can see there are too many variables in each family to fully make this decision without knowing a solid plan from the board of education.

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I'm very concerned with my first grader feeling like she's in a prison. We will not send her if she's required to wear a mask or if there is no social interaction. I work full-time, so this will be a very difficult task for us, but my child's well-being is top priority. If we can play ball, etc. kids should have a normal life. God is in control. We've never acted this way about the flu. In life, you have viruses, you must move on!

For me it will depend on the covid-19 cases that are being reported at the time my child should be going back to public school. But my preference is traditional classroom.

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do not have enough information to make an informed decision. In both options are available, how will each be operated. Questions: In the traditional setting, what safety/sanitation / number of kids per class will be maintained? Will the children still sit in tight groups of 4 facing each other, or with each desk be separated? Will the school be checking temperatures upon arrival, require more hand washing, avoid group projects / games where the children are touching each other and shared equipment? Will each child only be utilizing their own school supplies, or will the school supplies be shared within the classroom. On the online platform, will the lessons be posted in advance with at least a full week including weekends before deadline for late turn-in? OR will the lessons only be posted for that day and have to be accomplished during the regular school hours? How will re-work be accomplished is a child fails to understand the virtual lesson? How many teachers for online learning for 3rd graders. These are just a few of the questions. To make an informed decision, more information is necessary.

We dont have great access to internet. Also how will they stay safe at school with COVID still affecting people everyday?

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With the traditional setting how many students will be in the classroom? Will students including staff be required to wear a mask? Will temperatures on each child and staff member be checked before entering the school? Will each child be required to wash or sanitize their hands before entering the school and will there be set times throughout the day that they will be required to wash or sanitize their hands? Will desk and rooms be sanitized more than once a day? Will the students be required to stay a full day or will the day be shortened? If I were to choose the online learning and there is a lesson that my child is not grasping, is there a tutoring option available? Will the teacher check on the child daily to see if they are having issues with a subject? Will there be a video on each lesson? How will the children be tested? Will you have a set day that the children come in and take weekly test in each subject? I would really appreciate it if my questions are answered, this is a very important decision for my family. Us parents can only provide so many Clorox/Lysol wipes or Clorox/Lysol sprays that can be found.....I can't even find it for my own personal use to disinfect myself after a shift at work to protect myself and my own family now so I'm pretty sure none will be found to be able to donate to the classrooms in huge amounts to be able to disinfect like it's needed to be efficient as stated above. It sounds crazy over the top, I know, but so far everyone in the 2 offices I work at and in my family we have all stayed well through this pandemic being this proactive with these measures. Distancing measures? Class sizes? Daily PE time? Lunch eaten in classroom? If it will feel more like jail, overall, I would much rather just do virtual learning! These are truly sad times for everyone....
I would love them to be back in school but if they have to wear a mask all day and ridiculous guidelines that may change. We do not have strong internet so how much connectivity do you need for virtual learning and how relaxed are they on absences? How will the learning environment at school be like?

I'm concerned about the children having to practice social distancing or wearing masks in school. I think it would add more stress to the children mentally and physically.

I will be going back to work on June 8th. I have an 11th grader and a 1st grader. My 1st grader has a heart defect and is at greater risk of having complications if she becomes ill with the Coronavirus. My concern is the fact that we only have one computer, and my two girls may not be able to do their work if it is time sensitive like Zoom meetings. I will be home from work in the early afternoon hours and will be able to help my 1st grader with her work at that time. If it will be the same kind of assignments as it was for the distance learning we took part in at the end of the 2020 school year, it will work out well. During that time, the girls were able to complete their assignments over several days and there were no Zoom Meetings etc. that had to be attended at a certain time.

My student found it difficult to concentrate following the transition to distance learning. The course instruction was not well organized, and she felt that it lacked the level of instruction provided when on campus. My student also felt that she would have benefited more from recorded lectures that went more in depth with the subjects that they were studying vs narrated powerpoints that did not thoroughly cover the subject.

#### Health safety reasons

It was very difficult for her to stay on task in order to complete assignments. The level of instruction that was afforded to the students this year lacked in content and continuity from their campus based classes. One improvement that my student has said would have been helpful after transitioning to distance learning was the ability to have recorded lectures that could be played/replayed at their leisure to allow for increased understanding of the material instead of narrated powerpoints that could not fully cover the information.

Will there be smaller class sizes? Social distancing enforced and how? Will everyone be wearing masks? What guidelines will be in place to ensure that the risk of disease transmission is low? Will students be asked to stay home and away from high risk environments when not in school? How will families be held accountable for this? What is the plan when a child does become ill, because it will happen. How does the school board plan to help those children that have to miss a month of school or more? Also, how will this all impact extracurricular activities and what is the plan for those, and how will that affect my children should we choose to participate in virtual learning? If we should choose virtual learning, what platform will be used and what will be done to ensure that both students and teachers are comfortable with that platform? Will there still be the same amount of instruction time in the virtual environment as there is in the traditional school? What will the school be doing to ensure that both learning environments are receiving the same treatment? In the end, why are parents being asked to make this decision? There are far more important questions to be asking of parents than whether or not our children will be attending traditional school with the very limited information being given right now. This is why we have a board and trust in you all to make the very best decision for our children.

I am undecided because I'm an educator at PIS and I don't know my teaching options for next school year.

I'm concerned with what changes there may be with my job, and who will be giving instruction in the classroom and/or online.

Will my fifth grader be included in any school activities? Such as school dances or field trips? Clubs and such?

My son has asthma and will not be able to wear a mask for a long period of time; however, he is under an IEP and will need assistance with learning. I feel I'm having to choose my son's health over proper education services.

I am undecided as there isn't any information on what traditional school will be like once they go back. I understand more information will come out at a later date as far as the procedures that will be different and will make up my mind once I have a better understanding of what traditional school will look like.

As a special needs student, what special accommodations are there for additional support such as speech and ABA for the virtual/online learning environment at home?

Very grey area on how the covid pandemic will be like during the start of the school year - we have had success with the virtual Learning but also miss the class and school atmosphere - so i guess it will depend on what happens as we get closer to the start of the school year, then it will project our decision more towards traditional or virtual learning.  
If my child has to wear a mask full time I will probably want to go the virtual learning route.
