TTK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten finished the second chapter in math comparing and writing numbers 0-5. Next, they will learn to write and count numbers 6 through 9.

Kindergarteners are continuing to learn pre-reading skills. We are listening to identify the beginning, middle, and end sounds. For example, fish- "f", "i", "sh". You can work with your child by asking them to identify the first and last sounds in words.

TK is learning how to sort items based on different criteria. They analyze different objects and place them in groups. They are working with numbers one through five.

TK students are developing prewriting skills using different modes to make horizontal and vertical lines.
