TES Principal Report May 2022

Students:

ISAT & IRI: This month our focus has been on our state testing. Students in grades 3-6 have completed the math, ELA, and science Idaho Standards Achievement Test (ISAT). The ISAT is composed of reading, language usage, and mathematics tests for grades 3-10 and science tests for grades 5, 7, and 10. Multiple-choice questions are used to assess what a student knows and is expected to do on the Idaho content standards. These questions are used to assess a variety of skill levels, from short-term recall of facts to problem solving. They worked hard during their assessments.

Grades K-3 are in the process of completing their Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI). This is the assessment that measures fluency. Our staff uses the Istation program throughout the year to progress monitor student progress and use the information to generate plans for each student. There are more components embedded, like phonemic awareness, spelling, vocabulary, and comprehension.

First Book Grant: Mrs. Hazeltine was awarded \$824 to purchase books through the First Book Marketplace for TES families. The books are given to students the last day of school with the intent to expand their reading access at home.

STCU Classroom Supply Grant: Mrs. Foote was awarded \$100 from STCU Classroom Supply Grant.

Music Festival: Grades five and six are participating in the District II music festival in Lewiston on May 4th. They will have a choir and band performance. After the performances they participate in a clinic with the participating professionals.
