

ANNUAL STUDENT OUTCOME GOALS

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ANNUAL STUDENT OUTCOME GOAL #1

By May 25, 2023, the number of 2nd grade students who had 10 or more absences during the 2021-2022 school year will decrease in the number of yearly absences by 67% from 15 students to 10 students.

ANNUAL STUDENT OUTCOME GOAL #2

By May 25, 2023, the number of 3rd grade students who scored at Level 1 on the ACAP Math assessment during the 2021-2022 school year will decrease in the number of Level 1 assessment scores by 75% from 20 students to 15 students.

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SCHOOLS WITH SIMILAR POPULATIONS

In recent years (post-COVID), Eichold-Mertz has outperformed other elementary magnet schools in the district in ELA, Math and Science Proficiency. Schools were exempt from testing during the 19-20 SY.
