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TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

Kindergarteners continue working with teen numbers. They are learning that teen numbers start with a one and that the zero is hiding behind the ones place.

During reading, kindergarteners learned the 'sh', 'ch', 'qu', 'ng', and 'th' sounds. They will continue practicing writing and reading words with those sounds. They also learn tricky words: of, the, a, all, from, and one. They are excited about the new reader, <u>Seth</u>.

TK continues learning about habitats. So far, TK has learned the letters in their name, M, A, T, D, and O.

In math, TK is learning about the number 10. They are learning that ten can be arranged in different ways. For example, if one person has five purple flowers and 5 blue flowers, they still have ten flowers. TK is also working on adding one more.

Next Monday, our read-a-thon begins! Be on the lookout for reading logs. All students can participate.

As we begin to wrap up the month of February and gear up for March's Read-a-Thon, it would be much appreciated if families could go on a **book hunt** at home. How many Evaline library books and/or Mittge class library books can you and your child find and return so we can have a fully stocked library for all of the reading scheduled for March?

Just a reminder that our students choose 1-2 books from our classroom library each day. One book is in the child's AR range, the second is a book of his/her choice. Students are expected to take at least one AR test on a chapter book each week and/or 4 tests per week on quick picture books.

Our students should know the first 10 presidents in order at this point. In addition to knowing what our border countries are, students should also know the continents and oceans as well as what a hemisphere is.
