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Special Education-Title1/LAP- Social Emotional Learning (SEL): Mrs. Duren



So far this school year we have covered the character traits of Courage and Respect in our classrooms during our scheduled weekly SEL class time, as well as periodically with their classroom teachers when the topic fits something being discussed in class. Beginning next week, we will be learning about what it is like to Persevere, which is the ability to work through situations even when there are obstacles or challenges in the way.

Our students have been doing a great job of applying the information they have learned in their daily interactions with others, and have been able to use our SEL class time to help address other social emotional challenges, such as understanding and addressing grief and loss, learning how to effectively handle a conflict or solve a problem, learn how to be a good friend and a positive learner, and how to have a positive growth mindset.





These concepts are covered in a lot of different ways in each classroom, depending on their learning and developmental needs, including games and activities inside and/or outside - such as cheerleading in kindergarten, creative writing - such as poetry in grades 3-6, artistic expression such as role playing possible scenarios or drawing examples in K-6. Information, strategies, and skills are presented in small groups and in whole class presentations and discussions. Students can also meet with me individually regarding topics that are brought up or issues that arise.

Topics are presented using relatable strategies and examples. Oftentimes we will read a children's story on the topic to help start our discussions, or use a quote from a famous individual and discuss together what it might mean, and how it might relate to them or the class as a whole. We post these quotes and other examples related to the current character trait in the hallway each month. We are sending information on the upcoming character trait in our family envelope on the last Friday of every month as a way of giving families suggestions for supporting learning related to that character trait. We also celebrate student growth and success in our SEL time with both verbal praise and small rewards in class, as well as selecting a student from each classroom to relieve a certificate related to the character trait for their growth and participation



related to that character trait for that month.



Thank you for trusting me with your students regarding their social emotional learning. We are being very productive and learning more than they even realize, as is evident in the increase in positive interactions and productive problem solving we are seeing this year at recess and in their classrooms. Your encouragement and support regarding social emotional topics is valuable and one upcoming event you might want to consider doing something for at home is **World Kindness day on Saturday, November 13th.** This would be a great time to encourage your student to find ways to demonstrate kindness both at home and in their community, as kindness can both strengthen and heal relationships, and has great value.
