District Goals

Goal #1 More individualized and small group instruction will be implemented in order to meet the needs of all learners to show a 3% increase in the total percentage of students earning levels 2, 3, and 4 on the Spring 2025 GMAS (EOG and EOG) for all content areas.

Goal #2 Tattnell County will decrease the percentage of office discipline referrals (ODR) due to classroom disruptions by 3% from 2023-2024 to 2024-2025.

Goal #3 The district will seek to employ professionally qualified teachers and increase the retention rate by 3% (excluding retiring employees) in 2024 -2025.

School Goals

Smart Goal #1: We will implement school-wide literacy and math strategies to increase the number of proficient and distinguished students in grades 3-5 by at least 3% on the End-of-grade assessments in all tested areas for the 2024-2025 school year compared to the 2023 -2024 school year.

Smart Goal #2: During the 2024-2025 school year, the number of students receiving office referrals will decrease by 3% compared to the 2023-2024 school year through the ongoing enhancement and use of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) and Class Dojo.
