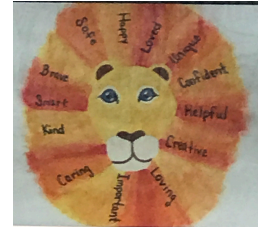

"I'm excited that someday I'm gonna be one of those 6th graders and get to do all the cool stuff they get to do before I go away to a big school, but I don't think I want to go away, not yet. I like it here."



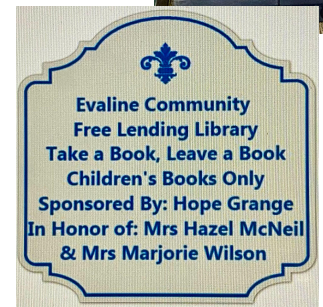
I'd like to think that if the author of our school's song, Rick Dyzynski, had been present for the reunion he might have added a final verse similar to this to sum up where we are at today:
