

What is a Title I School?

- Title I is the nation's largest assistance program for schools.
- It provides funding for increasing student achievement in schools selected on the basis of the economic level of families in the school's attendance zone.
- Title I funds supplement local and state educational programs to ensure that all students achieve in all academic areas.

How does WRHS spend Title I Funds?

- Staff: WRHS employs an Achievement Specialist Specialist, Family Engagement Liaison and Intervention teacher.
- Technology: Graphing & Scientific calculators and printers.
- Supplemental support software: Pear Assessment, Albert I.O., Gimkit, Kahoot, Wayground, Kuta, Progress Learning, Edmentum study island, Blooket, ZipGrade and DeltaMath.
- Supplies for students.
- Books and Materials for the classrooms.
- Professional development for faculty and staff.

About the Parent and Family Engagement Plan

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Houston County School System (HCSS) has developed this parent and family engagement plan that establishes the district's expectations for family engagement and guides the strategies and resources that strengthen school and parent/family partnerships in the district's Title I schools.
