### SUMMER LEARNING RECOVERY & EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR PROGRAMS

Summer 2021 - 2022

The online enrollment dates are May 5-25, 2022.

Due to COVID 19, the Leland School District will offer Summer Learning Recovery to ALL students in the Leland School District. The district will offer in-person classes following the CDC guidelines to address learning recovery, credit recovery, and enrichment acceleration opportunities for the students of the Leland School District. The Summer Learning Recovery Program will allow all students the opportunity to participate. The Leland School District Summer Learning Recovery and Extended School Year programs (ESY) are for Learning Recovery and PreK-12 promotion opportunities for Leland School District students ONLY!

The following guidelines will be used in establishing the program and for allowing or disallowing student participation:

- 1. Grades Pre K- 3 (ONLY MATH, ELA) & 4th 5th (ONLY MATH, SCIENCE, ELA) coursework requirements:
  - a. If a student is passing reading, but has failed either math or Language Arts with at least a 60 average (but not both), she/he may attend the ESY program. A student with an average of 55-59 must successfully complete course work on a weekly basis for the entire 4 week program in order to receive course credit. Any student missing an entire week of participation barring extenuating circumstances must get approval from the program administrator for receiving course credit.

A student in grades K-6 who is passing, but whose reading level score is below grade level as evident in the data of Accelerated Reader or other Lexile Diagnostics in the minimum or basic categories or scoring 65-75 on end-of-year grades in ELA/Reading will be recommended to attend Leland School District Learning Recovery Program for the summer of 2021 -2022. This does not retain a child who is passing. The recommendation is designed to build stronger readers.

b. Kindergarten students who fail to master assigned competencies will be retained ONLY with the administrator, parent, and teacher ALL agreeing. These students may enroll in the summer transition program for kindergarten for Learning Recovery. However, if a failing kindergarten student demonstrates the required mastery on the district competency test at the end of the summer program, he/she <u>may</u> be promoted to first grade.

- c. A student may only be enrolled in two (2) ESY courses in Pre-K through 12 grades.
- d. Pre-k through 5 grades (ONLY Math and ELA/Reading); 6 12 grades <u>any 2</u> of the 4 courses (Math, Science, Social Studies, English).
- e. Pre-K students with an evaluation score of "Needs Improvement" (N) or "Unsatisfactory" (U) are required to attend the ESY school summer program.
- f. All raising 22-23 Kindergartens are strongly encouraged to attend ESY to strengthen the skills of the newly incoming Kindergartners.

#### 2. Grades 6 -12 coursework requirements:

- a. If a student in grades 4-12 has a yearly average that is at least 60 or above, but less than 59, she/he may be eligible to attend the district's ESY program.
- b. Students may *only* be enrolled in (2) ESY courses for 6<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> grades (*Math*, *ELA*, *Science*, *Social Studies*) A student with an average of 55-59).
- c. A student can be enrolled in an ESY program for both credit recovery and closing skills gaps.
- d. A student will be considered <u>retained</u> until specified deficiencies from the regular term are removed through successful completion of all prescribed coursework in the Leland School District's ESY program.
- e. Successful completion of academic work in an ESY program will permit a student who meets all other promotion requirements to be promoted to the next grade.

Successful completion is defined as mastery of 75% of the student's core skills, as identified on the student's academic profile record, and acquiring a final grade of 60 for the course.

#### 3. General guidelines and fees:

a. The student will be expected to follow state, local, and district COVID 19 guidelines while participating in the Summer Learning Recovery Program and/or ESY program guidelines to remain and participate in the programs.

- b. Only Leland School District students will be accepted into the program.
- c. All prek-12 students attending the Summer Learning Recovery Program and ESY program will be exempted from any fees. (FREE OPPORTUNITIES)
- d. ESY online registration will be held from May 5 May 25, 2022
- e. CLASSES WILL BEGIN Thursday, <u>June 2, 2022</u>, and end Wednesday, <u>June 29, 2022</u>.

The Exceptional Education Summer Learning Program will be held in conjunction with the Summer Learning Recovery and ESY programs.

All teachers working the summer program will assign, monitor, evaluate and provide feedback to both student/parent on a daily basis if needed/ but is required to provide weekly progress monitoring reports to the parents and building administrators or program director.

A student schedule for assigning lessons and feedback will be established for the summer before the first day of summer instruction.

A MINIMUM OF TWO LESSONS PER CONTENT AREA PER WEEK WILL BE REQUIRED A FOR A GRADE.

Teacher planning, parent & student contacts, reporting data, and professional learning are embedded in the allotted 5.5 hours Monday - Friday.

Teachers will be compensated for 5.5 hours per day through clocking and timesheets turned in each Friday to ESY building administrator. The timesheets will come to the district office each Friday.

The number of student/Teacher days per week will be -

Week 1	June 2 - 3	(2 days)
Week 2	June 6 -10	(5 days)
Week 3	June 13 - 17	(5 days)
Week 4	June 20 -24	(5 days)
Week 5	June 27 - June 29	(3 days)

The cafeterias will serve lunches following the COVID 19 Schedule currently in place at the designated sites from 11 - 12:30 on at both sites until the end of the summer program unless state law says otherwise.

## Leland School District PRE-KINDERGARTEN / KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION (Leland Early Learning Institute) 2021 -2022

- 1. The Pre-K / Kindergarten Transition program will be in-person following the CDC guidelines unless state guidance dictates otherwise for students who will be eligible to attend the district's kindergarten program in the fall.
- 2. Transition activities include:
  - Online Diagnostic assessment and age level appropriate learning activities
  - Online Social skills development
  - Online Home-school connection activities
- 3. Online Registration will be held May 5 25, 2022 at:
  - Leland Early Learning Institute for grades Pre-K and entering K

In order to be admitted to the Kindergarten Transition program, the child must be five years old on or before September 1, 2022. Parents must present the child's immunization record, birth certificate, and social security card during registration, as well as proof of residency.

4. CLASSES ARE FROM June 2, 2022, through June 29, 2022.

# LELAND SCHOOL DISTRICT SUMMER LEARNING RECOVERY, EXCEPTIONAL EDUCATION, EXTENDED SCHOOL YEAR PROGRAMS AND

PRE-KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION PROGRAMS LOCATION: Early Learning Institute – LSP Campus

The Leland School District will hold its Annual Summer Learning Recovery, Exceptional Education, Extended School Year, and Pre-Kindergarten Transition Programs as mandated by law for grades Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grades during the months of June and a portion of July. <u>The registration date for the program is May 5 - May 25, 2022.</u> Classes will begin on Thursday, June 2, 2022, and conclude on June 29, 2022. Leland School District students/parents may contact the principal or counselor to determine <u>eligibility prior to May 26, 2022</u>.

All children who will be entering Leland Pre-K during the fall term must be 4 years of age on or before September 1, 2022, as pre-kindergartners are eligible to participate in the district's summer pre-kindergarten transition program. The program is *FREE* and will begin on June 2, 2022. Classes will begin June 2, 2022, *Monday through Friday of each week*.

Again, in order to be admitted to the Kindergarten Transition program, the child must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2021.

Parents are asked to bring/send a copy of the child's immunization record, birth certificate, and social security card, as well as two proofs of residency.

Meals are prepared daily.
