Rowan University Interns/MBA Fellow Work on Paulsboro Pride Project This Summer





The Paulsboro Pride Neighborhood Revitalization project had two summer interns who worked with the planning team this summer. The interns were both students in Rowan University's Geography, Planning, and Sustainability program. For 8 weeks, the summer interns worked with the project team by attending community outreach events, participating in the community conversations, conducting interviews with residents and stakeholders and working together on a final

capstone project to encompass the work done during the summer of 2024. The students participated in trainings focused on mapping, data collection, data interpretation and community engagement. **Read the interns final project** here!

Cara Piergiovanni: Cara Piergiovanni is a recent Rowan University graduate with a B.S. in Community and Environmental Planning. Cara previously had some community engagement experience, but this internship allowed her to realize that is where her passion is. She found a lot of power in listening to the needs of the community members, putting their thoughts to paper, and organizing that data. We also met and interacted with community members of all ages in

participatory planning efforts.

Summer Teen Community Mapping/Neighborhood Conditions Project



Over the 2024 summer, 10 Paulsboro High School students participated in a community mapping project that allowed them to survey and document the current conditions of the community. The students were split into groups, and each assigned an area/block to be surveyed. The students received an orientation with training on how to complete the forms. Each group, at the oversight of their mentor, walked the assigned block, completed a visual inventory of that block, and completed the form identifying any key issues or things to note on that block. At the end of the project, the entire group met together to share their thoughts and insights on what they had seen during their time in the community.

Key things that the teens noted were the following:

- · many street lights were dim/out and the streets were very dark at night.
- · many sidewalks were in disrepair and need to be repaired
- · privately owned vacant lots were not well maintained and had overgrown grass and litter
- · many streets were filled with trash and litter
- · many streets had potholes and need to be repaired
- · many sidewalks were blocked by overgrown grass and other things obstructing the walkway such as cars.
- · vacant homes throughout the community were not maintained well
- homes throughout town were filled with trash and debris

Summer Youth Planning Camp Empowering the Future!



During the summer of 2024, 8 youth ages 11-14 participated in a summer program that provided junior high school students with a unique opportunity to learn more about the community of Paulsboro, the importance of neighborhood planning, and participate in different projects throughout the community.


Community Planning 101 Workshop: The students participated in a workshop that focused on educating them on the community planning process, the importance of leading a resident-driven plan and why it is important to hear their voices and those of other youth in the community as the Neighborhood Plan is being developed.

Community Projects: Over the summer, the students participated in 4 community-based activities aimed at empowering them to take an active role in their community. The students spent 4 Saturdays during the summer cleaning Buck Street Park and the Baird Ave Recreation area, volunteering at a local church-led event, and worked in the Loudenslager Community Garden picking weeds and planting pumpkin seeds.

Community Walk: The students participated in a community walk throughout the neighborhood. The walk was divided into two days. During the community walk, the planning team spoke with the youth about their visions and wishes for changes throughout the community. The students also had the opportunity to speak with residents about the neighborhood plan and give them information on completing the neighborhood survey.



Visioning Exercise: During the Community Walk, the students identified an area in the community where they wanted to focus their visioning project on. The Paulsboro public basketball courts have been an area that is in need of desperate repair. Cracks line the entire court area, overgrown grass is sprouting throughout the concrete and trash and litter have overrun the area. Seeing that this area is in desperate need of cleanup, the summer youth spent an afternoon cleaning up the trash and litter. The youth then brainstormed creative ways to improve this area, including the adjacent vacant lot that once was the former site of a baseball field. The students envisioned having improved basketball courts within an enclosed space, a community pool and a recreation facility where they can exercise and enjoy multiple activities.

Youth Engagement Survey- We Want to Hear From Our Youth!


