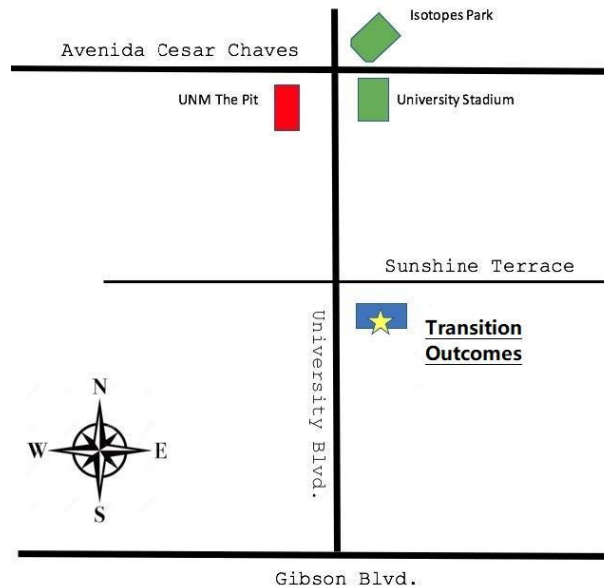

- Service is delivered through seminars, job sites, enclaves, and individualized appointments out in the community.
- Employment is the priority and instruction is designed around jobs.
- Interagency collaboration is part of our service.

Transition Outcomes

Transition Outcomes is a young adult post-high school program for students ages 18-22 who want extra support entering post-secondary training and the working world. We focus on teaching students work skills and independent living skills. Support services are delivered through enclaves. We provide support and safety skills in the community, self-advocacy, self-determination, and transportation skills with Sun Van. The Transition Outcomes team will assist students and guardians to connect with outside agencies. These agencies may include but aren't limited to Developmental Disability Waiver (DD Waiver), Social Security Administration (SSA), Department of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), and other adult service providers. Students write resumes, practice interviewing skills, and attend job fairs. Seminars teach skills necessary for employment and independent living. The Transition Outcomes team provides job coaching. These teams assist students to find integrated, competitive employment which is the main focus of the program. The team can also connect students to post-secondary training programs.



Project SEARCH

An International Transition To Work Program

The Project SEARCH takes place entirely at the business worksites. Support services are delivered at Embassy Suites or the University of New Mexico Hospitals. Total workplace immersion facilitates a seamless combination of classroom instruction, career exploration, and relevant job-skills training. Our Student Interns learn marketable and transferable employment skills. Interns participate in three internship rotations to gain multiple skills and explore a variety of career paths.



- These post-high school programs are free and offered through Albuquerque Public Schools through an IEP committee decision.
- For young adults with disabilities 18 to 21 (22) years of age.
- Seminars and enclave experiences are non-academic focusing on employment, developing independent living skills, post-secondary training, or job development.
- Case management supports the agency connections.

Am I Eligible?

- Students must be on either Modified or Ability Graduation Options.
- Must have met graduation requirements.
- Must have an employment goal and be committed to work.
- Must be working toward independence.
