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Celebrating Graduate Scholars

The 2017 **Townsend Scholarship** was awarded to Holy Rosary graduates Cheyann Boyd and Daniela Suarez, who will both attend Episcopal next year; and Ashley Thompkins from St. Pius who is headed to Bolles. The award is presented each year to high-achieving eighth graders and provides them with increased op-

portunities for mentoring and a four-year scholarship. Cheyann and Daniela also received the Sisters of Notre Dame Distinguished Graduate **Award**, which recognizes graduates as being outstanding witnesses to Notre Dame education.

Holy Rosary's Patrick Hernandez and St. Pius V's Audrianna Tobey were this year's recipients of the Bishop John J. Snyder Peace in Christ **Award**. The accolade is given to graduating students who demonstrate the love of God by consistently exhibiting those virtues modeled by Bishop Snyder, such as humility, community service, and church involvement. A Message From the Executive Director of Advancement

The summer is always a great time to look back on the successes of the past year as well as look forward to the exciting new opportunities in the year ahead. This past year, total enrollment at Holy Rosary and St. Pius increased by 20 percent, and the Guardian was able to provide scholarship assistance to all 420 students. I am thrilled to report that of the 24 students who graduated from our eighth grades in 2013, 96% have graduated high school this year and are enrolled in higher education.

This summer we are continuing the United Way of Northeast Florida's *Success by 6* program, which provides year-round early learning scholarships for qualifying 3- to 4-year-olds. Enrollment in this program has increased from 11 students last year to 30 this year!



Safety Around Water



With funding provided by the Rotary Club of West Jacksonville, the Winston Family YMCA provided the "Safety Around Water" program to children in the after school program at St. Pius and Holy Rosary last fall. The program consisted of eight 30minute sessions designed to

train children who are within 6-10 feet of the wall to get themselves to safety and out of the water.

The new "Safety Around Water" initiative launched in 2015 with a focus on teaching water safety skills as an initial step in the process of reducing the risk of drowning. The curriculum focuses on behaviors proven to successfully manage oneself in the water, such as kick off the bottom, flip and float on back, and use of arms

and legs to reach the wall. One hundred percent of children made progress in five of the six skills taught, with 96% making progress in all six skills.



STARBASE

During April, the 5th grade classes at Holy Rosary and St. Pius had the opportunity to attend the U.S. Department of Defense's nationally-acclaimed STARBASE program at the Florida Air National Guard base. STARBASE is a week-long educational program led by military volunteers that immerses youth in an

engaging Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) curriculum. The program is designed to motivate students to explore STEM through its "hands-on, mind-on" experiential activities.



In addition to classroom lectures and tours of the air



base, the students engaged in computer-engineered projects and experiments focused on the application of scientific principles to real world situations. Using an Auto Computer Design (CAD) application, they were

able to design rockets, robots and aircraft, as well as experiment with a flight simulator that allowed them to "fly" different aircraft over various types of terrain.



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
