1. **How do you want vendors to submit the electronic copies of curriculum resources and bid proposals?**
  - a. The electronic submission can be made via email as a pdf to ensure readability.
2. **Does the district want a written narrative response provided for each specification in the Scope of Work (pages 17-18) or if these are provided for evaluation reference?**
  - . Yes, please submit a written narrative for the Scope of Work.
3. **Is the bid bond a percentage of each program we submit? And if we are not chosen, is it returned?**
  - . The requested amount for the bid bond is \$5,000. If you are not chosen, the cashier check or money order is given back to the bidder.
4. **How many students are in each of your high school science subject classes?**
  - . AP Chemistry - 2 students

  - c. Conceptual Chemistry - 25 students
  - d. Dual Credit Biology - 17 students
  - e. Environmental Science - 37 students

  - h. Intro to astronomy - 16 students
  - i. Intro to physics - 306 students
  - j. Life Science - 132 students
  - k. Pre AP Biology - 25 students
  - l. Pre AP Chemistry - 5 students
5. **Can the district please confirm which Science Curriculum you teach in middle school and high school: Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Physics, Life Science, and/or Physical Science?**
