

BENEFITS OF SIXTH GRADE TEAMS

1. Stronger Teacher-Student Relationships:

- allow for more personalized attention
- deeper connections
- 2. Consistency and Coordination:
 - better communication among teachers about students

3. Smooth Academic Transition:

- Teams can align their teaching strategies to bridge the gap between elementary and middle school
- 4. Collaborative Problem-Solving:
 - Teachers on a team can collaborate to address issues like student behavior, academic struggles, or social-emotional needs, providing cohesive interventions.

5. Sense of Community:

• helps students feel less overwhelmed by the larger middle school environment and creates a "home base" where they feel secure.



 - Spanish (2 days)


GRADES



- In 5th-grade students did not receive letter grades.
- In 6th-grade students will receive letter grades and will get a report card every 9 weeks (on ParentVUE)
- Students are responsible to turn in their work on time.
- We recommend setting a day and time each week to check your child's grades and talk with him/her about their progress.
- This is a good time to encourage your child to contact their teachers about questions they may have in order to work on their self-advocacy skills.

HOMEWORK

- Students *will* have homework.
- Homework will depend on the teacher and subject area.
- Please help your child plan a time to complete it.



LOCKERS

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- Students have their own lockers
- Do not share locker combinations with anyone
- Do not leave your locker "spun"
- Always shut your locker and spin the combination so it will not open
- Less is more; the fewer items in the locker, the less likely it will get jammed
- A tip is to practice with a dial lock found in most stores.

Why Attendance Matters:

Absences lead to lost instructional time - and that can have consequences for students, even later in life. Here are the facts:

By 6th grade, being chronically absent is the leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school. Missing 10% (about 18 days) of school can make it harder for students to learn to read.

Attending school helps kids make friends, feel good about themselves, and achieve their goals! Half of students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.

Missing just one day of school every 2 weeks equals 20 days (4 weeks) per year. Over a 13-year school career, that's almost 1.5 years!

ATTENDANCE

- In middle school, attendance is taken every period
- A student is counted tardy to class if they arrive late; if they arrive more than 10 minutes late it is marked as an absence
- 5 tardies = one absence
- There is 5 minutes of passing time between each class
- If your student accumulates 10 absences that are not medically or school-excused, we will invite you to a meeting to explore ways we can work together to support and encourage positive attendance

COMMUNICATION IS THE KEY

ATTENDANCE CONTINUED

- If your child is going to be absent, please call the office at 989-923-5873. All you need to say is "This is John Doe, Father of Jane Doe. She is sick today, May 5, 2025, and will not be in school."
- You can also log into ParentVue and excuse their absence there.
- If we do not receive a call or notification from ParentVue from you, two things will happen:
 - 1. You will get an automated call from our attendance system stating your child has an unexcused absence on the evening of May 5 (or said date). Please call us the next day to excuse the absence.
 - 2. You will receive an automated email notifying you of the absence.

- Students should check Canvas daily, especially when absent



TIPS FOR SUCCESS IN MIDDLE SCHOOL

- Check ParentVUE on here you can view attendance and grades. There is an app for smartphones.
- Monitor your child's attendance; no more than 5 absences allowed per semester- 10 days total per school year
- Make sure your child goes to bed and gets enough sleep; school starts earlier
- Have a routine for homework; help your 6th grader manage their time wisely
- Use Canvas as a talking tool with your child when you want to find out about schoolwork.
- Encourage your child to get involved with extracurricular activities


