The incredible SMHS staff is already busy preparing for and looking forward to what will soon be the beginning of the school's 132nd school year.

One of the significant changes to our school these past few years has been the renovations of many of our buildings and facilities. I am happy to say that we will start this school year without construction on our campus. This is short-lived, however, as we're scheduled to begin the next round of construction this fall. This next round of construction will, over the next two years, leave us with 5 more buildings (37 classrooms) renovated and modernized. Though these projects have

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

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

CLOSED CAMPUS / VISITORS POLICY

SMHS is a closed campus between 8am and 4:30pm. As per Board Policy (AR6116 and BP1250), only pre-arranged visitors are allowed on campus during the school day. Lunchtime activities/ assemblies are for current student. Parents and other visitors are not allowed at these closed events. Students are not permitted to bring visitors to school. Administration reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone on campus.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones may be carried by students, but will be confiscated if they disrupt the educational process. If a phone is confiscated from the student, a parent/guardian will be required to pick it up from the Assistant Principal afterschool. The school is not financially responsible for any lost or stolen items.

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITES

Students must maintain a 2.0 "C" grade point average to be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities. Eligibility is determined at the end of each six-week grading period.

CLASSROOM INTERRUPTIONS

Messages from parents or guardians during class time will be limited to emergencies only with administrator approval.

DRESS CODE

Requirements apply to all students, as provided in the Education Code and/or District Policy. They are:

- 1. No attire including clothing, jewelry, hats or personal items:
 - may promote or advertise drugs, alcohol or tobacco use.
 - depict obscenity or lewdness.
 - be inflammatory with regard to race, religion or heritage may not promote gang affiliation (nor pro sports teams)
- Feet must be covered, minimally, providing protection to the bottom of the foot. (PE requires tennis shoes for safe participation in activities.)
- The upper torso must be covered. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times. See-through or fishnet fabrics, halter tops, spaghetti straps (must be two inches wide), off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops, bare midriffs and skirts or shorts shorter than mid-thigh are prohibited.
- 4. Pajamas and slippers are not appropriate school apparel.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If your address, phone number, emergency or personal information has changed since last school year, please update your information in the school Records Office. It is very important that we have current contact information in order for us to successfully send out school messages and alert you in case of an emergency.

WITHDRAWAL FROM CLASS

Students who drop a course during the first 20 school days of the semester may do so without any entry on his/her permanent record. A student who drops a course after 20 school days of enrollment in a class shall receive an "F" on their permanent record unless otherwise decided by the principal or designee because of extenuating circumstances.

TOBACCO-FREE CAMPUS

The use of tobacco products including e-cigarettes and vaping devices is prohibited on campus and at school events.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

To be considered in **good standing** and determine your privilege in participating in extra-curricular activities including sporting events, club performances, dances, Grad Night and graduation ceremonies, students should have:

- ♦ No major discipline issues
- No outstanding ASB, library, textbooks or tablet charges "IF YOU OWE, YOU DON'T GO"
- No more than 6 period cuts for every three weeks that School is in session - "NO SHOW NO GO."
- ♦ Must be on track to graduate

ID CARD

Students need to carry their ID cards at all times while on campus. ID cards are used to verify that a student belongs on campus, to check out textbook, library materials, tablets or PE loaners. The first ID card is free; each card after is \$3.00 paid at the Business Office. LEAVING CAMPUS DURING THE DAY

Parents / Guardians who need to take their student out of school during the day must be prepared to show identification at the Attendance Office. Only those persons listed on the student's medical emergency information will be allowed to take the student from school. The school appreciates every effort made by parents to schedule appointments outside of the school day.
