

#### **TK and Kindergarten**

We are starting the Read-a-thon! Please keep track of how many minutes you read to your child or they read. Minutes include any reading for homework, anyone reading to your child, or reading they do for fun. I will keep a reading log at school to keep track of each child's minutes for any reading done at school. I will send home a new reading log each week to keep track of any reading done at home. Please keep your child's reading log in their planner or yellow folder (for TK) so I can keep track of their minutes. Every child has a goal of 930 minutes for the month.

Kindergarteners started learning teen numbers in math. TK is finishing up learning about the numbers 1-910. Next, they will learn about comparing height using words like shorter than, taller than, and same as.

This week kindergarteners also finished up our Push, Pull, Go Science unit. Students had a lot of fun finishing different tasks with a partner. They made ramps, spinners, and swings, and worked with dominoes.

#### **Third and Fourth Grade Classroom**

Our class is excited to start the read-a-thon! In order for students to hit their individual goal they need to read 30 minutes each day of the month. This is a very attainable goal for all students who continue to

#### 6th Grade Parents!

If you weren't at the meeting last night, please look for a "Liability Release Packet" in this newsletter envelope. This packet is for the ropes course and needs to be filled out so that your student can participate.

It's not too late to fill out a medication authorization form! If your student takes regular medication (even over the counter) they must have this form filled out and signed. The medical provider can use their own form or letterhead, as long as it includes the 9 components on the back of the form: date, name of student, drug name, reason for the medication, strength of medicine, how much to give, when to give, duration of order, side effects to watch for, the provider's signature, and the parent's signature to authorize staff to give.

Please deliver medication to the school as soon as possible and in its original container so that our nurse can verify the medication and deliver it to the nurse who will be going to Cispus with us.
