The presentation included several options for our students as they look to their educational future. SFSC offers courses that allow students to take college-level classes, earning their Associate of Arts (AA) Degree along with their high school diploma. Students can begin taking these advanced classes on the SFSC campus if they meet several requirements. Students have options of the Collegiate Program, Dual Enrollment, or certificate programs in the trades. 8th graders toured SFSC campus and saw first-hand the opportunities available to them.

Isabella Jamora, who attended St. Catherine Catholic School for elementary school, is currently taking Trigonometry and college-level English II. Isabella hopes to become a bio-medical engineer or a dentist, but either way, is off to a good start and hopes to attend the University of Florida.

Additionally, in Januray, Sebring High School students presented their International Baccaluareate (IB) Program to our 8th graders. This is another advanced program that offers students college-level classes and credits. Several St. Catherine graduates are in the program!

Scholarships for Florida Children - The

Family Empowerment and Florida Tax Credit Scholarship programs offer an average of \$7,800 to families to help cover the cost of tuition and fees, and other educational costs. All students, regardless of household income, who are residents of Florida are eligible.

Program funds for each scholarship are limited and are on a first-come, first-served basis.
