In the month of June, Seama Room will be learning about WATER (ziitzs)! In this lesson we will learn sources of water, the water cycle, the importance of saving water, and keeping the water resources clean and safe. Water is the liquid that makes life possible.

- Objectives: By the end of this study, students should be able to:
- · learn what are the different sources of water.
- know the uses of water.
- learn what is the water cycle.
- · know about evaporation, condensation, and precipitation.
- understand the importance of saving water.
- come up with ways to reuse water, and have fun using water
- understand the importance of keeping the lakes and ponds clean.

We had lots of fun in the month of May. We learned the parts and different types of insects and yucky bugs. We also learned how to say some of the insects in our Keres language. We went on a bug hunt, we were able to gather some grasshoppers, beetles and ants. We know that some insects are helpful to us. Bees give us honey to eat with fry bread and to bake with. Bees also help other plants germinate so they can keep growing through pollination.

Our Classroom children have grown throughout this school year. Our children have learned to sign their first and last name, they have learned to rote count up to 50 and more. They have learned to recognize more letters of the alphabet's upper and lower case letters.

LEARNING TO PLAY AND PLAYING TO LEARN

Keep your young child/children "school ready" by playing!

Play is learning and it is a natural process all children do. Often adults will say "ok, play is happening, but I need to make sure that there's learning happening too", as if it is a separate thing. It is not a separate thing. It is where infants, toddlers and preschoolers have the opportunity to practice and try things out in a safe environment. It is so important. Not just for healthy **brain** development but healthy **body** development, too. Another great thing about play is that it has the ability to grow with a child. Especially for children with disabilities or suspected delays but also children at every developmental level, play is an activity that children can engage in at whatever level that they are at the time.

TIPS:

TIPS/IDEAS:

*There is no right way to do it. *Follow your child's lead (remember to keep play safe). *Make it fun-play comes in many forms: messy play, outdoor play, rough and tumble play. *

Healthy Snack

Non-churn Strawberry ice cream

Only a few ingredients and less than 10 minutes working time, no ice cream maker required.

Ingredients:

- 350 g strawberries
- 250 ml heavy cream
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract



Instructions

- 1. Chop strawberries: keep 2-3 strawberries, chop and puree the rest. It's ok if there are some small chunks left, puree the strawberries as finely as you like
- 2. Combine: whip the cream until stiff peak form. Mix the sweetened condensed milk, vanilla extract, and strawberry puree. Carefully fold in the whipped cream and chopped strawberries.
- 3. Transfer: pour the mixture in a loaf pan lined with plastic wrap film or a larger plastic container. Cover the mixture with cling film, making sure that the cling film sits directly on top of the mix, thus preventing it from getting icy on top.
- 4. Freeze for 8 hours or until firm. Let threw slightly at room temperature (about 20-30 minutes) before serving.

Summer Safety

Some tips for you and your child(ren) during the summer time.

- Sunscreen with SPF 15 and 50 thoroughly to their skin at least 15 minutes before sun exposure to prevent sun burn. Keep babies under 6 months out of the sun.
- Breathable, light clothes: dress your child in breathable, light colored clothing, a wide brimmed hat and sunglasses with 99 percent UV protection, especially at the pool. Recommended clothing with UV protection; check for a UPF rating on the label. Avoid bright colored or floral printed clothing and scented soaps or lotion, which can attract insects.
- Sturdy shoes: kids should wear sturdy, closed- toe shoes when playing outside or hiking.
- Car seat safety: never leave a child unattended in a car.
 Vehicles can heat up by as much as 19 degrees in 10 minutes.
- Water bottles: make sure your children have access to water and are drinking it regularly throughout the day, particularly when playing outside.
- Water safety: never leave a child unsupervised near water. Remember that very young children can tumble head first.





Fun activity to do with your child DIY sidewalk foam paint

Supplies: 2 4oz bottles of washable school glue 1 cup of flour 4-5 cups plain shaving foam Food coloring drops 1 gallon Scissors

Instructions:

- 1. In a gallon size plastic zipper bag, add 1 cup of flour.
- 2. Pour both bottles of washable school glue on top of the flour.
- 3. Spray about 4-5 cups of shaving foam into the bag.
- 4. Close the bag and knead it for a few minutes until everything is totally mixed.
- 5. Snip one corner of the big bag and squirt into sandwich size zipper bags to divide it up per color.

DEC will maintain Covid safe practices, with the exception of testing, through the end of this school year June 23, 2023. If you have any questions, please contact me.

- All individuals 2 years of age and older (this includes parent/guardians and any family members) must wear a mask at child drop-off, bus stops and while on DEC campus.
- Up-to-date Covid cards are still required for any person you wish to add to your contact list. All individuals must have an Omicron booster to be considered "up-to-date".
- If your child is experiencing symptoms: Keep them home (call the school to let us know your child will be absent), give them a rapid test, if positive take them to get a PCR test, get them seen by their Physician and follow the orders (provide the school with the doctor's excuse).
- DEC will continue with temperature scans and screening questionnaires at child drop-off and bus stops.
- DEC will continue with the sanitization of classrooms and buses daily. Fogging of campus will continue weekly.

We appreciate your enduring efforts to keep the children safe until school is out. Your children are precious to us and we want to protect them as best as we can while we still have them.

In closing, I want to wish all of the transitioning students and graduates across the pueblo, well as they take their next step in their educational journeys.
