

With the help of parent volunteers, Pioneers spent the morning playing a variety of games, relay races and team activities on the Northeast & Plymouth playgrounds on May 25h.










We also offer a Summer eLearning Opportunity! Through this program online courses are available to high school students who wish to earn initial credit in select courses.

Courses will begin on June 5, 2023 and must be completed by August 4, 2023. Students may only register for one course at a time.

The cost for each course is \$150 for Standard Edgenuity courses (EDG - Edgenuity on course list) and \$235 for **Edgenuity Instructional Services** courses (EDGIS - Edgenuity Instructional Services on course list) for Midland Public Schools students and \$175 or \$250 for students outside of the MPS district.
