STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

• Third – Fifth grade students took their last benchmark of the year last week. Mastery Connect is a Standards based test that will get our students KSA ready. MAP testing will begin for Kindergarten through Fifth grade students after we return from Spring Break.

• Mastery Connect results are as follows:

Reading – 312 students tested

116 – Novice, 76 – Apprentice, 95 – Proficient, 25 – Distinguished

Math – 307 students tested

75 – Novice, 111 – Apprentice, 82 – Proficient, 39 – Distinguished

Science – 96 students tested

40 – Novice, 27 – Apprentice, 26 – Proficient, 3 – Distinguished

Social Studies – 113 students tested

42 - Novice, 49 - Apprentice, 20 - Proficient, 2 - Distinguished

Combined writing has not been added in yet. Teachers are scoring

Editing and Mechanics only – 109 students tested.

21 - Novice, 44 - Apprentice, 35 - Proficient, 9 - Distinguished

There are several units that still need to be covered before KSA. After Spring Break the 5 week push will begin. Other schools in the district are breaking up the Reading assessment into two days to help students with stamina. Millbrooke will test students in the arena style and most test takers will do better first thing in the morning.

- On April 16th the teacher/classified district dinner will take place. Winners this year are Whitney Holder, teacher and Janie Farmer, classified staff member. Other winners being awarded are Layne Dempsey, Rising star and Sarah McGinnis, volunteer of the year for the district.
