- This is based on a class of 18 students including 5 PSP slots and 3 EI/ECSE students
- 5 Children filling PSP slots pay nothing
- Children accessing the EI/ECSE slots could be charged \$115/month (based on ESD paying \$4,850/year/slot) unless they qualify for a reduced tuition. If all 3 paid \$115/month it would add \$3,450 to the \$7,390 available for sliding scale support or for reducing the district's contributions.
- Considering that approximately 50% of K-12 students qualify for F/R Lunches it would be appropriate that 50% of the preschool students would receive financial assistants. Therefore, with 5 PSP slots, we would want 4 more scholarships to support 9 of the 18 children.
- With \$7,390 available for the sliding fee, it allows for 2 scholarships for the lowest income column and 1 scholarship for the other 2 columns totaling 4 scholarships. The \$7,390 does not have to be distributed to the 3 columns as described yet the example indicates a good amount of support is available. If the entire \$7,390 (or \$10,850 if all the EI/ECSE families pay \$115/month) is not needed the balance can be used to reduce the district's support of \$55,335.
