THINGS TO KNOW

STANDARDS

Reading/Writing

- Sort words into the correct syllable type when given a list of one-syllable and two-syllable words.
- Use illustrations and details to describe characters, setting, and events.
 - Connect the details from the illustrations to the text.

Math

- Measure the length of an object using a shorter object.
 - Nonstandard measurement: paperclips, cubes, etc.
- Mentally add or subtract by 10s using different starting points.

Social Studies

- Students will be able to explain basic economic concepts and concepts of personal finance.
 - Identify ways people meet their needs
 - Distinguish the difference between wants and needs
 - Identify ways to save money for future needs and wants

Science

 Understand that people use a variety of devices to communicate over long distances.
