I encourage you to tell your family members, "I love you," even when it's not expected, and as often as possible. Speaking these words out loud—beyond just assuming people know how we feel—creates a deeper connection and enhances our shared sense of value and belonging.

While it is important to be mindful of whom and what we choose to love, life without *LOVE* life can be empty and unfulfilled.
