Bulldog Baseball at Shattuck Tourney

Game 1

Gunnar Martens drove in four runs on four hits to lead Hooker Varsity Bulldogs to a 12-0 victory over Laverne Varsity Tigers in Shattuck, OK. Martens doubled in the third. singled in the second and fifth to score runs. Hooker took an early lead with Trace Duncan's two-run single in the first, followed by Justin Palacios's two-run double in the second. Martens and Shase Redmond helped extend the lead. Palacios earned the win, striking out eight over five innings. Hooker had 11 hits, with Redmond adding two.

Game 2

The Hooker Varsity Bulldogs lost 4-2 to the Vici Indians on Friday in Shattuck, OK. Vici took an early lead in the first with a three-run homer by Maddox Morris and added another run in the third after a Hooker error. Tatum Trimble pitched for Hooker, allowing three hits and four runs (three earned) over six innings, with six strikeouts and six walks. Morris earned the win for Vici, surrendering one hit and two runs (one earned) while striking out 12 and walking five.Gunnar Martens led Hooker with one RBI. Morris drove in two for Vici, who also stole five bases and drew six walks.

Game 3

The Hooker Varsity Bulldogs lost 2-1 to the Turpin Varsity Cardinals on Friday in Shattuck, OK, despite collecting four hits to Turpin's three. Justin Palacios, Cale Metcalf, Hunter Ray, and Trace Duncan each had one hit for Hooker. Both teams were strong on the mound, with Turpin striking out 12 and Hooker tallying 13. Turpin opened the scoring in the first with a single by Riley Fowler, driving in one run. Jhett earned the win for Turpin, allowing four hits and one run over seven innings, with 12 strikeouts. Ray took the loss for Hooker, giving up two runs over six innings with 13 strikeouts. Ray led Hooker with one RBI and stole two bases.

Bulldog Baseball vs. Indians

The Hooker Varsity Bulldogs fell to Shattuck 16-6 on Monday despite an early lead. Hooker scored in the first with Trace Duncan's two-RBI double and Rhett Nunley's single. They added to the lead in the second with Gunnar Martens' two-RBI single. Shattuck tied the game in the fourth, then exploded for 10 runs in the fifth, led by Cooper Johnson's two-run single. Hunter Ray and Duncan each had two hits for Hooker, while Martens and Duncan drove in two runs each. Hooker had a strong eye at the plate, drawing six walks, with Tatum Trimble and Tryston Hidalgo each getting two free passes. Shattuck finished with 14 hits and stole nine bases, led by Tead Woods, who went 3-for-4 with four RBIs.

Boise City got on the board early, scoring two runs in the first inning, but Hooker quickly took control, scoring nine runs in the bottom of the first, highlighted by Trace Duncan's two-RBI double. The Bulldogs continued to add to their lead, scoring eight more runs in the third inning. Tatum Trimble earned the win, pitching three innings, allowing four hits and five runs (two earned), striking out five. Boise City's starter, A Crabtree, gave up 13 runs (two earned) over two innings. Hooker collected 11 hits and stole five bases, with Trimble and Shase Redmond each having multiple hits.

Bulldog Track Competes in Liberal

The Hooker High School track teams turned in impressive performances during the meet in Liberal, Kansas, on Friday, April 11. Keilan Robinson led the boys' team with a first-place finish in the 200-meter dash (23.13 seconds) and a tie with Nate Hidalgo for first in the high jump (6'2"). The boys also dominated in the relays, winning the sprint relay (Justin Palacios, Robinson, John Davis, and Ryan Carter), the mile relay (Slade Stalder, Carter, Davis, and Robinson), and the two-mile relay (Alejandro Perez, Ulisses Jimenez, Davis, and Stalder). In pole vault, Tatum Trimble claimed victory with a height of 12 feet, as the Bulldogs swept the top three

spots. On the girls' side, Analisee Gonzalez captured gold in the 400-meter dash (1:01.37), while Izabella Neville took first in the 800 meters (2:28.06). The Lady Bulldogs swept the top three spots in the 400-meter, 800-meter, and 2-mile runs, with Yarel Mesta winning the 2-mile (13:37.74). The girls' relay teams were dominant as well, winning the mile relay (Neville, Josie Davis, Devry Metcalf, Gonzalez) and the two-mile relay (Mesta, Finley Duncan, Ember Stevens, Neville). Summer Fisher added to the success by winning pole vault with a height of 7 feet, with the team taking both first and second place in the event. Both the boys and

girls teams had a highly successful day, showcasing depth and strength across a variety of events.

Hooker Track Meet - JH and Elementary

On a sunny afternoon on March 31, the Hooker elementary and junior high track and field team energetically participated in a thrilling competition held at their home facility, showcasing their skills and teamwork against talented athletes from nearby schools.

Elementary Boy's Track and Field Meet

Cooper Barnes won third place in the long jump with 13 feet and 7.5 inches, while Ernny Neufeld secured fourth place in shot put with a strong throw of 30 feet. Adam Ugarte won the 100-meter sprint with 13.67 seconds, while Kevin Valdez finished fifth in a commendable 14.77 seconds. Ethan Estrada came second in the 200-meter dash with 30.01 seconds. Braven Paden won the 400-meter race with 1 minute and 11.44 seconds, while Paden won the 800-meter run with 2 minutes and 39.2 seconds. The boys' relay team won the 400-meter and 800-meter relays with 56.50 seconds and 1 minute and 59 seconds respectively. The 1600-meter relay team finished second with 4 minutes and 53 seconds. The overall elementary boys' team won 103 points, showcasing their outstanding talents and teamwork in the competition.

Elementary Girl's Track and Field Meet

Jakelynn Ramos won the high jump event with impressive heights of 4 feet and 4 inches while Maylin Russel claimed the third spot with a jump of 4 feet. Embry Hill won the 100-meter dash with a time of 14.50 seconds, followed by Jakelynn Ramos in second place following in second place at 14.84 seconds. The competition continued in the 200-meter dash. where Embry Hill excelled once again, finishing in second place with a time of 30.09 seconds. In the 100-meter hurdles, Maylin Russel also showed agility with a time of 19.82 seconds and Bella Vega finished fourth with a time of 22.29 seconds. Hooker's girl team secured second place in the 400-meter and 800-meter relays with times of 59.34 seconds and 2 minutes and 6 seconds. respectively. In the 1600-meter relay, the girls displayed endurance but finished fifth with a time of 5 minutes and 31 seconds. The elementary girls' overall second-place finish with a score of 102 points was a notable achievement

Junior High Boys Track and Field Meet

Cristian Ugarte and Gabe Casas were among the top performers in the shot put event, with Ugarte securing fourth place with 35 feet and 2.5 inches and Casas fifth with 34 feet 10.25 inches. Alex Garcia, a sprinter, secured second place in the 100-meter dash in 12.14 seconds and third place in the 200-meter dash with 25.32 seconds. Giovani Estrada dominated in the 400-meter dash. crossing the finish line in 59.79 seconds. Joshua Gribble finished third in the 1600-meter dash in 5:46.63. The team's performance in relay events was impressive, with a third place finish in the 400-meter

relay in the course of 50.18 seconds. Hooker's 800-meter relay team secured first place with a time of 1:44. The Bulldogs also secured second place in the 1600-meter and 3200-meter relay with times of 4:15 and 10:11, respectively. The team's impressive individual and team efforts resulted in an overall victory for Hooker, securing the top spot with 101 points.

Junior High Girls Track and Field Meet

In the long jump event, Sianna Velasquez showcased her athleticism by achieving remarkable distance of 13 feet 5 inches, securing a well-deserved second-place finish. Moving on to high competition, jump Hartley Stevens exhibited her skills by achieving a height of 4 feet 4 inches, earning her a respectable second place. In the challenging 1600-meter run, Stevens displayed her endurance and determination. finishing fifth with a time of 7 minutes and 10 seconds. The Hooker girl's team excelled in relay events, clinching fourth place in the 800-meter relay with a time of 2 minutes and 4 seconds. In the 1600-meter relay, they secured a commendable third place with a time of 4 minutes and 58 seconds. The team continued to impress in the 3200-meter relay, finishing in second place with a time of 12 minutes and 27 seconds. When all individual performances were combined, the team's collective effort resulted in a fifth-place finish with a total of 55 points.

HJH Baseball

The JH Bulldogs played the Shattuck Indians on April 7. The Bulldogs suffered a 13-0 loss.

On April 8th the Bulldogs came up against the Guymon Tigers. In the first game of the double-header Josh Gribble and Gabe Casas both drove in run for the Bulldogs. Despite their efforts, Hooker lost 3-6.

In the second game of the night the Bulldogs fought hard to improve their performance. After falling behind by six runs during the fourth inning, Hooker managed to work their way back to a 10-11 final score. While they fell just short of a win, their efforts did not go unnoticed. Younkers and Casas each collected three hits for the Bulldogs, with Ferguson, Palacios, Younkers, Casas, and Valdez each driving in a run.

On April 11 the Junior High Bulldogs battled Boise City in a double header. In game 1 Lucas Younkers came to play, driving in four runs on just two at-bats. Ioshua Gribble continued the runs with an in-the-park grand slam. In the first inning alone, Hooker put an impressive 14 runs on the scoreboard. Fernandez started on mound for Hooker. the accumulating eight strikeouts over the course of the game. The final score was 17-3.

Game 2 allowed Hooker to continue their newly found win streak, with a final score of 6-5. Going into the bottom of the second, the score was tied. However, the Bulldogs took advantage of a dropped third strike to bring in two runs. A wild pitch then brought in a third run for the inning.

must figure out who they can trust.






Mrs. Kennedy's Recommendation Sunrise on the Reaping (The Hunger Games Prequel) by Suzanne Collins
