MISSION

GHS Class of 1981 annual scholarship's mission is to encourage, incentivize, and inspire graduating seniors to pursue their academic or vocational goals.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarship Committee will award either a \$500 first-place, \$300 second-place, or a \$200 third-place scholarship to the top three scholarship submissions that meet the scholarship criteria and eventually verify enrollment at a:

- 1. Four-year College or University
- 2. Two-Year Junior or Community College
- 3. Vocational or Technical Training Program

ELIGIBILITY

All graduating seniors from the GHS class of 2023 are eligible for one of three scholarships.

CRITERIA

- 1. Graduating senior*
- 2. 2.5 Grade Point Average*
- 3. One (1) Page Essay (grammar, spelling)*
- 4. Examples of Student Intra-curricula & Extra-curricula Leadership (e.g., SGA, 4-H, JROTC, etc.)**
- 5. Examples of Student Volunteerism (e.g., Scouts, Meals-on-Wheels, Caregiver, Public Library, etc.)**
- 6. Work experience**

*Required

**Any combination of these criteria can help boost a student's chances of winning; it is in each student's best interest to submit as much material as possible.
