# Helpful Hints

-When *c* is followed by the vowels *e* (*ce*) or *i* (*ci*), the sound of c changes from /k/ to /s/ (*cent; cite*).

-When g is followed by the vowels e(ge) or i(gi), the sound of g changes from /g/ to /j/ (gem; gin).

-When a consonant plus *c* or *g* comes between the first vowel and the silent *e*, the two consonants will act as guardians, making the first vowel short (*dance, prince, plunge*).

-English words never end in the letter *j*. When the sound /j/ is heard at the end of a word, it will always be spelled *ge*. Words with a long vowel sound will end with just the *ge* spelling (*cage*). Words with a short vowel sound will end with a *dge* spelling (*judge*; *bridge*).
