TK and Kindergarten

This week, kindergarten students are wrapping up Unit 3 in reading. They have been working hard on learning the sounds of the letters a, m, c, d, g, i, o, and t. Using these sounds, students are beginning to sound out simple three-letter words and are practicing identifying the beginning, middle, and ending sounds in short words.

In math, we are focusing on the numbers 6 through 8. Students are learning how to write each number and explore number pairs that add up to them.

TK students are learning all about families this week. They are enjoying classic nursery rhymes like *Where is Thumbkin* and *Teddy Bear, Teddy Bear*. In language activities, they are learning to identify syllables in spoken words and recognize rhyming words.

In math, TK is continuing to work with the numbers 1 through 5, practicing number recognition and foundational counting skills.

First and Second Grade Explorers

Students had a lovely time at the Winlock Fire Station! We are so thankful for the generosity and partnership of the Winlock fire fighters. Students walked through an ambulance and fire truck and were able to see how heavy the training dummy was!

Students read about and explored leaves this week. For art, we made autumn trees using tissue and construction paper. Next week we will do an investigation on leaf transpiration and write an expository paragraph describing a leaf's life cycle.

In social studies we reviewed the earth's continents, oceans, as well as cardinal and intermediate compass rose directions. Next week we will zero in on North America and the location of the United States.

Second graders began a new math chapter exploring subtraction concepts. First graders began a unit on basic math facts.

Thank you for returning your conference confirmation times! I am looking forward to meeting with families during the week of November 3rd.

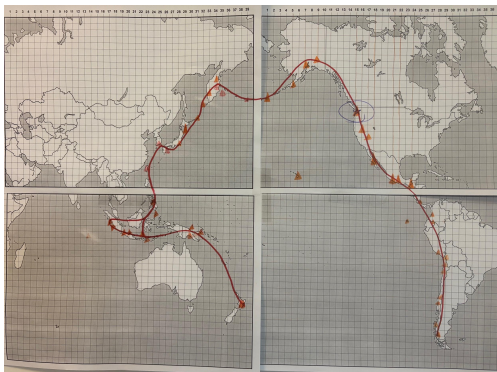

Students delved into Washington State history by reading from their textbooks and exploring key events that shaped our region. Afterward, they practiced using direct quotes in their written responses and essays. We emphasized the importance of quotation marks and proper citations to acknowledge and give credit to original authors.

In science, students applied their understanding of maps and grids to plot volcanoes around the Pacific Ocean while studying the Ring of Fire. Take a look at the impressive map our class created below!

Our class has had another great week of learning! In ELA, we're continuing our journey through *Bud, Not Buddy* and exploring figurative language in the story. Students will soon begin a new writing project focused on "Rules to Live By," where they'll create and explain their own personal rule.

In math, 6th graders wrapped up their unit on fractions and are moving on to rational numbers, while 5th graders are finishing their work with adding and subtracting decimals and will soon begin multiplying and dividing them. In social studies, we've been learning about Native American tribes of the Northwest and Southwest, comparing their environments, cultures, and ways of life. In science, students are researching objects in our solar system for a creative project that's helping them explore the wonders of space. It's been a busy, productive, and exciting week in our classroom!

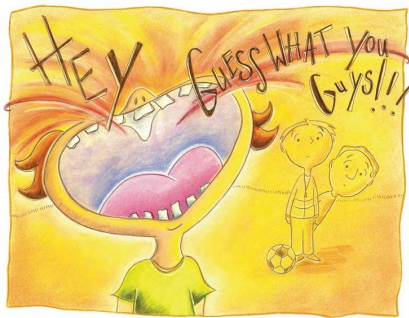


This month as TTK-ers and Kinders we learned that being Responsible is:
