Did You Know?

Technology originally made its way into the U.S. education system as a necessity to prepare for an increasingly digital future and as part of its Cold War era competition. After witnessing the launch of Sputnik, the Soviet Union's first satellite, America shifted much of its attention in education to math and science while embracing technology in particular. The Vocational Education Act in 1963 funded technology use in schools. As a result, students learned programming languages like BASIC, and PCs gradually made their way into some classrooms. Decades later, the internet connected computers worldwide; that connectedness revolutionized education and it will continue to transform education! (Pictured left is an overhead projector that became popular in the 1930's for displaying transparencies, which our school district only replaced with interactive whiteboards and flat panel displays a few years ago.)


