Use the different sections of this letter to begin conversations with your child about what he or she is learning.

Big Idea: What do you have in common with people around the world?

Ask your child how this week's reading selection helps him or her answer this question.

This week's reading selection: Just 17 Syllables!

Summary: After his parents' jobs take their family to Japan, Danny is wracked with homesickness for the United States. When he's introduced to the poetic art of haiku, Danny learns how to express his feelings and participate in Japanese society.

DISCUSS with your child different forms of art (painting, ceramics, photography, dance, poetry, etc.). Have your child tell you his or her favorite art form.
