From the Activity Director's Desk 4/3/2023 The spring sports season has commenced with strong participation from students. Baseball has 14 7/8th graders, including 3 from WAO, and 20 9-12 graders, with 6 from WAO. Softball has 21 girls in grades 7-12, with 13 from WAO. Track has 67 girls and 32 boys, with 35 and 29 from WAO, respectively. However, golf participation is currently lower than desired with only 7 WAO students out. WAO has a total of 93 athletes participating in spring sports, a commendable number that we hope will increase in the coming years. Art festival was postponed until the beginning of April.

Basketball evaluations have completed. We saw great growth in our coaches this year. WAO is blessed to have the coaches we do have. A huge thank you to the winter head coaches, Casey Pierce and Christian Erickson, and their assistants!

Fourteen students participated in Knowledge Bowl this year and they were split into three teams. One team advanced to Regionals. Two seniors received academic honorable mentions at the Regional competition. Beth Murray is doing a fantastic job growing the program I am are anticipating much success in the next few years.

We will interview candidates for the fall cheer team coach early in April. WAO is looking to hire an assistant football coach with offensive line experience and an assistant girls basketball coach.

E-Sport wrapped up there season with missing a state invite by one place. Next year we will open the opportunity to participate to all students in grade 7-12. Currently we allow 9-12th graders to participate. 9 students participated in E-sport this year.

Four students attended the state FCCLA conference which was held March 26-28 in Minneapolis. Three students, Layne Bayne, Kaitlyn Hanson, and Macy Novacek qualified for nationals. This is a tremendous achievement, and it is a testament to the hard work, dedication, and commitment to excellence of the advisor Jerrica Pribula and her students. Again we are fortunate to have dedicated advisors at WAO.

FLA had a team of 6 8th grade boys compete at the regional FLA convention held in Ulen, Mn. Four of the twelve teams that competed earned their way to the state convention which will be held on April 23-25. WAO earned second place and will advance! Congrats to our Ag Instructor Jane Stand.

The district needs to be proactive and really push our parents to fill out the paperwork for free and reduced lunch. I am fearful that with the state passing free lunch for all students, our families will not fill out the paper work. WAO gets extra funding, qualifies for additional programs and receives grants based the number of students that qualify for free and reduced meals. Also, the number of students that qualify for free and reduced meals is a factor in determining the level of play our athletics are put into. MSHSL enrollment is determined by the enrollment WAO reports Minnesota Department of Education in grades 9 – 12 minus 40 percent of their educational benefit (those that qualify for free and reduced lunch). For the next two years the MSHSL enrollment calculation will not change and will use educational benefit.

The evaluation process for coaches/directors for winter sports that are not classified as athletics have also began. These include Esport, Knowledge-bowl, and One-Act. Before the year end, FFA, FCCLA, Band, Choir, MSHSL Art, the Musical and any other extra curricular activity with paid supervision will have evaluations on file and face to face end of the year meetings with me. These evaluations are a tool to be used by the coach/director to improve and grow their programs.
