

A Refresher

How High School Credits Are Earned



- **STUDENTS EARN 1/2 CREDIT FOR EACH CLASS PASSED EACH SEMESTER**

Credit is earned for Grades 70% or Higher

- **EACH SEMESTER IS INDEPENDENT**

A student can pass one semester but not the other.

- **GRADES EARNED EACH SEMESTER COUNT TOWARDS OVERALL GRADE POINT AVERAGE**

All courses matter for GPA.

- **THERE ARE SEVERAL OPTIONS FOR RE-TAKING FAILED COURSES**

Retaking course, credit recovery, and summer school are all options.



Dual Enrollment Options for Rising Juniors

- **STUDENTS CAN TAKE COLLEGE COURSES WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL AND RECEIVE CREDIT FOR BOTH**

11th & 12th grade students are eligible for up to 30 Semester hours or 45 quarter hours of college funding while enrolled in high school

- **1 COLLEGE COURSE = 1 CREDIT IN HIGH SCHOOL**

Students take courses from the state-approved list and can receive credit for equivalent courses required for high school graduation

- **STUDENTS WHO PARTICIPATE IN DUAL ENROLLMENT REMAIN ELIGIBLE FOR SPORTS AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

Student can take dual enrollment courses in combination with high school courses, or they can choose to fulfill all requirements for graduation through dual enrollment coursework.



Advanced Placement Options



- **ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSEWORK IS ANOTHER GREAT OPTION FOR COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL**

- **WRHS OFFERS A WIDE VARIETY OF AP COURSES. IN 11TH AND 12TH GRADES THESE COURSES BECOME THE HONORS/GIFTED PROGRAM OPTIONS**

AP English Language, AP Literature, AP Studio Drawing, AP Studio Art 2D, AP Statistics, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Biology, AP Environmental Science, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, AP Studio Art 3D, AP World History, AP US History, AP Macroeconomics, AP European History, AP Government, AP Psychology, AP Art History

- **STUDENTS DON'T HAVE TO BE IN THE HONORS PROGRAM TO PARTICIPATE IN AP COURSEWORK**


Work-based Learning



- **JUNIORS & SENIORS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR WORK-BASED LEARNING**
- **THERE ARE MULTIPLE REQUIREMENTS**
 - Students must apply and be approved
 - Students must already have a job
 - Students must not be credit-deficient
 - The course will not be placed on the student's schedule until completely accepted.
- **JUNIORS WITH WBL CAN BE RELEASED 6TH AND 7TH PERIODS AFTER COMPLETING ORIENTATION**
- **ASSIGNMENTS AND LOGS ARE REGULARLY DUE TO THE WBL TEACHER**

Testing & Assessments



- **10TH GRADE STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE PSAT EACH OCTOBER**

This test serves as a predictor for the SAT, a college entrance exam. Juniors wishing to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship or practice for the SAT may also take the exam.

- **TYPICALLY NOT AN END-OF-COURSE TEST YEAR**

Students taking Algebra 1, Biology, American Literature, and US History will have an End of Course test.

- **MAP GROWTH TESTING**

Testing in Math and Reading three times per year to measure student growth.

- **SAT & ACT COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS**

Students typically began taking these in late spring of their Junior year, but there is sometimes reasons to take them sooner (qualifying for Dual Enrollment, special program, or test prep.)


Tracking Growth & Literacy

- **BE SURE TO REVIEW THE MAPS TESTING RESULTS THAT ARE SENT HOME PERIODICALLY**

These give you a good idea of your student's growth in math and reading. The results include an estimation of their Lexile level.

- **STUDENT LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM (SLDS) PARENT PORTAL**

SLDS houses a wealth of information about your student's achievement, attendance, and growth while enrolled in Georgia schools. This is available through Infinite Campus.
