Minutes for the School Council Meeting Veterans High School Council November 29, 2022

1. Call to Order

Mrs. Angel Brown, chairperson, called the meeting to order.

3. Approval of Agenda

Dr. Barbour distributed the agenda pursuant to the Open Meetings Act. A vote of the agenda will be required. Kaci Whiddon motioned to approve the agenda, and Bill Connelly seconded. The vote was unanimous.

7. Report of the Principal

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Dr. Barbour reviewed the 2022 graduation rate released in October. She noted that VHS has had an 8% gain in eight years with a 500-student increase. She further stated that the school has had a 5% gain since pre-COVID. She discussed the requirements of dropout coding for state reporting and the process of accounting for all students enrolled in the given graduation cohort. She stated that continued relationship building and student buy in had been important in making gains and continuing to maintain positive progress. She also discussed graduation venues such as CGTC's DAP program. Ms. Whiddon also noted that teachers continue to respond to gaps from online learning during COVID, and that our staff has responded well to continue to retain and graduate students.

SOAR Update

Dr. Barbour reviewed the one time, 55-minute session weekly for student remediation and enrichment needs. She discussed the varied options and how the school has adapted the structure to be more meaningful and purposeful for student growth and improvement. The operational procedures were reviewed, along with the process for weekly choices – posted on the website and reviewed in first period weekly with all students. Less than 3% of students have been displaced or not choosing an appropriate session, so students and teachers have acclimated well to maximizing the opportunities for support.

- Safety Update: Drill Procedures and Centegix Update
 Dr. Barbour reviewed the procedures for monthly fire drills, along with semester
 code practice and severe weather drills. She presented information on the
 installation of Centegix technology for emergency response and stated that
 training was forthcoming for all staff and for all county schools to be online in
 January.
- End of Semester Exams/Exemptions/MAP Testing Dr. Barbour reviewed the MAP testing dates (11.30.22 – 12.5.22), in which all freshman and sophomore students will participate in winter assessment for measuring growth in English and Math skills. She discussed the prioritized standards in those content areas, along with supports in place with IXL standard skill plans and student goal monitoring. She stated that exemption notices will be sent home on 12.12.22 for parent confirmation on exams exempted, per policy, along with the exam schedule. The December parent email will also have that information included and attached.

 The Houston County School District will host a ribbon cutting for the school's new classroom addition and multipurpose room on Monday, 12.12.22 at 4:00pm; she invited the School Council members to attend.
