- Student progress will be immediately accessible using the Information on demand program that is accessible using PowerSchool.
- Progress reports for those students who receive interventions through the Problem Support Team will be sent home

 - Staff will be available for consultation with parents as needed and scheduled during planning periods, before school, after school, or upon request.
