School Responsibilities

- PK-2 grades will hold two conferences once per semester.
- 3-5 grades will hold two conferences once per semester.
- Parents may request additional conferences by calling the school office or by sending a written request to the teacher or principal to schedule an appointment.
- Appointments may be set during the teacher's planning and conferencing period or before or after school.

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:

- Mid-quarter reports will be sent home during the fifth week of the quarter.
- Report cards will be sent home at the end of the quarter.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- Parents may request conferences, in addition to the required conferences.
- Parents may contact faculty by telephone, note/letter, or by email.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- Please contact the principal and/or office staff for specific opportunities to volunteer.

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

Information is provided as requested in the parent's native language or an interpreter is requested from the English Language Director to assist the parent in fully understanding the information provided.

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Supply my child with appropriate school supplies
- Be responsible for my child's punctuality and school attendance
- Support discipline policies of the classroom and school
- Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education
- Maintain a time and place for homework and review it regularly

- Adhere to arrival and dismissal policies and procedures
- Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.

- Work hard to do my best in class and ask for help when I do not understand something
- Complete and return homework assignments
- Attend school regularly
- Bring appropriate supplies to school

- Keep parents informed of school activities by bringing home bulletins, announcements, etc.
