

BALLARD COUNTY SCHOOLS COVID Guidance 2022-2023

Ballard County Schools has a priority of having our students and staff at school safely. Below are the mitigating strategies we have in place to achieve this goal.	
Safety Practices BEFORE students or staff arrive for the day	 Do a daily self-check - If a student or staff member has any of the following, please do not come to school and determine if you should see a health care provider. Fever Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing New loss of taste or smell Headache or congestion If you suspect you or your child have COVID-19, please contact your healthcare provider regarding the need for COVID testing before returning to work. Be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.
Transportation	Buses will be sanitized after each route and at the end of the day.
Masks	Masks are optional and all school-affiliated sites will be Mask Friendly - meaning your decision to mask or not will be respected. We will continue to monitor throughout the school year.
COVID Positive	A student or staff member who tests positive should isolate at home for 5 days after onset of symptoms. He/she may return to school/work location if fever-free and s symptoms have improved on day 6, and wear a mask on days 6-10.
Direct Contact	 The recommendation is to monitor yourself for any symptoms, follow CDC guidelines, and contact your healthcare provider for guidance as needed. If testing, the recommendation is to do so on Day 5 after exposure.
Cafeteria/Food	 Breakfast and lunch are available free of charge at all schools for enrolled Ballard County students. Tables are to be sanitized after each group leaves.
Assemblies	Indoor assemblies are acceptable at this time.
Choir/Band	Return to activities using general precautions. (Sanitize hands, do not share instruments, etc.)
Classroom Expectations	 Sanitize desks at the end of each day. Special needs accommodations: gloves should be worn when changing briefs and feeding students.
Water Fountains	 Each school has a water fill station to utilize. Students are encouraged to bring clear, plastic, water bottles to fill. Water fountains are available and will be cleaned/sanitized throughout the day.
Field Trips	Field trips are acceptable at this time.

Cleaning, Sanitation, and Ventilation	 High-touch areas and frequently used spaces, including restrooms, will be closely monitored and cleaned more frequently by custodial staff. Frequent hand washing and hand sanitation will be taught and encouraged. HVAC units will operate for longer time periods to improve ventilation and filtration. HVAC filters will be monitored more frequently. All buildings will be disinfected/misted on a regular basis.
Health Rooms	Students with routine health needs should be separated/distanced from individuals presenting with fever, etc.
Restrooms	 Restrooms will have scheduled cleaning and disinfecting. Students should be reminded to wash their hands (20 seconds or more) after using the restroom.
Handwashing/ Respiratory Etiquette	 Students should be reminded to wash their hands (20 seconds or more) or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer after using the restroom, before eating, before and after outdoor play. Students will be reminded to cough/sneeze into their elbow to reduce the spread of respiratory droplets. Face masks will be available at each school for any student or staff member who requests one.
Sports	We will adhere to KHSAA guidance.
Student Attendance	The Kentucky Department of Education is returning to pre-pandemic attendance policies regarding student attendance. There is no longer a state approved excused absence for students relating to COVID-19. As with any other illness, COVID-19 related absences will require a medical or parent note. GOOD ATTENDANCE IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT.
Employee Sick Leave	COVID-19 related absences will be treated as any other illness requiring the use of accumulated paid sick leave. See 702 KAR 1:191 – effective on May 3, 2022 – which provides for additional paid leave for school district employees who have either exhausted or are ineligible to use accumulated sick leave.
COVID 19 Tests	 At-home tests can be ordered for FREE at https://special.usps.com/testkits. At-home tests are also available at your school's front office while supplies last. Ballard County Schools will not be participating in the optional "Test to Stay" program for staff or students at this time.
Masks/Hand Sanitizer	 Masks will be available upon request. Hand sanitizer available in classrooms, bathrooms, and hallways.
