# Dauphin Island Elementary School

#### School Responsibilities

Dauphin Island Elementary School will:

  - Empower students through an engaging curriculum.
  - Utilize scientifically research-based programs and instructional strategies.
  - Provide intensive intervention for identified students in reading and math.
  - Maintain a highly qualified faculty and support staff.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
  - Parent-Teacher conferences will be scheduled at times convenient for the parent and teacher. Conferences will begin in October and be completed by mid-December.
- 3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
  - Progress reports for all students will be sent home at least every four weeks.
  - Report cards will be sent home at the conclusion of each quarter.
  - Student progress can be monitored by parents online.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
  - Staff will be available throughout the school year, by appointment to meet with parents before or after school or during planning time.
  - Parents may communicate electronically with teachers and administrators.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
  - Parents are given opportunities to participate as volunteers through chaperoning field trips, outdoor classes, or to assist with school functions.
  - Statewide Parenting Day will be held in the month of October.
- Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.
  - The staff will communicate with parents throughout the school year and will use various ways of communication.
  - Communications can be offered in parent requested languages.

### Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- · Take responsibility for my child's punctuality and school attendance.
- Making sure that my child is completing all homework assigned daily and reading at home with my child.
- Actively encourage and stay involved in what my child is learning by checking such thinks as newsletters, assignments folders and websites.
- Participate in decisions relating to my child's education.
- Provide the support necessary to ensure my child stays in school and graduates high school.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the teacher, school and school district by promptly reading all
  notices sent from the school or school district.

- · Follow school discipline and uniform policies.
- Complete and return homework assignments on time while doing my best.
