 - ❖ SSC Bylaws/Responsibilities
 Bylaws were distributed and reviewed and distributed. Key points were highlighted. S. Herrera explained that Roberts Rules of Order are followed. Minutes will be posted on the school website. A. Mandujano will send out SSC minutes to the group. Expenditures are determined from input from Department Chairs.
 - ❖ Election of Officers:

 - Vice-Chairperson: Motion/JV, 2nd/AC motion passed to elect Kendall Courtright.
 - Secretary: Motion/SH 2nd/LB motion passed to elect Araceli Mandujano.
 - Single Plan for Student Achievement:
 - LCAP Goals
 Decisions made by the principal will always be in line with the Superintendent and the Board of Trustees. Fund currently has been assisting during COVID and is over 21 million dollars. Local Control and Accountability Summary was provided and explained goals and district vision.
 - PVHS and WASC Goals
 SH shared superintendent vision, mission, and overarching goals, along with conditions of learning, and engagement. Goals apply to all students. PV goals shared.
 - Data Review
 - RenLearn Scores
 - ELA Ren Scores: 9th grade 47% urgent intervention; 10th grade 45% urgent intervention.
 - Math Ren Scores: 9th grade 63% need urgent intervention; math is a difficult subject. 10th grade 55% need urgent intervention.
 - Teacher performance: teachers do really well assisting students with urgent intervention math needs and support classes.
 - A-G Data
 - A-G rates for SM and RHS for class of 2021 are 39%. PV was at 49%.
 - Official graduation rates for 2020 are on hold, but PV unofficially had 96%.
 - Summer School Data
 - PVHS completed 1176 classes in summer school.

- 508 student attended Summer School. This totaled 59% of district ss attendees.
- RI asked about AHC classes, however there are no AHC classes added into this data. AHC does not do summer courses for College Now program.
- EL Data
 - If students receive a 4 or above, they no longer need to receive support classes.
 - Total number of EL students: 455 for PVHS.
 - RFEP reclassified as proficient. PV was at 19 % and was 2nd best in county.
 - Pioneer this year reclassified 88 students.
 - G. Baldwin assists with reclassifications as the Special Education Coordinator.
 - Students not passing exams can be due to disability. During their IEP meeting, they ask a series of questions. This year Sped reclassified 12 students.
 - English teachers proctor the Exam.
 - JE asked how many students at Lompoc took exam. SH will see if she can get that data.
- Budget (20/21) and (21/22)
 - Shared School Site Council Budget, budgets are approved a year in advance
 - Carry over from last year is \$17,000. SSC voted to give teachers the opportunity to submit a request for specialized technology grant. An example: Special tools for the Tatung or camera
 - SSC agreed the grant cannot exceed \$2,500, and applications will be reviewed at next meeting. LB made the motion to moved that they make individual grants available until all the money is used. 2nd/RI, all approved. Motion passed.

❖ Student Report:

Kendall Courtright received positive feedback regarding the Homecoming Dance. A few altercations after the Homecoming Rally. Too many students at one rally. Jazmine Villanueva: ASB has an RSVP Summit. They have their members talk to students on campus. ASB asks PV students for their opinions regarding school dances. The first part of the summit was done two weeks ago. The second will be in the PV ASB room. ASB members will invite PV students to the ASB room and will ask additional questions and will request feedback.

❖ ELAC Report:

Officers have been selected. They have requested to have some parent trainings in areas of technology, college information, and 4-year sequence of classes. Parents want to be able to navigate more easily through Aeries, Canvas, and the Website.

Transition has been positive, working on students getting back into the school routine. Free food for all students. We continue to have a shortage of bus drivers. The school is providing free city bus cards. PV is giving out over 600 SMAT bus cards to students monthly.
