Dear Parents and Guardians,

School will begin on August 9, 2021. We have taken many steps to make the return to school safe for students and staff. Some of these measures include: touchless soap, hand sanitizer, and paper towel dispensers, continued mask mandate, students sitting six feet apart (social distancing), and an air purifier that attaches to and kills viruses and other bacteria. Classrooms now have warm water for washing hands. Plexiglass dividers will be provided for the students and the teacher.
