## **IMPORTANT PARKING INFO**

Please note that parking in any designated Loading or Fire Zone is prohibited by law 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Loading Zones are marked with yellow curbs and Fire Zones are marked with red curbs throughout campus. Parking in those zones is subject to a \$360 fine in Seaside and citations may be issued by local authorities. Additionally, parking in undesignated areas on campus (medians, sidewalks, grass, etc.) is also prohibited and cars will be subject to tow and citations.

Overflow parking for events is available on the west side of the building in the lower lot, along the entire south side of the road leading up to the building, and at Pacific Ridge Elementary.

## **KEY CLUB SERVES THE COMMUNITY**

Seaside High School's chapter of Key Club has been extremely busy this year with a variety of service projects. Before the holiday break, Key Club hosted a movie night and toy drive, volunteered at the Festival of Trees by running the "Reindeer Games", and with the help of SMS's Builder's Club, wrote and delivered more than 150 Christmas cards to area nursing homes.

Key Club has also taken on the responsibility of the CommuniCare program. Sponsored by the Harold & Arlene Schnitzer CARE Foundation, Key Club, along with the help of the Builder's Club, will raise money to award to local nonprofit organizations. Senior Grace Meyer is spearheading the project as her Pacifica. Key Club will be looking to award money to groups that "provide our community with mental health and homelessness support, along with the growing need for environmental help". During the months of January and February, Meyer along with a group of Key Club members will interview groups that have applied for the grant monies.

Other big events coming up for Key Club are the annual winter formal Snoball and the Make-a-Wish Foundation "Wish Week". With the theme of "Winter Wonderland", Snoball will be held Friday, Jan. 27, beginning at 7:30pm in the SHS Auxiliary gym. Tickets are \$15 per person and \$25 for a couple if bought in advance. At the door, tickets will be \$20 each. Along with dance, Key Club will be helping with Makenzie Philbrick's Pacifica Project "Wish Week". This is the second year that Philbrick is raising funds for the Make-a-Wish Foundation. Last year, Philbrick raised enough money to sponsor one wish for a Northwest child. She is hoping to do the same this year.



#### Dear Parents and Students,

Arrow Dental has partnered with Providence Seaside Hospital to promote and carry out a statewide, school based dental screening program certified by the Oregon Health Authority. Services are **FREE** for participating schools and students.

Are screenings safe and effective? School-based dental screening programs are an evidence-based practice and recommended by: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC); and Healthy People 2020. Almost all decay occurs in the molars. School-based dental screening programs can reduce tooth decay by half.

What services provided? The dental team screens participating students and applies Fluoride treatments as requested at the high school level. ALL SERVICES are provided by a registered dental hygienist. A report from the dental hygienist will be sent home with each student.

What does a fluoride treatment do? Fluoride treatments can strengthen enamel and protect teeth against damage from plaque. Along with possibly making dietary changes, using these fluoride treatments can help the teeth repair any minor damage from tooth decay

Students who are 15 years of age or older may sign the permission slips themselves. **Medical** and dental services (ORS 109.640): Minors who are 15 years or older can consent to medical and dental services without parental consent. This includes hospital care, as well as medical, dental, optometric and surgical diagnostic care. Any student younger than 15 years old who would like to participate in the program will need to have their parent sign the permission form.
